AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 18119, DIVISION 1, CHAPTER 18, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS FOR ESTHETICIAN LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 **Section 1.** Legislative Intent. I Mina'Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan 3 Guåhan finds that there are inconsistencies in the existing mandate related 4 to the requirement and eligibility for esthetician's examination under the 5 Board of Cosmetology. One such inconsistency is the current requirement 6 pertaining to eligibility and qualifications for licensure of individuals that have practiced outside of Guam. Other concerns raised with the current 7 8 law are the additional requirements applied to those individuals who plan 9 to take the esthetician license exam which require that the individual must 10 hold a valid Guam license to practice cosmetology. This means that if an individual wishes to take an exam for an esthetician's license, that 11 12 individual must first have a cosmetology license. There are no other exams 13 within cosmetology that requires this. 14 Therefore, it is the intent of I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan

to make the necessary changes to the existing statutes that will allow

1	individuals who wish to apply for an esthetician license under the
2	Cosmetology Board consistent with their practice.
3	Section 2. Section 18119, Division 1, Chapter 18, Title 10, Guam
4	Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows.
5	§18119. Eligibility and Qualifications for Esthetician License.
6	(a) The Board shall administer examination for license as an
7	esthetician during a Board meeting duly held for the purpose of
8	administering examinations for applicants who have made the proper
9	applications for such license and who have qualified as follows:
10	(1) who is not less than 18 years of age;
11	(2) holds a valid Guam license to practice cosmetology;
12	(3)(2) has done one of the following:
13	(i) completed a certified esthetician program of at least six
14	hundred (600) hours extending over a school year of not
15	less than four (4) months from a school of cosmetology
16	approved by the Board; or
17	(ii) completed not less than the equivalent of six hundred
18	(600) hours of practice as a teacher assistant or teacher
19	aide in a school approved by the Board; and
20	(ii) holds a current unrestricted valid esthetician's license
21	issued by a state or territory of the United States in good
22	standing, whose license requirements in the judgment of
23	the Board are equal to or greater than Guam's.

1	(4) who has actively engaged in at least three (3) years in the
2	occupation of a cosmetologist, or any branch thereof, in the
3	territory or in any jurisdiction having standards for registration
4	substantially equivalent to those of Guam."
5	Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its
6	application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary
7	to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
8	this Law, which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or

application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
