AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 12802, ARTICLE 8, CHAPTER 12, PART 1, DIVISION 1, TITLE 10 OF THE **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED, **AMEND** SECTION 12101, ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 12, PART 1, DIVISION 1, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, **AMEND** AND **ARTICLE** CHAPTER 12, PART 1, DIVISION 1, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE AUDIOLOGY PROFESSION OF THE GUAM ALLIED HEALTH **PRACTICE** ACT.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Statement. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the
- 3 current statute of the licensure of Audiologists needs to be updated to meet
- 4 national standards of the profession, as well as acted upon as a companion bill
- 5 to Article 8, Chapter 12, Division 1, Part 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code
- 6 Annotated, relative to the Allied Health Practice Act.
- Section 2. Subsection 12802(ii), Section 12802, Article 8, Chapter 12, Part 1,
- 8 Division 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as
- 9 follows:
- 10 "§ **12802**. Definitions.

(a) <u>Licensed Allied Health</u> Professions. For purposes of this Act, the following Allied Health professions shall be licensed under the *Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners*:

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- 4 (ii) 'Audiology' shall mean the application of principles, methods and
  5 procedures for measurement, testing, evaluation, prediction,
  6 counseling, selling, instruction, habilitation or rehabilitation
  7 related to hearing aids or ear molds, including the fitting of such
  8 devices, or disorders of hearing for the purpose of evaluation,
  9 identifying preventing, rehabilitating, ameliorating or modifying
  10 such disorders and conditions in individuals.
- 11 (2) 'Audiology' shall mean the measuring, testing, examining, interpreting, diagnosing, predicting, prescribing, treating and 12 13 evaluation, including audiologic and electrophysiological 14 measures relating to hearing and vestibular systems for the 15 purpose of preventing and modifying disorders related to loss of 16 hearing and vestibular function, conducting programs of habilitation and rehabilitating including hearing conservation, 17 18 ceriman removal, vestibular rehabilitation, non-medical 19 evaluation and treatment of tinnitus and the evaluation, 20 prescription and fitting of hearing aids."
  - **Section 3.** Subsections 12101(q) and 12101(r), Section 12101, Article 1, Chapter 12, Part 1, Division 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* and all following subsections are *renumbered* accordingly to read as follows:

1	"§ 12101. Definitions. For the purpose of this Chapter the following
2	words and phrases shall have the meanings assigned to them, respectively,
3	except where the context otherwise requires:
4	(q) Practice of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology means the
5	rendering or offering to render to individuals, groups, organizations or the
6	public any service in speech, or language pathology involving the non-
7	medical application of principles, methods and procedures for the
8	measurement, testing, diagnosis, prediction, counseling and instruction
9	related to the development and disorders of speech, voice or language for the
10	purpose of non-medical diagnosing, preventing, treating and ameliorating
11	such disorders and conditions in individuals and groups of individuals.: and
12	(r) Practice of Audiology means the application of principles, methods
13	and procedures of measurement, testing, appraisal, prediction, aural
14	rehabilitation, aural habilitation, consultation, hearing-aid selection,
15	counseling, instruction and research related to hearing, and disorders of
16	hearing, for the purpose of non-medical diagnosis, prevention, identification,
17	amelioration or the modification of communicative disorders, involving
18	speech, language, auditory function or other aberrant behavior related to
19	hearing disorders."
20	Section 4. Subsection 121001(a), Article 10, Chapter 12, Part 1, Division
21	1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:

