AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 16 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED CHAPTER 1 §§ 1102, 1103 AND 1104, AND TO ADD A NEW TITLE 16 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED ARTICLE 4 CHAPTER 3 § 3307.1, AND TO ADD A NEW TITLE 16 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED ARTICLE 4 CHAPTER 3 § 3308.1 TO §3308 RELATIVE TO THE en lo ELECTRIC PERSONAL ASSISTIVE MOBILITY DEVICE (EPAMD).

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM: 1

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 2 finds that personal travel device options are available in the marketplace 3 for the citizens of Guam, and to benefit of Guam's visitors. One such device 4 is the "Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device" (EPAMD). The EPAMD 5 is a self-balancing, two-wheeled device designed to transport only one 6 person, solely powered by an electric propulsion system, with a maximum 7 speed of twelve and a half miles per hour. 8

The (EPAMD) employs advances in technology and energy efficiency 9 to fully and safely integrate the user with pedestrian transportation, while 10 enabling individuals to travel farther and carry more without the use of 11

traditional vehicles. This can result in gains in productivity, minimize
 environmental impact, and facilitate better use of public spaces.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that Guam's motor vehicle code must include the Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device to address the use of this new technology for the community of Guam.

Section 2. In order to distinguish the Electric Personal Assistive
Mobility Device (EPAMD) from a bicycle, and a bicycle with a motor,
paragraphs (a), (s) and (oo) contained in Title 16 Guam Code Annotated
Chapter 1 § 1102, "Definitions," are hereby *amended* to read:

"(a) A *bicycle equipped with a motor* is a two (2) <u>tandem wheeled</u>
 <u>vehicle</u> or a three-wheeled vehicle equipped with a motor having a
 power rating not in excess of two (2) horsepower and is designed to
 travel on not more than three (3) wheels in contact with the ground."

"(s) A. *motor vehicle* is. a vehicle which is self-propelled
 excluding bicycle, [and] bicycle equipped with a motor, and electric
 personal assistive mobility device (EPAMD)."

"(oo) A *vehicle* is a device in, upon or by which any person or
property is or may be propelled, moved or drawn upon a highway,
except a device moved by human power or used exclusively upon
stationary rails or tracks <u>or an electric personal assistive mobility</u>
<u>device.</u>"

Section 3. Title 16 Guam Code Annotated Chapter 1 § 1103 is
 amended to read:

3	"§1103. Definition: Bicycle . A <i>bicycle</i> is a motorless contrivance
4	operated with <u>two tandem wheels but</u> not more than three (3) wheels
5	in contact with the ground and propelled by human power. "
6	Section 4. A new Subitem (a.1) is <i>added</i> to Title 16 Guam Code
7	Annotated Chapter 1 § 1104 to read:
8	"(a.1) An Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device (EPAMD) is a
9	self-balancing two non-tandem-wheeled device with an electric
10	propulsion system with an average of 750 watts (1 horsepower)
11	that limits the maximum speed of the device to 12.5 miles per
12	hour or less and that is designed to transport only one person at
13	a maximum speed of 12.5 miles per hour. An Electric Personal
14	Assistive Mobility Device (EPAMD) shall have a maximimum
15	footprint of 33 inches in width by 26.5 inches in length by 50
16	inches high and shall weigh no greater than 150 pounds."
17	Section 5. A new § 3307.1, is hereby added to Title 16 Guam Code
18	Annotated Article 4 Chapter 3 to read:
19	<u>"§ 3307.1 Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Device:</u>
20	Riding on Sidewalks, Roadways and Bicycle Paths.

1	(a) Electric Personal Assistive Mobility Devices (EPAMD)
2	shall be allowed to operate on and use safety zones, bicycle
3	paths, and sidewalks. An Operator of an Electric Personal
4	Assistive Mobility Device (EPAMD) shall exercise due care to
5	avoid colliding with, and shall yield the right-of-way to,
6	persons traveling on foot and those utilizing mobility aids.
7	(b) Only if safety zones, bicycle paths, and sidewalks are
8	not available, or if available sidewalks are not Americans with
9	Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant, shall EPAMDs be allowed to
10	use Guam's roadways where the posted speed limit is 25 miles
11	per hour or less.

1	(d) An operator of an EPAMD shall be no less than 16
2	years of age with one exception: Operators may be twelve to
3	fifteen years old if accompanied and supervised by an adult
4	who is at least eighteen years old. Operators under sixteen
5	years of age are required to wear a Consumer Products Safety
6	Commission approved bicycle helmet.
7	(e) EPAMD tour operators shall limit tour customers to a
8	maximum speed of 8 mph while operating within Tumon Bay
9	as defined in paragraph C, Section 3701, Title 16, Guam Code
10	Annotated.
11	(f) An EPAMD operator shall give an audible signal
12	before overtaking and passing any pedestrian.
13	(g) An EPAMD shall be equipped with reflectors and a
14	headlamp when operating between one-half hour after sunset
15	and one-half hour before sunrise.
16	(h) Any person violating any part of this Section 3307.1 is
17	guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be
18	punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars
19	<u>(\$100.00)."</u>
20	Section 6. A new § 3308.1 is added to Title 16 Guam Code
21	Annotated Article 4, Chapter 3 to read:

1 "§ 3308.1 Operation of EPAMD.

2 <u>While operated on any highway, an EPAMD shall be</u> 3 <u>considered a vehicle for all purposes of highway traffic operation</u> 4 <u>regulations and control as set forth in this Code."</u>

5 Section 7. Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application 6 to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the invalidity shall *not* affect 7 other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect 8 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 9 of this Act are severable.
