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AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §8104 TO CHAPTER 8,
DIVISION 4, TITLE 2 GUAM ADMINISTRATIVE
RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE
TRANSFER OF ALL SURPLUS AND EXCESS
COMPUTERS FROM ALL BRANCHES OF THE
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM TO THE GOVERNMENT
OF GUAM GENERAL SERVICE ADMINISTRATION
FOR FURTHER TRANSFER TO THE DEPARTMENT
OF EDUCATION AND THE GUAM PUBLIC
LIBRARY.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Intent and Finding.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*
3 finds that every year personal computers, often referred to as desktop
4 computers, are replaced because they were obsolete. The obsolescence
5 does not mean that they are no longer functional and cannot be used but
6 rather that newer models are faster and perform more advanced functions
7 than the computers they are replacing. Computers declared obsolete can

1 still be used as instructional tools and will greatly enhance the learning of
2 our students.

3 **Section 2.** A new §8104 is hereby added to Chapter 8, Division 4,
4 Title 2 Guam Administrative Rules and Regulations to read as follows:

5 **“§8104. Transfer of surplus/excess computers and monitors.**

6 Effective upon the enactment of this act, all agencies of the
7 Government of Guam, inclusive of all branches, shall transfer all
8 surplus/excess computers and peripheral devices, including central
9 processing units, mouse, monitors and keyboards to the Government
10 of Guam General Service Administration. Each computer and
11 monitor shall be accompanied with a certification by the head of each
12 agency as to the condition of each of the computers and/or peripheral
13 devices. If a computer is certified as not operational, a statement
14 describing the problems with the computer shall be part of the
15 certification.

16 (1). The General Service Administration shall, upon receipt of
17 the equipment, separate and store the equipment into the following
18 two categories; category 1 shall include the equipment having been
19 certified as working and operational and category 2 shall include the
20 equipment certified as non-working. Upon completion of the sorting
21 and inventory, the General Service Administration shall notify the
22 Department of Education and the Guam Public Library of the
23 availability of the equipment. The Department of Education and the

1 Guam Public Library System shall have the right of first refusal on all
2 computer equipment transferred to the General Service
3 Administration.

4 (2). The computer equipment transferred, under this Act, to
5 the Department of Education shall only be used in the classroom as a
6 teaching aid or in computer laboratories for the direct benefit of the
7 students and the computer equipment transferred to the Guam
8 Public Library shall only be used for the benefit of the users of the
9 library and not for administrative use.

10 (3). The General Service Administration shall submit a semi-
11 annual report to *I Maga'lahaen Guåhan* and to the Speaker of *I*
12 *Lihselaturan Guahån* the number of computer equipment transferred
13 to the General Service Administration and the number transferred to
14 the Department of Education and the Guam Public Library during
15 the reporting period.
