AN ACT TO ADD SECTION 43.10 (g) CHAPTER 43 OF TITLE 9 G.C.A., TO DEFINE "HIGH VALUE SALVAGE MATERIAL;" TO AMEND SECTION 43.50, CHAPTER 43 OF TITLE 9 G.C.A., TO REOUIRE PERSONS, ENTITIES OR CORPORATIONS **BUYING HIGH VALUE SALVAGE MATERIAL TO** MAINTAIN INDIVIDUAL **REPORTS**; A NEW SECTION 43.52, CHAPTER 43 OF TITLE 9 G.C.A., TO MAKE IT UNLAWFUL FOR PERSONS CONVICTED OF ROBBERY, THEFT OR BURGLARY WITHIN THE LAST THREE (3) YEARS TO SALE HIGH VALUE SALVAGE MATERIAL TO PERSONS, ENTITIES OR CORPORATIONS; TO AMEND SECTION 74101, CHAPTER 74, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 11 G.C.A, TO AMEND THE DEFINITION OF SCRAP DEALER; AN ACT TO AMEND 74103, CHAPTER 74, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 11 G.C.A. TO ADD HIGH VALUE SALVAGE MATERIAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. A new §43.10(g), Chapter 43 of Title 9 G.C.A. is hereby added

3 to read: "(g) High value salvage material shall mean any copper, bronze,

brass, and aluminum, whether scrap metal or recyclable metal, with the
exception of aluminum cans and tin cans."

Section 2. §43.50 (f), Chapter 43 of Title 9 of the Guam Code Annotated 3 is hereby amended to read: "(f) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a 4 substantial part of a business, buys and sells used items, including copper 5 wire high value salvage material and including any contractor who buys 6 copper wire high value salvage material in the course of conducting his or her 7 business, shall retain an individual report, of every transaction of high value 8 salvage material organized by the date and hour of transaction and shall be 9 maintained and kept on the premises for a minimum of one (1) year after the 10 last entry, a log book the report shall be kept in a form provided by the Guam 11 Police Department or in a form approved by the Guam Police Department of 12 all purchases of copper-wire high value salvage material from on-island 13 sources, indicating the nature of the items bought, the complete description of 14 weight and grade, the name, birth date, signature, fingerprint and address of 15 the seller, the price paid, the name and signature of the individual who 16 handled the transaction on behalf of the business purchasing and the date 17 18 and hour of purchase, and shall obtain and maintain a copy of each seller's identification documents, including, but not limited to, a valid, unexpired 19 government driver's license, or government identification card with 20 photograph issued by any state, territory or possession of the United States or 21 a valid, unexpired United States passport, and a copy of the registration 22 certificate of the vehicles used to transport the copper wire high value salvage 23

material and if applicable a copy of the seller's business license to sell high
value salvage material. The above records reports shall be made available to
law enforcement officers upon request.

(g) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial part of a 4 business, buys and sells used items, including copper wire high value salvage 5 material and including any contractor who buys copper wire high value 6 salvage material in the course of conducting his or her business, who 7 purchases said wire high value salvage material from persons who do not 8 have a business license for buying or selling copper wire high value salvage 9 material, shall keep such wire-high value salvage material for a period of 10 seven (7) days before altering, selling, melting, destroying, or otherwise 11 disposing of copper wire high value salvage material purchased on Guam. 12

(h) Any knowing violation of Subsections (c), (d) or (e) of § 43.50 of 13 Chapter 43 of Title 9 GCA shall be a misdemeanor upon the first conviction of 14 any such violation, and shall be a felony of the third degree for any 15 subsequent offense. Any violation of Subsections (f) or (g) shall be a felony of 16 the third degree. A third conviction of any such violation shall require 17 revocation of the offender's business license. Any person, corporation or 18 entity who, as a substantial part of a business, buys and sells used items, 19 including high value salvage material and including any contractor who buys 20 high value salvage material in the course of conducting his or her business, 21 who purchases said high value salvage material from persons who do not 22 have a business license for selling high value salvage material, shall 23 fingerprint the seller of the high value salvage material. The fingerprint shall 24

