AN ACT TO EXTEND THE EMERGENCY DECLARATION ISSUED BY I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN AS CONTAINED IN EXECUTIVE ORDER 2005-04 RELATIVE TO THE RENTAL OF OFFICE SPACE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions in Chapter 5,
- 3 Division 1 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, the Guam
- 4 Procurement Law, the Office of the Attorney General is hereby
- 5 authorized to expend monies transferred pursuant to Executive
- 6 Order 2005-04, on an emergency procurement basis, issued by I
- 7 Maga'Lahen Guåhan, for lease of office space and related expenses
- 8 until September 30, 2005, and may negotiate and enter into an
- 9 extension of its current lease agreement for its current office space.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 99 (EC), "AN ACT TO EXTEND THE EMERGENCY DECLARATION ISSUED BY *I MAGA'LAHEN GUÅHAN* AS CONTAINED IN EXECUTIVE ORDER 2005-04, RELATIVE TO THE RENTAL OF OFFICE SPACE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, TO RESOLVE ISSUES REGARDING THE EXISTING MONTH TO MONTH TENANCY AND TO REQUIRE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO ENTER INTO A LEASE FOR OFFICE SPACE PURSUANT TO THE GUAM PROCUREMENT LAW," which I have vetoed.

I applaud *I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* most especially Senator Ray Tenorio in their efforts to assist the Office of the Attorney General of Guam. Bill No. 99 extends the period to spend funds transferred pursuant to an emergency declaration for emergency procurement related to the rental of office space. It also permits the Attorney General to occupy Pedro's Plaza for another sixty (60) days while he issues an invitation to bid for office space.

Although I agree with *I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*'s intent to help the Attorney General, there are alarming provisions in Bill 99 that have compelled me to veto the measure.

Section 6 of Bill 99 directs *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* to accept a past transaction as a gift. First, the authority given to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* to accept gifts is solely discretionary. *I Mina' Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* should not and is without authority to compel *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* to perform a purely gubernatorial function. Doing so is an egregious affront to the constitutional doctrine of separation of powers.

What is also alarming is that this legislation purports to correct an allegedly illegal transaction. I steadfastly oppose remedial legislation of this sort.

I am also concerned with Section 5 which allows the Office of the Attorney General to immediately issue an Invitation to Bid pursuant to the Guam Procurement Law for the procurement of office space without an appropriation. In order to issue an invitation to bid, funds must be identified for such purpose. Although the Attorney General's office has lapsed funds, it is purportedly earmarked for the future hire of attorneys. Bill 99 may not adequately afford the Attorney General the necessary tools to efficiently and continuously operate.

Let us also be mindful of other government agencies that are being displaced. These include Department of Revenue and Taxation, Department of Corrections, DISID, and the Guam Museum. Their mandates are vital to government operations. Without office space, these essential services provided to our people would be impeded.

Rather than passing legislation that services one of our agencies let us enact law that encompasses everyone similarly situated. It is my understanding that Pedro's Plaza has sufficient space to house the Office of the Attorney General and other agencies.

Although I vetoed Bill 99 as is, there would be nothing to preclude the enactment of a future bill that addresses all the concerns described above. I humbly implore *I Mina'* Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan to take this opportunity to assist our displaced government of Guam agencies and departments.

AN ACT TO EXTEND THE EMERGENCY DECLARATION ISSUED BY I MAGA'LAHEN GUAHAN AS CONTAINED IN EXECUTIVE ORDER 2005-04, RELATIVE TO THE RENTAL OF OFFICE SPACE FOR THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, TO RESOLVE ISSUES REGARDING THE EXISTING MONTH TO MONTH TENANCY AND TO REQUIRE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO ENTER INTO A LEASE FOR OFFICE SPACE PURSUANT TO THE GUAM PROCUREMENT LAW.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 **Section 1**. Except for §§5030, 5249, 5250, 5251 and Article 11,
- 3 notwithstanding the provisions in Chapter 5, Division 1 of Title 5 of the Guam
- 4 Code Annotated, the Guam Procurement Law, the Attorney General is hereby

- authorized to expend monies transferred pursuant to Executive Order 2005-
- 2 04, on an emergency procurement basis, issued by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, for
- 3 lease of office space until sixty (60) days after enactment hereof.
- 4 Section 2. No lease shall be entered into unless the lessor delivers to
- 5 the Attorney General his declaration made pursuant to 6 GCA §4306 that the
- 6 rent reserved in the lease is the fair market value for the leasehold. The
- 7 declaration shall also contain a statement that the rent reserved in the lease
- 8 does not recover the value of any provision of any tenancy that might be
- 9 construed as a favor to the government of Guam, as that term is defined in 5
- 10 GCA §5630(d), nor for the value of any tenancy provided to the government
- prior to the execution of the lease authorized in §1.
- 12 Section 3. The Public Auditor shall examine all aspects of the
- 13 transactions authorized by §1 and make a determination as to compliance
- 14 with §2. If the Public Auditor finds that §2 was complied with, 5 GCA
- 15 §5630(d) is inapplicable to a tenancy that might otherwise be determined to be
- 16 within the ambit of 5 GCA §5630(d).
- 17 **Section 4.** The Public Auditor shall forthwith publish the
- 18 determination required by §3, her findings and the record required by 5 GCA
- 19 §5249 and the Attorney General's certification of that record pursuant to 5
- 20 GCA §5250.
- 21 **Section 5.** The Attorney General may continue to occupy his present
- 22 location at Pedro's Plaza for up to and no more than sixty (60) days after the
- 23 enactment hereof. The Attorney General shall immediately issue an Invitation
- 24 to Bid pursuant to Title 5 GCA §5211 and the Guam Procurement Law for
- office space for the Department of Law.

Section 6. *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* shall be deemed to have accepted the value of the one month tenancy extended by the landlord of 247 West O'Brien Drive; *Hagåtña*, or Lot No. 2, Block 26, City of *Hagåtña*, to the Department of Law after his office's recent eviction from the Guam Judicial Center, as a charitable donation of intangible personal property pursuant to Title 5 GCA §22408.
