AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 89 OF TITLE 9 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE GUAM SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY AND REQUIRING ALL THOSE CONVICTED OF CRIMINAL SEXUAL CONDUCT OR OF A CRIME AGAINST A VICTIM WHO IS A MINOR TO REGISTER IN THE SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY AND TO STRENGTHEN THE GUAM SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION AND NOTIFICATION PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS.

### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Guam's 2 3 Sex Offender Registry statute is in need of changes in order to strengthen its provisions and close certain gaps within the law. I Liheslatura further finds that the Supreme Court of the United States has 4 5 determined that Due Process rights (Connecticut Dept. of Public Safety v. John Doe, et al.) and the ex post facto clause in the U.S. Constitution (Delbert W. Smith and Bruce M. Botelho v. John Doe I, et 6 al.) have not been violated by requiring those already convicted of criminal sexual conduct or of a 7 crime against a victim who is a minor before the enactment of Sex Offender Registry laws to register 8 with the Guam Sex Offender Registry. I Liheslatura also finds that the crime of criminal sexual 9

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conduct and the various forms of crimes against children are serious problems on our island, and persons convicted of these crimes may be a danger to the people of our community. *I Liheslatura* further finds that in order to protect the people of our community, most particularly our children, from sex offenses, especially violent sex offenses, the Guam Sex Offender Registry Law must be strengthened.

It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to update the Guam Sex Offender Registry requirements and notification program and to require *all* those convicted of criminal sexual conduct or of a crime against a victim who is a minor to register with the Guam Sex Offender Registry in order to increase the awareness of our island's community and our nation about dangerous individuals released into the community. *I Liheslatura* hopes that such awareness will assist in the prevention of future sex offenses and alert the community of such dangers.

Section 2. Chapter 89 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as
 follows:

Section 89.01. Definitions.

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#### **"CHAPTER 89**

#### CRIMES AGAINST MINORS AND SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY

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(a) '*Minor*' means a person below the age of eighteen (18) years.

As used in this Chapter:

(b) *'Criminal offense against a victim who is a minor'* means any criminal offense that consists of any of the following:

20(1)felony kidnapping, except if by parent, felonious restraint except21if by parent, felony child stealing and custodial interference except if by parent,

as defined and punished in Chapter 22 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, *Kidnapping, and Related Offenses,* when the victim is a minor;

(2)promoting prostitution, abetting prostitution, compelling prostitution, as defined and punished in Article 1 of Chapter 28 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, Prostitution, when the individual committing or engaging in prostitution is a minor;

participation in obscenity, use of one's own child in obscene acts, (3) indecent exposure, photography of minors' sexual acts, as defined and punished in Article 2 of Chapter 28 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, *Obscenity and Related Offenses,* when a minor is employed or used;

(4)criminal sexual conduct, as defined and punished in Chapter 25 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, Sexual Offenses, when the victim of the crime is a minor; or

(5) attempt to commit, solicitation to commit, or conspiracy to commit the crimes stated in Paragraphs (1) to (4) of this Subsection (b), in violation of Chapter 13 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated.

(c) 'Criminal sexual conduct' refers to violations defined and punished under 17 Chapter 25 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated, Sexual Offenses, and any violations 18 of similar federal laws or laws of other states, territories or tribes.

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(d) 'Sexually violent offense' refers to any of the following:

> (1)criminal sexual conduct involving sexual penetration or sexual

contact when the actor causes personal injury to the victim and either of the following circumstances exists: (A) force or coercion is used to accomplish the sexual penetration or contact; *or* (B) the actor knows or has reason to know that the victim is mentally defective, mentally incapacitated or physically helpless;

(2) criminal sexual conduct involving sexual penetration or sexual contact where the actor is aided or abetted by one (1) or more other persons and either of the following circumstances exists: (A) force or coercion is used to accomplish the sexual penetration or contact, *or* (B) the actor knows or has reason to know that the victim is mentally defective, mentally incapacitated or physically helpless;

(3) criminal sexual conduct involving sexual penetration or sexual contact where the actor is armed with a weapon or any article used or fashioned in a manner to lead the victim to reasonably believe it to be a weapon;

(4) criminal sexual conduct involving sexual penetration or sexual contact which occurs under circumstances involving the commission of another felony;

(5) criminal sexual conduct involving a victim under fourteen (14) years of age; *or* 