be taken from the seller's right index finger; if the right index finger is 1 missing, the fingerprint shall be taken from the left index finger of the seller 2 and said fingerprint shall be placed on the report. Each person, corporation or 3 entity shall display a notice to his patrons, in a prominent place, to the effect 4 that he is required by law to fingerprint every person selling any high value 5 scrap material to him who does not have a business license for selling high 6 salvage material. 7 (i) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial part of a 8 business, buys and sells used items, including high value salvage material and 9 including any contractor who buys high value salvage material in the course 10 of conducting his or her business, shall submit to the chief of police or his 11 duly authorized representative before 12:00 noon of every business day a true 12 copy of every individual report of high value salvage material transacted 13 during the preceding business day. 14 (j) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial part of a 15 business, buys and sells used items, including high value salvage material and 16 including any contractor who buys high value salvage material in the course 17 of conducting his or her business, shall not purchase high value salvage 18 material from any person who has engaged in more than three (3) transactions 19 within a calendar year to sell high value salvage material to any business 20 described in this subsection, unless the person has a business license to sale 21 high value salvage material. 22

1	(k) Any person, corporation or entity who, as a substantial part of a
2	business, buys and sells used items, including high value salvage material and
3	including any contractor who buys high value salvage material in the course
4	of conducting his or her business, shall not purchase high value salvage
5	material form any person under the age of eighteen (18) and any person who
6	appears under the influence of alcohol or controlled substance.
7	(l) Any knowing violation of Subsections (c), (d) or (e) of § 43.50 of
8	Chapter 43 of Title 9 GCA shall be a misdemeanor upon the first conviction of
9	any such violation, and shall be a felony of the third degree for any
10	subsequent offense. Any violation of Subsections (f), (g),(i) ,(j) or (k) shall be a
11	felony of the third degree and a fine not to exceed to one thousand dollars
12	(\$1000.00). A third conviction of any such violation shall require revocation of
13	the offender's business license."
14	Section 3. A new §43.50, Chapter 43 of Title 9 G.C.A. is hereby added to
15	read: "§43.52. Unlawful Sale of High Value Salvage Material by Person
16	Convicted of Robbery, Theft or Burglary. It shall be unlawful for any person
17	who has been convicted of robbery, theft or burglary in any state territory or
18	possession of the United States within the last three (3) years to sale any high
19	value salvage material to any person, corporation or entity who, as a
20	substantial part of a business, buys and sells used items, including high value
21	salvage material and including any contractor who buys high value salvage
22	material in the course of conducting his or her business. A violation of this
23	section shall be a felony of the third degree."

1	Section 4. §74101 of Chapter 74, Division 3, Title 11 G.C.A. is hereby
2	amended to read as follows: "§74101. Definition. As used in this Chapter, the
3	term scrap dealer means any person who is licensed to engage in the purchase
4	or the sale of metal, <u>high value salvage material as defined in §43.10(g)</u> ,
5	Chapter 43 of Title 9 G.C.A. other than precious metals, or other items that are
6	normally and generally defined as scrap, second-hand items or junk."
7	Section 5. §74103 of Chapter 74, Division 3, Title 11 G.C.A. is hereby
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§ 74103. Record. (a) Each scrap dealer shall keep a written record of
10	each purchase of scrap, junk, <u>high value salvage material as defined in</u>
11	§43.10(g), Chapter 43 of Title 9 G.C.A or other second-hand items.
12	(1) The record for all items except aluminum cans or tin cans or small
13	items not brought in a motor vehicle shall include:
14	(i) the name and signature of the seller with a valid identification;
15	and
16	(ii) the license number of the seller's vehicle.
17	(2) The record for aluminum cans or tin cans shall include the name and
18	signature of the seller.
19	(3) The record for high value salvage material as described in §43.50,
20	Chapter 43 of Title 9 G.C.A
21	(b) Every transaction shall be recorded and the record shall be made
22	available for inspection by law enforcement officers and agents of the
23	Department of Revenue and Taxation for up to one (1) year."
