AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (e), OF §15906, ARTICLE 9, CHAPTER 15, TITLE 17 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REINSTATING THE ONE-STEP MERIT PAY INCREASE FOR GRADUATES OF THE PEDRO 'DOC' SANCHEZ SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds

2 that the economic condition of Guam is continuing to improve. The economic

3 trend has enabled the government to restore the education incentives benefit,

which was discontinued as part of the austerity measures implemented since

5 1998.

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This incentive benefit is the one-step merit pay increase for government

7 of Guam employees who graduate under the Pedro 'Doc' Sanchez Scholarship

8 Program. Graduates of the program receive a degree in Public or Business

Administration, indicating the participant employee possesses the knowledge

and skills to be effective and responsible public servant, thus deserving of a

one-step merit pay increase. The goal of the program was to establish a workforce of public administrators who eventually remain employed with the government of Guam. The net effect would be a skilled and educated

4 workforce providing efficient government services to the people.

Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to repeal the austerity measure imposed on the Pedro "Doc" Sanchez Scholarship program and restore the one-step merit pay increase by amending subsection (e), of §15906, Article 9, chapter 15, Title 17 Guam Code Annotated.

Section 2. Subsection (e) of §15906, Article 9, Chapter 15, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read:

"(e) Upon the effective date of this act, the grantee will no longer be eligible for a mandatory pay merit increase upon graduation. The grantees entered into the program, prior to the enactment of this act, and as evidenced with the awarding of an undergraduate or graduate degree in Public Administration or Business Administration by the University of Guam, shall be entitled to will receive a one-step merit pay raise from the department, agency, office, autonomous or semi-autonomous instrumentality of the government of Guam or the Judiciary in which he or she is employed effective FY2006 on the pay period immediately following official certification by the University of Guam that the grantee has completed all degree requirements.

Employees who graduated with a degree between the enactment of Public Law 23-111 and the enactment of this Section who would otherwise have received the one-step merit pay raise, shall be entitled to the same

- 2 enactment of this Section and the merit pay increase shall not be retroactive."
