A NEW §63132 IS ADDED TO TITLE 5 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED CHAPTER 63 RELATIVE TO INDIGENOUS FISHING RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that prior to the arrival of the Spanish, the Chamorro people subsisted priffarily on fishing, both within and outside the reef. The Spanish discriminated against the Chamorro people by prohibiting fishing outside the reef as well as placing various restrictions on off-shore fishing inside the reef, forcing the Chamorro people to become farmers rather than fishermen.

The American Naval administration continued policies which hampered 8 the free exercise of traditional fishing practices of the Chamorro people. In spite 9 of this historical discrimination, Chamorros were able to maintain their traditions 10 and skills for off-shore fishing inside the reefs. Now, those traditions and skills 11 are in danger of being lost in the face of modern conservation restrictions and the 12 pressures of population growth caused by the influx of non-Chamorro peoples 13 into Guam that have increasingly made the indigenous Chamorros a minority in 14 their own homeland. 15

1	In 1977 the people of Guam elected representatives to a Constitutional
2	Convention which included special fishing rights for the Chamorro people in the
3	draft constitution of Guam that was approved on December 15, 1977.
4	The draft Guam Constitution contained the following section:
5	"Article XI Chamorro Culture, Section 2 Economic Development.
6	To redress past discrimination and provide equal opportunity for the
7	Chamorro people, special rights for Chamorros to off-shore fishing and
8	harvesting of resources may be provided by law."
9	The draft Constitution of Guam, containing this provision, was approved
10	by the U.S. Congress.
11	It is therefore the intent of I Liheslatura to establish the special rights for
12	Chamorros to off-shore fishing and harvesting of resources as approved by the
13	U.S. Congress.
14	Section 2. A new §63132 is added to Title 5 Guam Code Annotated
15	Chapter 63 to read:
16	"§63132 Indigenous Fishing Rights.
17	The policy of the Government of Guam is that the Chamorro people
18	shall have special rights to off-shore fishing and harvesting of resources in
19	order to redress historical discriminatory policies. The Department of
20	Agriculture is hereby tasked to develop rules and regulations to put this
21	policy into effect and submit the draft rules and regulations, in accordance
22	with the Administrative Adjudication Act (AAA), Title 5 Guam Code

Annotated Chapter 9, to the Legislature for review and approval. Such
 rules and regulations may be revisited annually for revision through the
 AAA process."

Section 3. Submission and enactment. The Department of Agriculture
shall submit draft rules and regulations for consideration by the AAA process
within ninety (90) days of enactment of this act into law.
