- 4 for the Guam Environmental Protection Agency ("GEPA"), that were adopted
- 5 by the Board of Directors for GEPA on June 17, 2005, are hereby approved,
- 6 with further changes made by I Liheslaturan Guåhan. These rules and
- 7 regulations are attached, labeled as Exhibit A, and incorporated herein.
- 8 Changes to these rules and regulations are being made in accordance
- 9 with Article 5 to Chapter 51 of Division 2 of Part 2 of Title 10 of the Guam
- 10 Code Annotated and the Administrative Adjudication Law.

6	Section 23501.2	Definitions.
7		
8	For the pur	poses of this Article, except as otherwise provided, the following words
9	and phrases, toget	her with all of the common derivations thereof, shall have the meaning
10	ascribed to them as	s follows:
11		
12	(a)	"Administrator" shall mean the Administrator of the Guam
13		Environmental Protection Agency (GEPA), or his or her designee.
14		
15	(b)	"Advance disposal fee" shall mean the "recycling fee" charged at the
16		time of import or point of sale, where applicable, of a "recyclable
17		material" that will eventually end up as solid waste.
18		
19	(c)	"Appliances" shall mean the household or commercial device
20		operated by gas or electric current.
21		
22	(d)	"Consumer" shall mean any person who buys a recyclable material
23		for final use.
24		
25	(e)	"Dealer" shall mean any person engaged in the business of buying,
26		selling or exchanging vehicles of a type required to be registered by

1		the Department of Revenue and Taxation, in accordance to 16 GCA
2		Chapter 7.
3		
4	(f)	"Distributors" shall mean any person engaged in the sale of recyclable
5		materials to a retailer.
6		
7	(g)	"Electronic Waste" shall mean computers, circuit boards, televisions,
8		and portable telephones.
9 .		
10	(h)	"Enameled White Goods" or "White Goods" shall mean appliances,
11		with or without enamel, for home or commercial use including, but
12		not limited to, refrigerators, water heaters, air conditioners, washers,
13		dryers, and stoves.
14		
15	(i)	"GEPA" shall mean the Guam Environmental Protection Agency.
16		
17	(j)	"GEPA Recycling Refund Voucher" shall mean GEPA established
18		document provided to certified recycling centers, issued to persons
19		who returns recyclable material to certified recycling centers, for
20		which is proof for refund payments to such persons.
21		
22	(k)	"Gross Vehicle Weight" or "Gross Vehicle Weight Rating" shall mean
23		the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight of a
24		single vehicle.
25		
26	(1)	"Heavy Equipment" shall mean any equipment, motor vehicle or
27		motor carrier, or non-road motor vehicle with a gross weight or gross
28		vehicle weight of five (5) tons or more.

1	(m)	"Home Appliance" shall mean any small home appliance not listed as
2		an Enameled White Good.
3		
4	(n)	"Import" shall mean to bring, or accept delivery of recyclable
5		materials from any source outside of Guam.
6		
7	(o)	"Importer" shall mean any person who buys, brings, or accepts
8		delivery of recyclable materials from outside the port of Guam for sale
9		or resale to distributors, retailers, wholesalers, or consumers.
10		
11	(p)	"Motor Vehicle" or "motorized vehicle" shall mean automobiles,
12		automobile truck, automobile wagon, buses, trucks, motorcycles or
13		other self propelled wheeled conveyance that will be primarily for use
14		on Guam's public streets, roads, and highways that are required to be
15		registered with the Motor Vehicles Division, Department of Revenue
16		and Taxation, Government of Guam.
17		
18	(q)	"Municipal Solid Waste" is a subset of solid waste and is defined as
19		durable goods (e.g., appliance, batteries, tires), nondurable goods
20		(e.g., newspapers, books, magazines), containers and packaging, food
21		wastes, yard trimmings, and miscellaneous organic wastes from
22		residential, commercial and industrial non-process sources.
23		
24	(r)	"Imported Vehicle" or "Imported Motor Vehicle" shall mean a motor
25		vehicle that has no prior record of having been registered in Guam.
26		
27	(s)	"Person" shall mean any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm,
28		company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate,

1		or an	y agency, department, or instrumentality of the Federal or local
2		gove	rnment, or any other legal representatives, agents or assigns.
3			
4	(t)	"Rec	overed Resources" shall mean material or solid waste that has
5		been	diverted from disposal for the purpose of recycling or
6		bioco	onversion. This term does not include those materials that are
7		gene	rated and normally reused on-site for manufacturing purposes.
8			
9	(u)	"Red	cycle" or "Recycling" means the method by which recovered
10		resou	arces are converted for use as raw materials or feedstock to make
11		new	products.
12			
13	(v)	"Red	cyclable Materials" means materials that still have useful physical
14		or ch	nemical properties after serving a specific purpose for the same or
15		othe	r purpose. Recyclable materials include the following:
16			
17		(1)	Batteries (i.e., lead-acid, portable computer batteries, nickel-
18			cadmium, sealed types for power backup);
19		(2)	Automobiles, buses, and trucks or any form of motorized
20			vehicle;
21		(3)	Tires (passenger/commercial);

23		(5)	Home appliances (other small appliances that are not
24			considered enameled white goods);
25		(6)	Glass and plastic bottles;
26		(7)	Foam padding;

11		calculated by dividing the number of recyclable material per type
12		redeemed by the number of recyclable material per type sold, and then

15	(bb)	"Refund value" shall mean the amount refunded to any persons upon
16		return of a recyclable material for which a recycling fee has been
17		imposed. Refund value for each recyclable material is established in
18		Section 23507.1.

20 .	(cc)	"Remanufactured" shall mean to manufacture a used recyclable
21		material into a new or recycled material of the same after initial use of
22		such recyclable material.

24	(dd)	"Responsible Official" shall mean

27		function, or any other person who performs similar policy or
