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AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 10 OF TITLE 12 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO **AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE** JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERICAL PORT TO ENTER INTO A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP THROUGH **A PERFORMANCE** MANAGEMENT CONTRACT FOR THE MANAGEMENT, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE PORT OF THE CARGO HANDLING EQUIPMENT AND/OR FACILITIES ASSOCIATED WITH SUCH EQUIPMENT AND/OR **OTHER ASPECTS OF THE PORT OPERATIONS.**

1	BE II ENACIED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUANI:
2	Section 1. A new Article 4 is hereby added to Chapter 10 of Title 12
3	of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:
4	"ARTICLE 4.
5	PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP THROUGH
6	A PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT CONTRACT
7	Section 10401. Public-Private Partnership Authorization through
8	a Performance Management Contract. The Board of Directors of the
9	Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port ("Port") is authorized to issue a
10	Request for Proposal ("RFP") soliciting bids or proposals from qualified
11	parties for the management, operation and maintenance of its cargo handling
12	equipment through a performance management contract, subject to the

procurement laws of Guam. The scope of work required through this RFP shall include the daily operation and maintenance of its cargo handling equipment; any repairs required, inclusive of all parts and labor; performance monitoring requirements; and preventive maintenance of all equipment and/or facilities directly associated with the equipment, including, but not limited to, the acquisition for replacement of such equipment.

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The RFP shall include performance standards that will provide 8 9 operating criteria, guidelines and requirements to minimize costly downtime and maximize cargo handling equipment availability and its life span. 10 Parties interested in submitting proposals shall have sixty (60) days to 11 prepare and submit a response to the Port. The Public Auditor shall be an 12 observer throughout the RFP process as specified in this Section, shall 13 receive copies of all documents involved and shall be invited to any 14 meetings regarding the public-private partnership process specified in this 15 16 Section.

17 The Port shall award a performance management contract subject to 18 the RFP detailed in this Section within ninety (90) days of the date of 19 issuance of the RFP; provided, that qualified offerors have submitted 20 proposals in compliance with the procurement laws of Guam and the 21 provisions of this Section.

Section 10402. Contract Limits. The awarded contract, which is subject to the provisions of this Act, may be awarded for periods of not less than five (5) years, with options to renew every five (5) years and not to exceed a total of twenty (20) years. The awarded contract, subject to the provisions of this Act, must contain performance reviews at least annually, and provisions for contract termination and penalty based upon such review.

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1 Section 10403. Conflicts. No contract awarded subject to the 2 provisions of this Act shall be awarded to any party who has a blood or 3 marital relationship to the third degree of consanguinity with the General 4 Manager of Port, a Board member of Port, *I Maga'lahen Guahan* or member 5 of *I Liheslaturan Guahan*.

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Other Public-Private Partnership through 6 Section 10404. 7 Management Contract. Notwithstanding Performance any other provisions of the law, the Board of Directors is authorized to enter into a 8 9 public-private partnership through a performance management contract for other aspects of the Port operations it deems necessary, provided that the 10 processes outlined in the above sections are complied with. 11

Section 10405. Termination of Contract for Reasons Unrelated to 12 **Performance.** Should at some point in the future, a determination be made 13 by I Liheslaturan Guahan, in law, that a broad-scale public-private 14 partnership for the Port operations be advisable, subject to legislative 15 approval, and if any agreements entered into pursuant to this Act are viewed 16 17 as impeding, such provisions may be included in each contract for the purchase of such contract, except that no contract shall be purchased in any 18 circumstance where a Contractor's performance has been deemed to be 19 unacceptable in accordance with the provisions of this Act. 20

Section 10406. Severability. If any provisions of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

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