(6) violation of 18 USC §§2241 *or* 2242, or any other similar laws of other states, territories or tribes.

violation of 18 USC §§§2251, 2252, and 2252A, or any other (7) 1 similar laws of other states, territories or tribes; or 2 violation of 18 USC §1591 or any other similar laws of other (8) 3 states, territories and tribes; or 4 violation of 18 USC §2422(b) or any other laws of other states, (9) 5 territories and tribes; or 6 (10) violation of 18 USC §2423(a) or any other laws of other states, 7 territories and tribes; or 8 (11) violation of 18 USC §2244 or any other laws of other states, 9 10 territories and tribes. (e) The terms 'sexual penetration' and 'sexual contact' have the same meaning 11 as 'sexual penetration' and 'sexual contact' in Chapter 25 of Title 9 of the Guam Code 12 Annotated. 13 The term 'sex offender' refers to persons convicted of a criminal sexual (f) 14 conduct offense. 15 (g) The term 'conviction' refers to each separate charge to which the offender 16 either voluntarily pleads guilty, whether in a single hearing or in separate hearings, or 17 is found guilty by a trier of fact, whether the charges are contained in one (1) 18 indictment, or separate indictments. This term includes convictions based on pleas of 19 nolo contendere and guilty pleas entered pursuant to North Carolina v. Alford, 400 U.S. 25 20 (1970). 21

(h) The term 'convicted' or a variant thereof, used with respect to a sex offense, also includes *adjudicated delinquent as a juvenile for that offense*, but only if the offender is fourteen (14) years of age or older at the time of the offense and the offense adjudicated was comparable to or more severe than aggravated sexual abuse (as described in §2241 of Title 18 USC), or was an attempt or conspiracy to commit such an offense.

(h)(i) The terms 'employed' and 'carries on a vocation' include employment that is full-time or part-time for a period of time exceeding fourteen (14) days, or an aggregate period of time exceeding thirty (30) days during any calendar year, whether financially compensated, on a volunteer bases or for the purpose of government or educational benefit.

(i)(j) <u>The term 'student</u>' means any person who is enrolled on a full-time or part-time basis, in any public or private educational institution, including any secondary school, trade, or professional institutions, or institution of higher learning.

(i)(k) <u>The term</u> "Institution of higher education" means post secondary school.

16(k)(1)The term 'law enforcement agency' means any so designated agency on17Guam, including, but not limited to, the Guam Police Department, the Jose D. Leon18Guerrero Commercial Port Authority of Guam Police, the Parole Services Division of19the Department of Corrections, the Superior Court Judiciary of Guam Probation20Services Division, the U.S. Probation Office, the U.S. Marshal's Service, the21Conservation Office of the Department of Agriculture, the A. B. Won Pat International

Airport Guam Police, the Attorney Generals Office's Family and Prosecution Divisions, the Superior Court Judiciary of Guam and its Marshals Division, the Air Force Office of Special Investigations, the Naval Criminal Investigation Section, the Coast Guard Criminal Investigation Section, the United States Army Criminal Investigation Division, and other criminal investigators of the United States Government.

As Guam does not have recognized law enforcement Campus Police in Guam's Institution of Higher Education, the Guam Police Department is the recognized law enforcement agency with jurisdiction over Guam's Institution of Higher Education.

(m)(n) The term '*community*' refers to the entire territorial boundaries of Guam.

(n)(o) The term 'registrant' refers to persons required to register under this

(2) Every person who was convicted in the Superior Court of Guam *prior to* the effective date of this law of a criminal sexual conduct offense or of a criminal offense against a victim who is a minor and is incarcerated on the effective date of this law shall provide a biological sample for DNA typing *no later than* six (6) three (3) months after the effective date of this law.
(3) Every person who was convicted in the Superior Court of Guam *prior to* the effective date of this law of a criminal sexual conduct offense, or of a criminal offense against a victim who is a minor and was-is released on parole or probation after January 1, 1993, shall provide a biological sample for DNA typing to the Guam Police Department at the time of that person's initial registration or within thirty (30) working days of initial registration.

(4) Every person required to register pursuant to Paragraphs (2), (3) or (4) of §89.03(a) shall provide a biological sample to the Guam Police Department for DNA typing at the time of that person's initial registration on Guam or within thirty (30) working days upon conviction.

