AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 3108, 3111, 3115, AND 3119; AND TO ADD A NEW §3111.1, ALL OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 17 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE GUAM PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. §3108 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is amended to

read:

"§3108. Attorney for the Board. The Board <u>is authorized and</u> may employ an attorney to assist and represent it <u>during any meetings and</u> in all civil matters. The Board <u>may shall</u> set the terms and conditions for employment of the attorney or law firm. The Board shall determine whether the appointment is a full-time, unclassified employee or an independent consultant. The Board <u>may is authorized to</u> expend funds for hiring an attorney or procuring legal services."

Section 2. §3111 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to

read:

"§3111. Guam Education Policy Board. There is hereby created a Guam Education Policy Board (*Board*). The Board shall consist of at least eleven (11) members as follows:

(a) Nine (9) District Elected Voting Members. Nine (9) members of the Board shall be elected through district-wide elections at each in a General Election for a term of two (2) years and in the manner described in §3111.1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, except for the

student member and non-voting members, unclassified and contracted employees of the Executive and Legislative Branches and all employees of the Guam Public School System are not eligible to run or serve. The candidates must be at least twenty-five (25) years old, an at least two (2) year resident of Guam, and a resident and domiciliary in that District the candidate will be representing for at least two (2) years immediately preceding the date on which the member takes office and continuing throughout the term. All candidates for the Board must be citizens of the United States of America.

- (b) One (1) Student Non-Voting Member. One (1) student member of the Board shall be elected by the Island-wide Board of Governing Students.
- (c) Appointed Non-Voting Member. The Board shall appoint one (1) non-voting member from a list of not less than three (3) nominees by the exclusive bargaining unit which represents teachers and other employees in the GPSS. The non-voting member shall serve a term of one (1) year.
- (d) Additional Non-voting members. The Board may add non-voting, ex-officio members as needed. The terms for such ex-officio members shall be determined by the Board.
- (e) Votes needed for Action. Unless expressly provided for elsewhere by public law, actions of the Board are carried by a vote of five (5) voting members.
- (f) Quorum A quorum for meetings of the Board shall consist of five (5) voting members.

3		"§3115. Same: Term of Office of Elected Members. The members of the
4		Board shall be elected by district at the next General Election or Special Election.
5		The terms of office of Board members elected pursuant to this Section shall
6		commence at 12:00 noon on the first Monday in January immediately following
7		the date they were elected and terminate at 11:59 a.m. on the first Monday in
8		January immediately following the date of the next General Election four years
9		hence, except as provided in §3111.1 of this Chapter."
10		Section 4. §3119 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is amended to
11	read:	
12		"§3119. Same: Officers of the Board. Officers of the Board shall include
13		the Chairperson and Vice- Chairperson, and such other positions which the
14		Board deems necessary to effectively carry out its responsibilities. Such Board
15		officers upon election shall serve for a term of one (1) year. Board officers shall be
16		elected by a majority vote of the members of the Board during one (1) of the
17		Board's meetings held in November January of each year. Members may serve
18		as Chairperson for multiple terms, except that no person may serve as
19		Chairperson for two (2) consecutive terms by succeeding oneself. "
20		Section 5. §3111.1 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is added to
21	read:	
22		"§3111.1 Provision for Staggered Elections. (a) Except as provided in
23		Subsection (b) of this §3111.1, each member of the Board shall be elected to
24		serve a term of four (4) years, commencing at 12 noon on the First (1st) Monday

in January following their election.

(b) At the election for members of the Board held at the General
Election in November 2008, and only at this election, five (5) candidates shall
each serve four (4) year terms, and four (4) candidates, one from each of the
four (4) districts, shall each serve two (2) year terms as follows:
1. Upon the Guam Election Commission's determination of the
nine (9) successful candidates, the successful candidate in each district
who received the lowest number of votes shall be certified to serve a
two (2) year term. The remaining successful candidates in each district
shall be certified to serve four (4) year terms."
