AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §23108.1, §23108.2, §23108.3, AND §23108.4 TO CHAPTER 23 OF TITLE 5 AND ADD

A NEW SUBPARAGRAPH 13 TO \$10306 OF CHAPTER
10 OF TITLE 5 ALL OF GUAM CODE ANNOTATED

RELATIVE TO GOVERNMENT TRAVEL LAW.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guahan finds

3 that government sponsored and paid travel is often granted on a purely

discretionary basis which increases the cost of running the government

5 unnecessarily. It is the intention of the Legislature to implement reporting

6 requirements for government travel to require more accountability. I

7 Liheslatura also finds that it is critical for more scrutiny to ensure that

government paid travel is really necessary and that it is in line with good

public policy at all times.

I Liheslatura further finds that to ensure transparency and open

government, information on all authorized travel paid for by public funds

could and should be readily available to the people of Guam.

13 Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guahan to mandate that all

elected officials and officials occupying positions requiring Legislative

confirmation, traveling at government of Guam expense or paid trips by non-

- 1 government entities in their official capacity, report to the Speaker of I
- 2 Liheslatura an accounting of all travel related costs incurred. In addition to
- 3 submitting a report to the Legislature, information on the official's
- 4 government paid travel shall be posted on their respective websites.
- 5 Section 2. A new Section 23108.1 is hereby added to Chapter 23 of Title
- 6 5 Guam Code Annotated to read:
- 7 "§23108.1 Reporting to I Liheslatura. All elected officials and individuals
- 8 occupying positions requiring confirmation by the Legislature traveling at
- 9 government expense including federal funds and revenue funds generated by
- all government entities and agencies, travel paid by non-government entities
- 11 for the officials in their capacity as a government official, shall submit a report
- to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan no later than ten (10) days prior to
- 13 departure which shall include, but not be limited to:
- (1) Name and title of traveling government official;
- 15 (2) Nature and purpose of travel;
- 16 (3) Name of individual(s) and/or organization(s) official will be 17 meeting with;
- (4) Names of Individuals traveling with official;
- (5) Breakdown of all costs associated with government of Guam paid
 travel and source of funding;
- 21 (6) Transportation costs and source of funding;
- 22 (7) Departure date and return date; and
- 23 (8) Number of days for authorized per diem and total per diem 24 allowance and source of funding.

1	Any other government employee traveling with the individual shall also
2	submit a report with the same information enumerated above. In the
3	event that other costs are incurred using government funds associated
4	with the trip, a supplemental report should also be provided detailing
5	such expenditure to the Speaker of I Liheslatura no later than ten (10)
6	days after arrival."

- Section 3. A new Section 23108.2 is hereby added to Chapter 23 of Title
- 8 5 Guam Code Annotated to read:
- 9 "§23108.2. Provisions for Government Travel Forms. All government of
- 10 Guam travel forms shall have the following inserted:
- "Guam law requires that all approved travel for elected officials and
- 12 individuals confirmed by the Legislature paid with government funds
- 13 including federal funds and revenue funds generated by all government
- 14 entities and agencies, travel paid by non-government entities for the official in
- 15 his capacity as a government official shall be reported to I Liheslatura ten (10)
- days prior to departure. Failure to submit a report will be subject to a fine."
- 17 Section 4. A new Section 23108.3 is hereby added to Chapter 23 of
- 18 Title 5 Guam Code Annotated to read:
- "§23108.3. Penalty. Any public official who fails to submit a travel report to I
- 20 Liheslatura pursuant to 5 GCA §23108.1 shall be penalized as follows:
- (a) Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250) will be assessed for not submitting
 a report after the deadline
- 23 (b) Thereafter, Ten Dollars (\$10) will be assessed on a daily basis until a 24 report shall have been transmitted to *I Liheslatura*.

- All fines assessed and collected under this Section shall be deposited into the
- 2 Rainy Day Fund as established by 5GCA §22901"
- Section 5. A new Section 23108.4 is hereby added to Chapter 23 of Title
- 4 5 Guam Code Annotated to read:
- 5 "§23108.4. Individuals May File Claims for Non-compliance. Any person
- 6 may file with the Attorney General of Guam for the imposition of a fine
- 7 pursuant to 5GCA §23108.3 if there is reason to believe that a travel report
- 8 was not filed in a timely manner. The individual responsible for reporting
- 9 non-compliance by any public official shall be entitled to half of the assessed
- 10 fines."
- 11 Section 6. Rules and Procedures for Filing Claims for Non-
- 12 Compliance. The Attorney General of Guam shall establish rules and
- 13 procedures for individuals who wish to file a claim against any public
- 14 official's non-compliance of travel reporting as outlined in this Act. The
- 15 procedures shall also include but not be limited to payment arrangements for
- individuals entitled to half the assessed fees for their effort to ensure public
- officials are in compliance with government travel reporting requirements.
- Section 7. A new Subparagraph 13 is hereby added to §10306 of
- 19 Chapter 10 of Title 5 GCA to read:
- 20 "13. Elected officials and individuals confirmed by the Legislature
- 21 traveling on approved government paid travel or travel paid by non-
- 22 government entities for the official in his capacity as a government official,
- 23 shall provide information 10 (days) prior to departure including but not
- 24 limited to purpose of travel; breakdown of all costs associated with

- 1 government of Guam paid travel; transportation costs; departure date and
- 2 return date; and number of days for authorized per diem and total per diem
- 3 allowance."
- 4 Section 8. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective immediately
- 5 after it has been signed into law.
- 6 Section 9. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the
- 7 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such
- 8 invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act which
- 9 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this
- 10 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