(d) Registration Requirements for Persons Required to Register Pursuant to §89.03(a)(1); Initial Registration; Penalty.

(1) Where a Person Required to Register is Sentenced to Incarceration. Initial registration information must be provided to the Parole Services Division of the Department of Corrections Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office, prior to release from incarceration and, in any case, no later than two (2) weeks before the person's anticipated release ninety (90) working days after that person's conviction. Intentional or knowing failure to provide this information shall result in the delay of that person's release.

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(2) Where a Person Required to Register is Sentenced to Probation. Initial registration information must be provided to the Probation Services Division of the Superior Court of Guam Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Management Office *no later than* the date the person is scheduled to be placed on probation. Intentional or knowing failure to provide this information by that date shall result in the revocation of the person's probation and shall make that person *ineligible* for probation.

this Subsection is a felony of the third degree.

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Where a Person Required to Register is No Longer Under the (4)Supervision of Either Probation or Parole at the Time of the Passage of This Law and Has Not Been Registered. Subject to written notice by certified or registered mail provided by the Superior Court of Guam Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office to a person as described in this Section, initial registration information must be provided to the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office no *later than* one (1) year after receipt of written notice by to the person. The Guam Police Department shall transmit the information to the Court no later than three (3) business days thereafter for inclusion into the Sex Offender Registry database. The required notice shall be given by certified mail, but if such is attempted and is unsuccessful, notice shall be given by publication on Guam in a newspaper of general circulation. Registration must occur within ninety (90) calendar days of successful service by mail or the publication date. Proof of delivery by certified mail, or in the case of notice by publication, proof of the person's presence on Guam on the date(s) of publication establishes evidence of notice. Intentional or knowing failure to register pursuant to this Subsection is a felony of the third degree.

(e) Registration Requirements for Persons Required to Register Pursuant to §89.03(a), Paragraphs (2), (3) or (4); Initial Registration with the Judiciary of Guam,

Sex Offender Management Office.

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(1) Persons required to register pursuant to §89.03(a)(2) shall provide all the information that must be registered pursuant to §89.03(b) to the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office no later than seven (7) calendar days after release from incarceration, release on probation or arrival on Guam. If the registrant is on probation in another jurisdiction and that registrant's probation is to be transferred to Guam, then the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office may obtain the necessary information from the office of probation of the jurisdiction from where registrant came; said registrant is required to verify the registered information as required by this Chapter no later than seven (7) calendar days after the person's arrival on Guam.

(2) Persons required to register pursuant to Paragraphs (3) or (4) of §89.03(a) shall provide all the information that must be registered pursuant to §89.03(b) to the Guam Police Department\_Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender <u>Registry Management Office</u> *no later than* seven (7) calendar days after their arrival on Guam. *If* the registrant is on probation in another jurisdiction, and that registrant's probation is to be transferred to Guam, then the <del>Guam Police</del> <del>Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office</del> may obtain the necessary information from the office of probation of the jurisdiction from where the registrant came; said registrant is required to verify the registered information as required by this Chapter *no later than* seven (7) calendar days after the registrant's arrival on Guam.

(f) **Registration Requirements; Verification.** A registrant must verify the following information with the Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management <u>Office</u>:

(1) **Level One Offender**. The registrant shall verify the following registered information ninety (90) calendar days from the date the registrant's release from incarceration, or ninety (90) calendar days from the date of the registrant's release on probation *if* the registrant is placed on probation, and every ninety (90) calendar days thereafter. *If* the ninetieth (90<sup>th</sup>) day falls on a weekend or holiday, the registrant shall verify the following information on the following business day:

- (A) current physical and mailing address(es);
  - (B) recent criminal offenses, *if any*;
  - (C) documentation of treatment;
  - (D) a current photograph; *and*

17 (E) name and address of the institution of higher education,
18 enrollment or employment status, and any changes of enrollment or
19 employment status if the person is enrolled, employed or carrying on a
20 vocation-;

21 (F) the license plate number and the year, make, model and

color of any vehicle owned or operated by the person; and 1 (G) a photocopy of the person's driver's license or 2 identification card. 3 (2)Level Two Offender. The registrant shall verify the following 4 registered information exactly one (1) year six (6) months from the date of the 5 registrant's release from incarceration or the date of the registrant's release on 6 probation *if* the registrant is placed on probation, and exactly every year six (6) 7 months thereafter. If the date the registrant is to verify falls on a weekend or 8 holiday, the registrant shall verify the following information on the following 9 business day: 10 (A) current physical and mailing address(es); 11 (B) recent criminal offenses, *if any*; 12 (C) documentation of treatment; 13 (D) a current photograph; and 14 (E) name and address of the institution of higher education, 15 enrollment or employment status, and any changes of enrollment or 16 employment status if the person is enrolled, employed or carrying on a 17 vocation-; 18 the license plate number and the year, make, model and 19 (F) color of any vehicle owned or operated by the person; and 20

(G) a photocopy of the person's driver's license or

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identification card.

