AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS RELATIVE TO THE AIR AMBULANCE SERVICE TRUST ACCOUNT PROVISIONS MANDATED BY PUBLIC LAWS 28-150 AND 29-19, MAKING FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR THE MEDICALLY INDIGENT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Mina' Bente NuebiNa 3 Liheslaturån Guåhan finds the need to allow the use of funding available for the 4 5 Medically Indigent Program (MIP). I Liheslatura further finds that the monies deposited in the Air Ambulance Service Trust Account from the fiscal year 2007 6 7

- appropriation has not been expended or encumbered to date. Therefore, it is the
- intent of I Liheslatura to allow for the funds in the Air Ambulance Service Trust 8
- Account to be used for MIP payments. 9
- Section 2. Section 33, Chapter V of Public Law 28-150 is amended to 10
- read: 11

"Section 33. Air Ambulance Service Trust Account. 'One Million 1 Dollars (\$1,000,000) of the Fiscal Year 2007 appropriation to the Medically 2 3 Indigent Program Fund shall be deposited into a separate trust account and shall be used exclusively for the cost of authorized air ambulance services. Allotments to 4 5 the Medically Indigent Program must be made simultaneously with a proportional allotment to the Air Ambulance Service Trust Account, and vice versa. The Air 6 Ambulance Service Trust Account shall remain available for prompt vendor 7 payment until expended and shall not be pledged as collateral, reprogrammed or 8 transferred for any other use. Amounts in the Air Ambulance Service Trust 9 Account shall be disbursed *only* to transport qualified MIP patients whose 10 prognosis for survival and recovery, as determined and certified by the attending 11 physician, requires immediate medical services not available on island, but which 12 13 may be reasonably acquired, with the assistance of air ambulance services, at the nearest JCAHO or Joint Commission Accredited medical facility. At the end of the 14 fiscal year, any unexpended or unencumbered balance in the Air Ambulance 15 Service Trust Account, shall be transferred into the Medically Indigent Program 16 Payment Revolving Fund (MIPPR) for the Medically Indigent Program (MIP) and 17 the amounts transferred shall be used exclusively for the payment of MIP 18 obligations. Payments shall be prioritized by the most aged obligations initially 19 adjudicated. The amounts transferred pursuant to this section shall remain 20 available until fully expended and is restricted from any transfer authority 21 authorized by Public Laws 28-150, 29-02 and 29-19." 22

Section 3. Section 25, Chapter VI of Public Law 29-19 is amended to read:

"Section 25. Air Ambulance Service Trust Account. One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) of the Fiscal Year 2008 appropriation to the Medically Indigent Program Fund *shall* be deposited and held in a separate trust account to be

used exclusively to pay for authorized air ambulance service's. Allotments to the 1 2 Medically Indigent Program shall be made simultaneously with a proportional 3 allotment to the Air Ambulance Service Trust Account, and vice versa. The Air Ambulance Service Trust Account shall not lapse and shall be available for vendor 4 payment until it is exhausted and shall not be pledged as collateral, reprogrammed 5 or transferred for any other use. Said Trust Account funds shall be disbursed only 6 to transport qualified MIP patients whose prognosis for survival and recovery, as 7 certified by an attending physician, requires immediate medical services not 8 9 available on Guam, but that are readily available at the nearest JCAHO or Joint Commission Accredited medical facility. At the end of the fiscal year, any 10 unexpended or unencumbered balance in the Air Ambulance Service Trust 11 Account, shall be transferred into the Medically Indigent Program Payment 12 13 Revolving Fund (MIPPR) for the Medically Indigent Program (MIP) and the amounts transferred shall be used exclusively for the payment of MIP obligations. 14 Payments shall be prioritized by the most aged obligations initially adjudicated. 15 The amounts transferred pursuant to this section shall remain available until fully 16 expended and is restricted from any transfer authority authorized by Public Laws 17 18 28-150, 29-02 and 29-19."
