AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 12101(o), ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AMEND SECTIONS 12802(a)(xi) AND 12827, ARTICLE 8, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AMEND SECTION 121901 AND TABLE OF CONTENTS OF ARTICLE 19, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, AMEND SECTIONS 121903(a) AND 121903(b), ARTICLE 19, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, ADD A NEW SECTION 121904, ARTICLE 19, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND THE FOLLOWING SUBSECTION 121904 IS RENUMBERED, AND ADD A NEW SECTION 121907, ARTICLE 19, CHAPTER 12, TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE LICENSURE OF THE VETERINARY MEDICINE PROFESSION.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Statement. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the
- 3 current statute of the licensure of Veterinarians needs to be updated to meet national
- 4 standards of the profession, as well as acted upon as a companion bill to Article 8,
- 5 Chapter 12, Division 1, Part 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, relative to the
- 6 Allied Health Practice Act.
- Section 2. Section 12101(o), Article 1, Chapter 12, Division 1, Part 1, Title 10
- 8 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
- 9 "(o) 'Practice of Veterinary' means:
- 10 (1) the diagnosis, treatment, correction, in any manner or by
- 11 any means change, relief or prevention of animal disease,
- 12 deformity, defect, injury or other physical or mental

condition, including the prescription or administration of any drug, medicine, biologic, apparatus, application, surgery, anesthetic or other therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, and the use of any procedure for artificial insemination, testing for pregnancy, diagnosing and treating sterility or infertility, or rendering advice with regard to any of these;

- (2) the representation, directly or indirectly, publicly or privately, of an ability and willingness to do any act mentioned in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection; or
- (3) the use of any title, words, abbreviation or letters in a manner, or under circumstances, which includes the belief that the person using them is qualified to do any act mentioned in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.
- (o) 'Practice of veterinary medicine' shall mean the practice of veterinary medicine, surgery, obstetrics and dentistry, which allow one to diagnose, medically and/or surgically treat all diseases and injuries of all animals, other than man. This includes prescribing or administering drugs, medicine, biologic, apparatus, application, anesthetic, or therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, or the use of any manual or mechanical procedure for artificial insemination, testing for pregnancy or for correcting sterility or infertility, or to render advice or recommendation with regard to any of the above."
- **Section 3.** Section 12802(a)(xi), Article 8, Chapter 12, Part 1, Division 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§ 12802. Definitions.

- (a) <u>Licensed Allied Health</u> Professions. For purposes of this Act, the following Allied Health professions shall be licensed under the *Guam Board of Allied Health Examiners*:
- 'Veterinary medicine' shall mean veterinary surgery, obstetrics, dentistry means to diagnose, treat, correct, change, relieve or prevent animal disease, deformity, defect, injury or other physical or mental condition, including the prescription or administration of any drug, medicine, biologic, apparatus, application, anesthetic, or therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, or the use of any manual or mechanical procedure for artificial insemination, testing for pregnancy or for correcting sterility or infertility, or to render advice or recommendation with regard to any of the above;
 - (11) 'Veterinary medicine' shall mean the practice of veterinary medicine, surgery, obstetrics and dentistry, which allow one to diagnose, medically and/or surgically treat all diseases and injuries of all animals, other than man. This includes prescribing or administering drugs, medicine, biologic, apparatus, application, anesthetic, or therapeutic or diagnostic substance or technique, or the use of any manual or mechanical procedure for artificial insemination, testing for pregnancy or for correcting sterility or infertility, or to render advice or recommendation with regard to any of the above;"

Section 4. Section 12827, Article 8, Chapter 12, Part 1, Division 1, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

3 "§ 12827.§ 12826. Prescriptive Authority for Allied Health Professionals. A physician assistant may administer, prescribe and dispense 4 5 any licensed drug and 'Schedule Drugs II - V' that fall within the scope of practice of his or her supervising physician. Physician assistants, podiatrists, 6 and veterinarians must maintain a current Federal Drug Enforcement 7 Administration certification and a current Guam Control Substance 8 9 Registration from Department of Public Health and Social Services.

A clinical psychologist and physician assistant may administer, order and prescribe and dispense any licensed drug as a delegated authority of the Collaborative Practice Agreement ('CPA'). To qualify for prescriptive authority, the Allied Health Professional clinical psychologist must have all of the following:

- 15 (1) a valid Federal Drug Enforcement Administration ('DEA') 16 certification;
- 17 (2) a current Guam Control Substance Registration from Department 18 of Public Health and Social Services;
- 19 (3) Collaborative Practice Agreement (CPA) approved by all of the 20 following three (3) boards: the Board of Allied Health Examiners 21 ('BAHE'), the Board of Pharmacy ('BOP'), and the Board of 22 Medical Examiners ('BOME');
- 23 (4) The CPA shall always have a physician available, preferably the 24 physician signing for the CPA but an alternate physician shall be 25 designated during his/her absence. (The Allied Health

Professional clinical psychologist must submit a scope of practice list of drugs, the CPA for approval by the BAHE, BOP and At the discretion of the board(s), the Allied Health Professional clinical psychologist and his collaborative physician may be requested to be present for evaluation of the applicant's prescriptive authority. The Allied Health Professional clinical psychologist shall *not* include any drug on the list that he or she is not competent to prescribe or drugs that are not routinely administered within his/her scope of practice. The Board of Pharmacy or Board of Medical Examiners has the authority to amend the list of drugs. The clinical psychologist's prescriptive authority of the Allied Health Professional shall be revoked for an invalid Guam or Federal DEA registration, and may be revoked for any violation of this Act and its rules and regulations as determined by the **Guam** Board of Allied Health Examiners. Prescriptive Authority shall be renewed at the time of licensure renewal.);