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2	(3) Level Three Offender. The registrant shall verify registered
3	information in the same manner as a Level Two Offender. The registrant shall
4	verify the following registered information exactly one (1) year from the date of
5	the registrant's release from incarceration or the date of the registrant's release
6	on probation if the registrant is placed on probation, and exactly every year
7	thereafter. If the date the registrant is to verify falls on a weekend or holiday,
8	the registrant shall verify the following information on the following business
9	<u>day:</u>
10	(A) current physical and mailing address(es);
11	(B) recent criminal offenses, <i>if any</i> ;
12	(C) documentation of treatment;
13	(D) a current photograph; <i>and</i>

(4) Notwithstanding Subsections (a), (b) *and* (c) of this Section, a registrant shall register the registrant's new physical address with the Court Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office within seven (7) calendar days of any change in physical residence. If a registrant anticipates moving from Guam, that registrant shall register his intended place of residence with the Court Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Offender Registry Management Office no later than three (3) calendar days before his departure from Guam.

(g) Registration Requirements for Offenders Enrollment and Employment in an Institution of Higher Education. The registrant must update the name and address of the institution of higher education, enrollment or employment status, and any changes of enrollment or employment status if the registrant is enrolled, employed or carrying on a vocation in an institution of higher education within seven (7) <u>calendar</u> days of any changes in employment or enrollment in an institution of higher education with the <u>Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam</u>, <u>Sex Offender Registry Management Office. The Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall then notify the Guam Police Department of the update immediately.</u>

19(h) Registration Requirements; Verification, Method of Verification. A20registrant shall verify the registrant's registered information as requiresd by §89.03(e)21by personally presenting him/herself to the Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry

Management Office to verify registrant information as required by law.in the following manner:

(1) Parolee. A parolee shall personally present oneself to the parolee's parole officer and verify the registered information with the parole officer;

(2) <u>Probationer</u>. A probationer shall personally present oneself to the person's probation officer and verify the registered information with the probation officer;

(3) Dual Supervision. A person under dual supervision, that is, the person is supervised by both parole and probation, shall personally present oneself to that person's probation officer; *and* 

(4) Others. All registrants, including persons who are no longer under supervised parole or probation, shall personally appear at the Guam Police Department, Records Section, and register with the Guam Police Department.

(i) Registration Requirement; Guam Residents Who are Employed, Carry on a Vocation, or are Students in Another State or Territory. A person who is required to register on Guam and who is employed, carries on a vocation, or is a student of another state or territory, shall also register in that other state or territory pursuant to the registration requirements of that state or territory.

(j) Registration Requirement; Persons Who Move to Another State or

**Territory.** When a person who is required to register on Guam anticipates moving to another state or territory, that registrant shall report the change of address to the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office pursuant to the requirements of this Chapter, *and* comply with any registration requirement of the new state or territory of residence.

**Section 89.04. Registration.** A registrant shall continue to comply with this Chapter, *except* during ensuing periods of incarceration, for the following period of time:

(a) Lifetime; Level One and Level Two Offenders. A Level One and TwoOffender must comply with this Chapter for the length of that person's life.

(b) Ten (10)Fifteen (15) Years; Level Three Offenders. A person deemed a Level Three Offender shall register pursuant to §89.03(b)(2), and Subsections (2) and (3) of §89.03(f), for a period of ten (10)must comply with this Chapter for a period of fifteen (15) years from the date of that person's release on probation or release on paroleregistration.

(c) Where Conviction Reversed, Vacated or Set Aside or Where Registrant Pardoned. Notwithstanding Subsections (a) and (b) of this Section, where the underlying conviction is reversed, vacated or set aside, or *if* the person is pardoned of the crime which triggered the registration requirement of this Chapter, registration is no longer required.

