AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 11 TO CHAPTER 12 OF PART I OF TITLE 10 OF THE **GUAM** CODE ANNOTATED TO **ADD** SAFEGUARDS TO DUE PROCESS IN HEARINGS REGARDING REMOVAL OF LICENSURE FOR PERSONS PRACTICING THE HEALING ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new Article 11 is added to Chapter 12 of Part 1 of Title 2
- 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read: 3
- "Article 11 4
- Due Process Protection for Persons Practicing the Healing Arts. 5

§ 121101. Policy. It is the policy of the government of Guam that due process be protected in hearings which may result in the suspension or removal of licenses already granted to individuals licensed on Guam to practice the healing arts according to the provisions of this Chapter 12. Notwithstanding any other law, rule, or regulation, the processes for hearing complaints or grievances against any individual practicing the healing arts which may result in the suspension or removal of licenses already granted shall be in accordance with the provisions of this Article 11.

§ 121102. Establishment of lists for panels to hear complaints or grievances. The Boards of each of the healing arts in this Chapter 12 shall establish a list of persons licensed in good standing in each of the respective healing arts who are available to participate on a panel to hear complaints or grievances against individuals in the respective healing arts which may result in suspension or removal of licenses already granted pursuant to this Chapter. The lists shall be representative of the membership of each healing art and shall contain, if possible, at least Ten (10) persons. These lists shall be open to the scrutiny of any member of the healing arts.

§ 121103. Establishment of panels to hear complaints or grievances. Immediately after receiving a complaint or grievance by a respective board of a healing art, the respective board shall chose a panel of Three (3) members from that healing art's listing. The panel members shall be chosen randomly from the list. The panel so chosen shall hear the complaint or grievance for which the panel is chosen. Each complaint or grievance received shall result in choosing a new panel.

§ 121104. Conflicts of Interest. No person shall be seated on a panel to hear any particular complaint or grievance if that person has a conflict of interest with the individual against whom the complaint or grievance is being heard. Conflicts of interest include but are not limited by the following:

- The panel member is in any supervisory position to the person subject to the hearing, including being a board member of an organization or in a supervisory position of an organization in which the person subject to the hearing is employed.
- 10 (b) The panel member is involved in the generation of the complaint or grievance.
 - (c) The panel member has a financial interest in the outcome of the subject matter of the complaint or grievance.
 - (d) The panel member has any other conflict of interest which would render the hearing biased.
 - § 121105. Timely hearing of motions. All motions filed on behalf of either party prior to the hearing on the complaint or grievance shall be heard and ruled upon by each panel in a timely fashion so that there is at least One (1) week between the ruling on the last motion filed and the hearing on the merits of the complaint or grievance by the panel. This serves the ends of due process so that any hearing on the merits is well prepared and all witnesses and documents are available at the outset of the hearing.
 - § 121106. Notice of complaint or grievance must be set out with specificity. Any complaint or grievance against an individual practicing

the healing arts for which the suspension or removal of licensure of a license already granted under Chapter 12 of this Title shall set out with specificity the facts underlying the complaint or grievance. The facts shall be accompanied by relevant documents, if applicable. A statement of the facts shall be specific with regard to the facts occurring and with respect to their applicability to the violation constituting the complaint or grievance. The complaint or grievance, as specifically set out, and with accompanying documents, shall be served upon the person against whom the complaint or grievance is lodged within Ten (10) days of receipt of the complaint or grievance.

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§ 121107. Ex parte communication. No ex parte communication shall take place between a complainant or grievant, or a party presenting evidence of a complaint or grievance before a panel, and the members of the panel, or the list from which the panel is drawn, during the pendency of the proceeding and until a decision is rendered concerning suspension or removal of a license to practice the healing art. Board action on the decision of a panel. Any board of § 121108. a healing art shall receive the final decision of a panel after the hearing on a complaint or grievance and shall serve the panel decision on the party against whom the complaint or grievance was made. A board may authorize a rehearing of the complaint or grievance by a new panel if the board determines that due process was violated in the hearing of the complaint or grievance, but otherwise shall approve the decision. An authorization for new hearing or approval of decision shall take place within Fifteen (15) days of receipt of the panel decision. A notice of an

authorization of rehearing, or an approval of the decision, shall be 1 2 served within Ten (10) days on the party against whom a complaint or grievance was lodged. 3 § 121109. Appeal of decision of a panel. An appeal of a decision 4 for rehearing or approval of a panel decision by a board shall be taken in 5 accordance with the laws of Guam for a decision of a board of a healing 6 art." 7
