AN ACT TO ADD SECTIONS 18102.1 AND 18102.2, ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 18, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THE **GUAM POLICE** DEPARTMENT **ISSUE** TO RESPONSIBILITY WARNINGS TO **PERSONS** ASSUMING CUSTODY OF PERSONS ARRESTED FOR DUI AND TO REQUIRING THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT TO IMPOUND VEHICLES OF PERSONS ARRESTED FOR DUI.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Intent. It is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to

authorize Guam Police Department to impound the motor vehicles of those

4 charged with driving under the influence for a period of twelve (12)

5 hours. And to require Guam Police Department to issue responsibility

6 warnings to those arriving at law enforcement premises to pick up DUI

7 suspects, informing them of their potential civil and criminal liability if they

8 help the DUI offenders resume driving while still impaired.

Section 2. A new Section 18102.1 is hereby added to, Article 1, Chapter

18, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 18102.1. Written Statement of Potential Civil, Criminal Liability for Permitting an Intoxicated Arrestee's Operation of Motor **Vehicle.** (a) Whenever a person is summoned by or on behalf of a person who has been arrested for a violation of §18102 of this Chapter, in order to transport or accompany the arrestee from the premises of a police station, the Guam Police Department shall provide that person with a written statement advising him of his potential criminal and civil liability for permitting or facilitating the arrestee's operation of a motor vehicle while the arrestee remains intoxicated. The person to whom the statement is issued shall acknowledge, in writing, receipt of the statement or the Guam Police Department shall record the fact that the written statement was provided, but the person refused to sign an acknowledgment.

(b) The Attorney General shall establish the content and form of the written statement and acknowledgment to be used by law enforcement agencies and may issue directives to ensure the uniform implementation of this section."

Section 2. A new Section 18102.2 is hereby added to, Article 1, Chapter 18, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"Section 18102. 2. Impoundment of Vehicle Operated by Arrestee; Conditions of Release; Fee for Towing, Storage. (a) Whenever the driver of a vehicle is arrested for a violation of \$18102 of this Chapter, the vehicle is subject to impoundment of the Guam Police Department. A vehicle impounded pursuant to this section shall be impounded for a period of twelve (12) hours after the time of arrest or until such later time as the arrestee claiming the vehicle meets the conditions for release in subsection (c) of this section.

- (b) A vehicle impounded pursuant to this section may be released to a person
 other than the arrestee prior to the end of the impoundment period only if:
- (1) The vehicle is not owned or leased by the person under arrest and the
 person who owns or leases the vehicle claims the vehicle and meets the
 conditions for release in subsection d of this section; or

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- (2) The vehicle is owned or leased by the arrestee, the arrestee gives permission to another person, who has acknowledged in writing receipt of the statement required in § 18102.1 of this Chapter to operate the vehicle and the conditions for release in subsection d of this section are met.
- 12 (c) A vehicle impounded pursuant to this section shall not be released unless 12 the person claiming the vehicle:
 - (1) presents a valid operator's license, proof of ownership or lawful authority to operate the motor vehicle, and proof of valid motor vehicle insurance for that vehicle;
 - (2) is able to operate the vehicle in a safe manner and would not be in violation of Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated; and
- (d) Pursuant to this section the Guam Police Department is authorized to charge a reasonable fee for towing and storage of an impounded vehicle. The Guam Police Department is further authorized to retain custody of the vehicle until that fee is paid."
- Section 3. Effective Date. This act shall become effective ninety (90) days after enactment into public law.