(5) proof of completion of a nationally and professionally accepted pharmaceutical curriculum in the area of clinical mental health medical psychology by the clinical psychologist. A minimum of 300 hundred hours of intensive didactic instruction shall consist of the following core areas of instruction: neurosciences, pharmacology, psychopharmacology, physiology, pathophysiology, appropriate and relevant physical and laboratory assessment, and clinical pharmacotherapeutics;

(c) 'Diagnosis' means the act or process of identifying or determining
 the health status of an animal through examination and the opinion derived
 from that examination.

- (d) 'Veterinary hospital' or 'veterinary clinic' means a facility for the veterinary care of animals, wherein all activities are directly supervised by a licensed veterinarian.
- 7 (d) 'Veterinarian' shall mean any person licensed to practice 8 veterinary medicine, surgery, and dentistry, and the various branches 9 thereof;
- 'Veterinary medicine' shall mean the practice of veterinary 10 (e) medicine, surgery, obstetrics and dentistry, which allow one to diagnose, 11 12 medically and/or surgically treat all diseases and injuries of all animals, 13 other than man. This includes prescribing or administering drugs, medicine, biologic, apparatus, application, anesthetic, or therapeutic or diagnostic 14 substance or technique, or the use of any manual or mechanical procedure for 15 16 artificial insemination, testing for pregnancy or for correcting sterility or 17 infertility, or to render advice or recommendation with regard to any of the above; and 18
- 19 <u>(f) 'Veterinary hospital or veterinary clinic'</u> shall mean a facility, either 20 permanent or temporary, for the diagnosis and/or treatment of animals, 21 either medically and/or surgically, wherein a licensed veterinarian directly 22 or indirectly supervises all activities."
- Section 6. Sections 121903(a) and 121903(b), Article 19, Chapter 12, Division 1, Part 2, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to

- 1 "§ **121903.** Exceptions to Licensure Requirements. These rules shall 2 *not* be construed to prohibit:
- (a) a person who is a regular student in a veterinary school from performing duties or actions assigned by his instructors, or from working under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian during a school vacation period;
- 7 (b) a person practicing veterinary medicine upon his own animals,
 8 being assisted in such practice by his employees when they are normally
 9 employed in the conduct of such person's business, or being assisted in such
 10 practice by some other person gratuitously; or
- 11 (a) a person who is a part-time or full-time student in a veterinary
 12 school who participates in diagnosis and treatment as part of their
 13 educational experience and under the direct supervision of a licensed
 14 veterinarian in good standing;
- 15 (b) a person practicing veterinary medicine as a bona fide owner of 16 his/her own animals; *or* "
- Section 7. A new Section 121904, Article 19, Chapter 12, Division 1, 18 Part 2, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *added* and the following section is hereby *renumbered* to read as follows:
- "§ 121904. Scope of Practice. The practice of veterinary medicine includes veterinary medicine, veterinary surgery, and veterinary dentistry, as described below:
- (a) <u>Diagnosing</u>, administering or prescribing a drug, medicine,
 appliance, application, or treatment of whatever nature for the prevention,
 cure or relief of a wound, fracture, bodily injury, or disease of animals;

- 1 (b) Performing a surgical or dental operation upon an animal; and
- 2 (c) Represents himself or herself as engaged in the practice of
- 3 veterinary medicine, veterinary surgery, or veterinary dentistry in any of its
- 4 branches.
- 5 § 121904. § 121905. Professional Conduct; Additional Provisions.
- 6 The following acts are deemed unprofessional conduct and are subject to
- 7 disciplinary action as delineated in Article 1, General Regulations, of these
- 8 rules and regulations:
- 9 (a) cruelty to animals, as defined by Guam law, or as determined by
- 10 the Board; and
- 11 (b) failure to maintain their professional premises in a sanitary
- 12 condition."
- Section 8. A new Section 121907, Article 19, Chapter 12, Division 1,
- 14 Part 2, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby added to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 "<u>§ 121907.</u> Prohibited Acts.
- 17 (a) Misrepresentation of Title. Except as otherwise provided under
- 18 this Article, a person may not represent or imply to the public by use of the
- 19 <u>title 'licensed veterinarian,' by other title, by description of services, methods</u>
- 20 or procedures that the person is authorized to practice veterinarian medicine
- 21 <u>services on Guam.</u>
- 22 (b) Misuse of Words and Terms. Unless authorized to engage in
- 23 veterinarian medicine practice under this Article, a person may not use any
- 24 words, letters or titles in such connection or under such circumstances as to
- 25 induce the belief that the person using them is engaged in the practice of

- 1 veterinary medicine, veterinary surgery, or veterinary dentistry. The use
- 2 shall be a prima facie evidence of the intention to represent himself or herself
- 3 as engaged in the practice of veterinary medicine, veterinary surgery or
- 4 veterinary dentistry."
- 5 **Section 9. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application
- 6 to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
- 7 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law, which
- 8 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this
- 9 end the provisions of this Law are severable.
