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AN ACT TO *ADD* SECTION 3333 TO ARTICLE 3,  
CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE  
ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO RESTRICTING  
ENTRY INTO GUAM FOR INDIVIDUALS  
TRAVELLING FROM JURISDICTIONS DEEMED BY  
THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND/OR  
THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION AS  
HAVING A HEALTH-RELATED OUTBREAK.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1.** Section 3333 is hereby *added* to Article 3, Chapter 3 of Title 10 of  
3 the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

4 **“Section 3333. Restricting entry into Guam.** (a) Upon declaration  
5 by the United States Centers for Disease Control and/or the World Health  
6 Organization that a health-related epidemic or outbreak has taken place in a  
7 jurisdiction, *I Maga’lahen Guahan*, with the advice from the Director of Public  
8 Health and Social Services, shall, through Executive Order, declare a public  
9 health emergency and restrict entry into Guam those individuals who have been  
10 in the affected jurisdiction for more than one week and do not possess a  
11 recognized and certified document that attests that they have been tested for the  
12 specific disease and determined not to be infected. The date of the test must not  
13 be more than one week from the date of their entry into Guam.

1           (b) Any individual who enters into Guam without the proper  
2 documentation shall be quarantined pursuant to this Section and §§19604 and  
3 19605, of Article 6, Chapter 19 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated.

4           (c) Any and all costs associated with the quarantine and/or treatment  
5 of individuals who unlawfully enter Guam pursuant to this Act will be the  
6 responsibility of the individual and the carrier that the individual contracted to  
7 travel to Guam with.

8           (d) Once the entry restriction is imposed, it will remain in effect until *I*  
9 *Maga'lahaen Guahan*, with the advice from the Director of Public Health and  
10 Social Services, issues a written order rescinding the Executive Order.”