 (d) **Tolling of Registration Requirement.** *If* a registrant is re-incarcerated for violations of release conditions imposed in the same crime, or for the commission

of another crime, or the registrant is civilly committed, or if the registrant leaves to a 1 foreign country and informs the Sex Offender Registry Management Office, then the 2 period of registration is tolled and remains tolled until the registrant's subsequent 3 release or arrival on a state, territory, or tribe within the jurisdiction of the United 4 States. Thereafter, the registrant shall recommence and continue registering for the 5 remaining period of time the registrant is required to register. Reduced Period for Clean Record. (e) Clean Record. The full registration period shall be reduced as 8 (1)described for a Sex Offender who maintains a clean record for the period by: 9 (a) not being convicted of any offense for which 10 imprisonment for more than one (1) year may be imposed; not being convicted of any sex offense; 12 (b) successfully completing any periods of supervised 13 (c) release, probation, and parole; and 14 successfully completing an appropriate sex offender (d) 15 treatment program certified by a jurisdiction or by the Attorney 16 General. 17 Period. In case of: (2) 18 (a) a Level Three Sex Offender, the period during which the clean record shall be maintained is ten (10) years; 20 (b) a Level Two and a Level One Sex Offenders, the period

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during which the clean record shall be maintained is twenty-five (25) years.

(3) Reduction. In case of:

(a) a Level Three Sex Offender, the reduction is five (5) years;

(b) a Level Two and Level One Sex Offenders, the reduction is from life to that period for which the clean record is maintained.

Section 89.05. Penalties.

(a) Initial Registration. Intentional or knowing failure to provide initial registration information shall delay the registrant's release *if* the registrant is to be released, or make the registrant ineligible for probation if the registrant is to be placed on probation. Intentional or knowing failure to provide initial registration information is a felony of the third degree.

(b) Verification. The failure to verify registered information is a misdemeanor. A second or subsequent failure to so register is a felony of the third degree. Failure of a probationer or parolee to so register may result in sanctions pursuant to 8 GCA §80.66 *and* 9 GCA §80.82*, respectively.* 

18(c)Address Changes. A registrant's failure to register the registrant's new19physical and mailing address within seven (7) calendar days of any change of physical20and mailing address is a misdemeanor. A second or subsequent failure to so register is21a felony of the third degree. Failure of a registrant who is a probationer or parolee to

so register may result in sanctions pursuant to 9 GCA §80.66 and 9 GCA §80.82, *respectively*.

(d) False Information. Intentionally and knowingly providing false information during initial registration or subsequent verification is a felony of the second degree.

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(e) Enrollment or Employment at an Institution of Higher Education. A registrant's failure to update enrollment or employment at an institution of higher education or termination of such enrollment or employment at an institution of higher education with the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office within seven (7) calendar days of any change would constitute a failure to register or keep such registration current is a felony of the third degree.

Section 89.06. Duties of the Department of Corrections and the <u>Court Probation</u> <u>Services Division of the Judiciary of Guam</u>; Initial Registration. *If* a registrant is released from incarceration, placed on parole or placed on probation, the Department of Corrections, the Parole Services Division, the <u>Court</u> or the Probation Services Division shall:

(a) inform the registrant of the duty to register and obtain the information required for such registration;

(b) inform the registrant that *if* the registrant changes residence on Guam, the registrant shall provide the new residential address to the Court;

(c) inform the registrant that *if* the registrant moves to another state or territory, the registrant shall report the change of address to the Court *no later than* 

three (3) calendar days of the registrant's leaving Guam, and shall comply with any registration requirement of the new state or territory;

(d) inform the registrant that *if* the registrant is, or becomes, employed, carries on a vocation, or becomes a student in another state or territory, then the registrant must comply with the registration requirement of that new state or territory;

(e) obtain all information that must necessarily be gathered for the registrant's initial registration, and inform the registrant that the registrant must provide the registrant's fingerprints, a photograph and a biological sample to the Guam Police Department. The Department of Corrections or the Office of Probation shall facilitate the obtaining of fingerprints, photograph and biological sample. After this information is gathered, the Guam Police Department shall retain the biological sample and transmit the fingerprints and photograph to the Court within three (3) calendar days;

(b) refer the registrant to the Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office for initial registration and verification;

(f)(c) require the registrant to read and sign a form stating that the registrant's duty to register under this Chapter has been explained; *and* 

(g)(d) forward information described in (f)(c) above to the CourtJudiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office within three (3) calendar days after receipt thereof.

