AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §8104 TO CHAPTER 8, DIVISION 4, TITLE 2 GUAM ADMINISTRATIVE RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER ALL **SURPLUS** AND **EXCESS** OF COMPUTERS FROM ALL BRANCHES **OF** GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM GENERAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATION FOR FURTHER TRANSFER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND THE **GUAM PUBLIC** LIBRARY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent and Finding. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that every year personal computers, often referred to as desktop

computers, are replaced because they were obsolete. The obsolescence

does not mean that they are no longer functional and cannot be used but

rather that newer models are faster and perform more advanced functions

than the computers they are replacing. Computers declared obsolete can

still be used as instructional tools and will greatly enhance the learning of our students.

Section 2. A new §8104 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Division 4,
 Title 2 Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations to read as follows:

"§8104. Transfer of surplus/excess computers and monitors. Effective upon the enactment of this act, all agencies of the Government of Guam, inclusive of all branches, shall transfer all surplus/excess computers and peripheral devices, including central processing units, mouse, monitors and keyboards to the Government of Guam General Service Administration. Each computer and monitor shall be accompanied with a certification by the head of each agency as to the condition of each of the computers and/or peripheral devices. If a computer is certified as not operational, a statement describing the problems with the computer shall be part of the certification.

(1). The General Service Administration shall, upon receipt of the equipment, separate and store the equipment into the following two categories; category 1 shall include the equipment having been certified as working and operational and category 2 shall include the equipment certified as non-working. Upon completion of the sorting and inventory, the General Service Administration shall notify the Department of Education and the Guam Public Library of the availability of the equipment. The Department of Education and the

Guam Public Library System shall have the right of first refusal on all computer equipment transferred to the General Service Administration.

- (2). The computer equipment transferred, under this Act, to the Department of Education shall only be used in the classroom as a teaching aid or in computer laboratories for the direct benefit of the students and the computer equipment transferred to the Guam Public Library shall only be used for the benefit of the users of the library and not for administrative use.
- (3). The General Service Administration shall submit a semiannual report to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guahån* the number of computer equipment transferred to the General Service Administration and the number transferred to the Department of Education and the Guam Public Library during the reporting period.