- § **121001. Definitions.** For purposes of this Article, the following words and phrases have been defined to mean:
- 5 (a) 'ASHA' means the American Speech, Language and Hearing
  6 Association who is the national credentialing association for Speech,
  7 Language Pathologists and Audiologists, which issues the "Certificate of
  8 Clinical Competence in Audiology" (CCC-A).
- 9 (b) 'Audiologist' means a person duly licensed by the Board to practice 10 in the field of Audiology.
  - (c) 'Audiology' means the application of principles, methods and procedures for measurement, testing, evaluation, prediction, counseling, selling, instruction, habilitation or rehabilitation related to hearing aids or ear molds, including the fitting of such devices, or disorders of hearing for the purpose of evaluation, identifying, preventing, rehabilitating, ameliorating or modifying such disorders and conditions in individuals: measuring, testing, examining, interpreting, diagnosing, predicting, prescribing, treating and evaluation, including audiologic and electrophysiological measures relating to hearing and vestibular systems for the purpose of preventing and modifying disorders related to loss of hearing and vestibular function, conducting programs of habilitation and rehabilitating including hearing conservation, cerumen removal, vestibular rehabilitation, non-medical evaluation and treatment of tinnitus and the evaluation, prescription and fitting of hearing aids.

- 1 (d) <u>'Certificate of Clinical Competence in Audiology (CCC-A)'</u> means the 2 <u>nationally recognized certification issued by ASHA as evidence of</u> 3 <u>professional knowledge and clinical experience in Audiology.</u>
- 4 (d) (e) 'Habilitation' and 'Rehabilitation,' as used in this Article, 5 include, but are not limited to, hearing aid evaluation, prescription and fitting 6 of hearing aid devices.

## 7 § 121002. Qualifications for Licensure.

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- 8 (a) Applicants for licensure must possess a "Certificate of Clinical 9 Competence in Audiology (CCC-A)" issued by ASHA as evidence of professional 10 training and experience.
- 11 (b) Applicants shall have an official statement from ASHA sent 12 directly to the board reporting applicant's present ASHA certification the 13 validity of CCC-A.
- § **121003**. **Exceptions to Licensure Requirements**. The provisions contained herein shall *not* be construed to prevent or restrict the following:
- 16 (a) any person licensed on Guam, under any other law, from 17 engaging in the profession or occupation for which the person is licensed;
  - (b) the activities and services of persons pursuing a course of study leading to a degree in audiology at an accredited college or university, *if* such activities and services constitute a part of an approved supervised course of study and such person is designated an audiologist intern or trainee;
- (c) the activities and services of persons presently working on their Clinical Fellowship Year ('CFY') and such persons are designated as 'CFY-Audiologist.'

- § **121004. Scope of Practice.** The practice of audiology includes:
- 2 (a) identifying, including screening, assessing, interpreting, 3 diagnosing, counseling, preventing, and rehabilitating peripheral and central 4 auditory system dysfunctions;
- 5 (b) providing and interpreting behavior and (electro) physiological 6 measurements of auditory and vestibular functions;
- 7 (c) tests for vestibular functions, including the 8 electronystagmography ('ENG') test battery consisting of the gaze, 9 optokinetic, positional, Hallpike and bithermal caloric test;

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- (d) selecting, fitting, dispensing, and selling of hearing aids, assistive listening and amplification devices, including alerting devices and other systems (e.g. implantable devices), taking earmold impressions, providing earmolds, and providing training in the use of hearing aids and amplification devices; selecting, fitting, dispensing and selling of hearing aids, assistive listening devices, and non-medical tinnitus treatment products including tinnitus maskers. The taking of earmold impressions, removal of cerumen, and providing earmolds, noise protectors, and training in the use of hearing aids, and tinnitus treatment devices;
- (e) providing aural rehabilitation and related counseling services to hearing impaired individuals and their families; providing aural and vestibular rehabilitation, and related counseling services;
- 22 (f) removal of cerumen only for the purpose of providing auditory, 23 vestibular functions measurements and for taking earmold impressions;

administering tests of central auditory function, evoked potential evaluation,
 and providing related interpretation and counseling services;

- (g) screening of speech-language and other factors affecting communication function for the purposes of audiologic evaluation or initial identification of individuals with other communication disorders;
  - (h) facilitating the conservation of auditory system function; and
- 7 (i) developing and implementing environmental and occupational 8 hearing conservation programs."
  - **Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