(h)(e) inform the registrant that if the registrant enrolls at, is employed at, or

carries on a vocation at an institution of higher education in Guam the registrant must inform the Guam Police DepartmentJudiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry <u>Management Office</u>, who shall then, and to notify the Guam Police Department of any change in such enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education within seven (7) calendar days of any changes.

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(i)(f) ensure the registration information collected on the registrant's enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education, and any change of enrollment or employment status of the registrants at the institution of higher education is promptly made available to the Guam Police Department Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office.

(<del>j)</del>(<u>g</u>) ensure the registration information collected on the registrant's enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education, and any change of enrollment or employment status of the registrants at the institution of higher education is provided to the Superior Court of Guam Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office to be entered into Guam's Sex Offender Registry.

# 17 Section 89.07. Duties of the Department of Corrections and the Court, Verification 18 of Registered Information.

(a) The Department of Corrections, Parole Services Division, shall receive and obtain initial registration and registration verification information from registrants who are parolees, and shall transmit such information to the Court *no later than* three (3) business days of receipt of such information.

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(b) The Court, Probation Services Division, shall receive and obtain initial registration and registration verification information from registrants who are probationers and shall enter such information into the Court's Sex Offender Registry database.

Section 89.08. Duties of the Guam Police Department.

(a) Upon receipt of the information that is required to be registered or verified pursuant to this Chapter, the Guam Police Department shall *immediately*, and *no later than* three (3) business days of receipt of this information, transmit the information to the Court which shall record this information in the Sex Offender Registry database. The Guam Police Department shall also immediately transmit the registrant's photograph, fingerprints, conviction data and current residence to the Court. In addition to sex offender data, the Guam Police Department shall also immediately transmit all felony fingerprints to the Court. The Court shall forward these fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Automated Fingerprint Identification System ('AFIS') for assignment of a fingerprint identification number.

17(b) inform the registrant that if the registrant enrolls at, is employed at, or18carries on a vocation at an institution of higher education in Guam the registrant must19inform Guam Police Department, and to notify the Guam Police Department of any20change in such enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education21within seven (7) calendar days.

(c) ensure the registration information collected on the registrant's enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education, and any change of enrollment or employment status of the registrant at the institution of higher education is promptly made available to the Guam Police Department.

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(d) ensure the registration information collected on the registrant's enrollment or employment status at the institution of higher education, and any change of enrollment or employment status of the registrant at the institution of higher education is provided to the Superior Court of Guam *no later than* three (3) business days of receipt of the information to be entered into Guam's Sex Offender Registry.

(e) The Superior Court of Guam is the state sole source for submission of information and fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the National Crime Information Center ('NCIC'). The Court shall enter all registered information into the NCIC system *no later than* three (3) business days after receipt of such information.

15(f) Notification of Local Law Enforcement Agencies Regarding Changes of16Address; Moving From Guam. Upon receipt of information that the registrant is17anticipated to move from Guam to another state, territory or tribe, the Court shall18*immediately* notify that state or territory to which the registrant is moving, and shall19transmit the address of the registrant's anticipated residence to the Federal Bureau of20Investigation *no later than* three (3) business days of receipt of this information.

(g) Notification of FBI Regarding Changes of Address.

Upon receipt of information that registrant is or has changed residence within Guam, 1 or is anticipated to move from Guam to another state, territory or tribe, the Guam 2 Police Department shall transmit the new address to the Federal Bureau of 3 Investigation *no later than* three (3) business days after receipt of this information. 4 The Guam Police Department shall: 5 inform all persons required to register under this Chapter of their duty (a) 6 to register; 7 require any person required to register under this Chapter who has not (b) 8 9 yet provided his or her initial registration information to read an sign a form stating the registrant's duty to register under this Chapter has been explained; 10 forward information described in (b) supra to the Judiciary of Guam, Sex 11 (c) Offender Registry Management Office within three (3) calendar days after receipt 12 thereof; 13 collect a biological sample from the registered offender as required in (d) 14 this Chapter and submit the sample to the Federal Bureau of Investigations within 15 twenty-four (24) hours of collection and to any local entity that may be Guam's central 16 repository for DNA; and 17 collect and keep records of fingerprints and palm prints from the 18 (e) registrant and also distribute cards containing such prints to the Judiciary of Guam, 19 Sex Offender Registry Management Office. 20 Section 89.09. Duties of the CourtJudiciary of Guam. 21

(a) **Repository.** The <u>Court</u> <u>Judiciary of Guam</u> shall be the central repository for the registered information, in addition to all criminal history records information.

