I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth, & Foreign Affairs held a public hearing on Bill 392(EC) on December 20, 2006 in the Guam Legislature's public hearing room in Hagatna, Guam. Notice of public hearing was disseminated throughout all local media.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Robert Lizama presented oral testimony in his personal capacity in support of Bill 392(EC). Mr. Lizama stated that as a trucker he finds it particularly dangerous to drive on roads in which there are pickup trucks with passengers riding *outside* of the vehicle passenger compartment. He emphasized that the bed of a pickup truck is intended to carry cargo and not passengers.

Larry Perez, Director, Department of Public Works (DPW), presented written testimony in support of Bill 392(EC). Mr. Perez provided the committee with a listing of recommendations for the revision of the Guam Seat Belt Law, which he stated was drafted subsequent to the introduction of Bill 264(COR) of the 27th Guam Legislature. At the time the recommendations were drafted, Mr. Perez stated that DPW would be in support of any legislation that pushed for greater highway safety, and therefore expressed support for Bill 392. Mr. Perez also requested that the committee review DPW's comments and recommendations as provided in his testimony.

III. FINDINGS

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs finds that Guam law should be amended to provide stricter seat belt policies for passengers as proposed in Bill 392(EC). Based on the public testimony provided by Robert Lizama and Larry Perez, Bill 392 is a necessary measure to safeguard against the dangers posed by passengers riding outside of vehicle passenger compartments.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Criminal Justice, Public Safety, Youth & Foreign Affairs hereby reports out Bill No. 392(EC): An act to amend Title 16 G.C.A., Chapter 26, §26103 to require passengers riding outside the passenger compartment of a vehicle to wear seatbelt” to *I Mina Bente Ocho Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* with the recommendation **TO DO PASS.**

Hafa Adai! This is in response to your letter dated December 12, 2006 regarding the upcoming Public Hearing scheduled for Wednesday, December 20, 2006.

Below you will find the DPW's concern and comments in regards to **Bill No. 392 (EC)**.

On **March 19, 2004**, a recommendation letter was sent to Mr. Joshua F. Tenorio, Committee Director for the Committee on Judiciary & Transportation, responding to his request for comment and/or recommendations to **Bill 264 (COR)**, to amend **subsection 26103** of **Title 16, Guam Code Annotated**, relative to requiring the use of seat belts by **all** occupant of a car, van, or pickup truck. In addition to our recommendation, we also requested for the committee to look into amending **subsections 26101 and 26102**.

Public Law 18-45, which is also known as the **Guam Seat Belt Law**, has some significant gaps in the coverage that diminish the protection that all children need in motor vehicles. We informed the committee director that DPW's standpoint, we are in support of the Bill and any other future Bills relating to Highway Safety. In addition, we requested that the committee look into amending other subsections of Public Law 18-45 and submitted the recommendations below:

- Cover all occupants up to age 16 in all seating positions. The present law, Public Law 18-45 covers babies and children below twelve years of age, but does not have protection for children up to 16 years of age.
- Primary enforcement. Occupant protection laws for children should be the primary enforcement law, which allows law enforcement officer to stop a vehicle and issue a citation when the officer observes an unrestrained occupant.
- Require child occupants to be properly restrained. This means using an infant seat from birth to using a booster seat up to twelve years of age, or until the child is 4'9" inches tall.

- Allow passengers to ride only in seating areas equipped with safety belts. A strong child passenger safety law should not include exemptions that allow children to be transported in areas not equipped with safety belts, (e.g., the cargo area of a truck). This practice is extremely dangerous and places children at unnecessary risk for death or serious injury.
- Prohibit all passengers from riding in the cargo areas of pickup trucks. When all passengers are prohibited, it is more likely that children will not be allowed to ride there. With or without a canopy, riding in the cargo area places all riders at unnecessary risk for death and injury.

As of this date, this Department has not received any word as to whether **Bill 264 (COR)** was passed. Then on **February 3, 2006**, I submitted a request to the Governor of Guam to propose a legislation to amend the Guam Seat Belt Law to include all the recommendations above. I have not received any updates from the Legal Council.

Therefore, I am hereby submitting this letter in support of **Bill No. 392 (EC)** and recommend as well for you and the committee to review and possibly accept our recommendations and/or comments relating to the other subsections of Public Law 18-45.
