AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW AND INCLUDING THE GUAM PROCUREMENT LAW TO DIRECTLY NEOTIATE AN OFFICE LEASE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OPERATIONS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Legislative Findings and Intent: I Liheslaturan Section 1. Guåhan finds that the Office of the Attorney General pursuant to a court 3 order will be evicted from the Judicial Center effective February 28, 2005. 4 The Office of the Attorney General is an integral part of the criminal justice 5 system and unless the Attorney General is authorized to directly procure 6 office space so that it can continue to operate, there will be a crisis in the 7 criminal justice system. 8 9

Section 2. Authorization to Lease. Notwithstanding other 10 provision of law, including the Guam Procurement Law, the Attorney General is hereby authorized to directly negotiate an office space lease for 11 his entire Office's immediate usage. The lease shall secure sufficient space 12 for all the Office of the Attorney General's operations in order to bring all 13 14 Divisions into one premises. The lease may include an option for the 15 government of Guam to purchase the premises through a lease to purchase option subject to legislative approval. 16

Section 3. Appropriation. The amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is hereby de-appropriated from the Unified Judiciary's Fiscal Year 2005 Budget and is hereby appropriated to the office of the Attorney General for all relocation, upgrading, rental and related expenses associated with effectuating the purpose of Section 1 of this Act. The Attorney General is hereby authorized to use and transfer monies within his current FY2005 budget to pay for the purposes authorized by this Act.

Section 4. The Office of the Attorney General is hereby authorized to remain in approximately seven thousand (7000) square feet in the second floor of the Guam Judicial Center on the side of the building facing West O'Brien Drive for its prosecution functions. The Office shall also maintain eleven (11) of its parking stalls and a stall on the side of the building, with side door security access for the Attorney General. No past, current or future rental amounts shall be due by the Office of the Attorney General to the Judiciary Council of Guam, the Judicial Council, or any other entity of the Judicial Branch for the Office of the Attorney General's office or parking rental.

In the event that any amounts due by the Office of the Attorney General by General may be enforceable against the Office of the Attorney General by the Judicial Council for past rent, and rent for this fiscal year, then the budget allocation for this year's fiscal year to the Judicial Branch shall be reduced by said amount and paid to the Judicial Council on the Office of the Attorney General's account. The Judicial Council shall not be authorized to evict the Office of the Attorney General. This Section shall be retroactive to any current eviction proceedings against the Office of the Attorney General.