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(b) Sole Source of Submission of information to the Federal Bureau of Information ('FBI') and the National Crime Information Center ('NCIC'). The Judiciary of Guam shall enter all registered information into the NCIC system no later than three (3) business days after receipt of such information. The Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall forward the fingerprints and palm prints to the FBI's Automated Fingerprint Identification System ('AFIS') for assignment of a fingerprint identification number.

(c) Notification of Local Law Enforcement Agencies Regarding Changes of Address; Relocation from Guam. Upon receipt of information that the registrant is anticipated to relocated from Guam to another state, territory or tribe, the Judiciary of Guam shall immediately notify the state, territory or tribe to which the registrant is relocating and shall transmit the address of the registrant's anticipated residence to the FBI *no later than* three (3) working days of receipt of such information.

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 (d) Notification of FBI Regarding Changes of Address. Upon receipt of

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 information that registrant is or has changed residence within Guam, or is anticipated

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 to relocate from Guam to another state, territory or tribe, the Judiciary of Guam shall

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 transmit the new address to the FBI *no later than* three (3) working days after receipt of

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 such information.

(e) Release of Information. The Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall ensure that all of the registrant's information that is required to be released under this Chapter is properly and timely released.

(b)(f) Fees. The Court Judiciary of Guam is authorized to collect reasonable
 registration fees from registrants. Such fees shall be used for the maintenance and
 support of the sex offender registration and notification program. Fifty percent (50%)
 One Hundred percent (100%) of the fee paid by the registrant shall be given to the
 Court Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office and the remaining
 fifty percent (50%) shall go to the Guam Police Department.

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 Section 89.09.01 Duties of the Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry

The-Court Judiciary of Guam, 10 Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall maintain an Internet web-page 11 dedicated to persons required to register, which shall contain the information that is 12 required to be released. The released information shall be updated during the first 13 week of every month immediately after a registrant registers, or updates registered 14 information. The community shall have access to the Sex Offender Registry Web 15 Page. The Court Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall 16 transmit released information concerning Level One, and Level Two, and Level Three 17 Offenders to the Department of Education, the Guam Community College, the 18 University of Guam, the Department of Administration, the Department of Labor & 19 Agency for Human Resource Development, the Department of Public Health & Social 20 Services, the Department of Youth Affairs, all public and private schools, day care 21

centers, victim shelters and victim advocates on the first week of every month. The Court\_Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office may transmit information concerning Level One and Level Two all Offenders directly to the media for dissemination.

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(e) Verification of Names on Sex Offender Registry. Entities within the Government of Guam may request the Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office to verify the identities of individuals registered on the Sex Offender Registry for the purposes of employment.

(f) Functionality of Sex Offender Registry Web Page. The Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Registry Management Office shall, within the Sex Offender Registry Web Page, provide for:

(1) a searchable database of all Sex Offenders;

(2) a mechanism to allow visitors to subscribe, through an electronic mail ('e-mail') address, to notification of any updates or changes made to the Sex Offender Registry;

(3) links, to the extent practicable, to sex offender safety and education resources;

(4) instructions on how to seek correction of information that an individual contends is erroneous; *and* 

(5) a warning that information on the site should not be used to unlawfully injure, harass, or commit a crime against any individual named in the registry or residing or working at any reported address, and such warning shall note that any such action could result in civil or criminal penalties.

(g) Notice of Change. The Judiciary of Guam, Sex Offender Management Office shall, upon passage of this Act, publish every month for the first twelve (12) months in a publication of general circulation a notice to the public of changes made by this act requiring all convicted sex offenders to register with the Sex Offender Registry.

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Section 89.11. Immunity for Good Faith Conduct. Law enforcement agencies, their
employees and government of Guam officials shall be immune from any civil or criminal
liability for good faith conduct under this Act, *unless* it is shown that the agency, employee,
government official or board member acted with gross negligence or in bad faith."

11 Section 3. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or 12 circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions 13 or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, 14 and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
