AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 80104(c) AND TO REPEAL AND REENACT SECTION 80107.1 ALL OF CHAPTER 80 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. The Hospital's procurement 3 process involves purchasing goods and services necessary for the provision of 4 healthcare services. Some of these purchasing activities for goods and services 5 include "Sole Source" procurements that allows the Authority to benefit from federally negotiated prices or direct purchases from the manufacturer or through 6 7 authorized distributors. Presently the Hospital is required to have sole source 8 procurement documents also signed by the Board Chair. This can lead to delays in 9 procuring these critically needed items and also requires the Chair to participate in 10 routine operational activities. There are clearly defined and documented guidelines to determine eligibility for "sole source" designation. 11

The Hospital has been attempting to recruit for a Chief Financial Officer since the departure of the previous incumbent. The Hospital has placed the recruitment

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- announcements on its website as well as the on employment websites with national
- 2 distribution. Since these announcements, there have been no less than five (5)
- 3 applicants including interested off-island individuals. Unfortunately, none of these
- 4 applicants have been determined to be eligible for interview because of the
- 5 requirement mandating lengthy work experience.

- **Section 2.** §80104(c) of Chapter 80 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
 - "(c) Acquire, subject to the laws of Guam, by grant, purchase, gift, devise or lease, and hold and use any real property necessary or convenient or useful for the carrying on of any of its powers pursuant to the provisions of this Article; upon written certification of the Administrator, countersigned by the Chairman of the Board, that specified and specialized medical equipment and related supplies are needed immediately for the health and welfare of the patients of the Hospital in particular, and the people of Guam in general, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority shall be exempt from the provisions of §§5210 and 5211 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, in the acquisition of the medical equipment and related supplies specified in such written certification of the Administrator; provided, that the Hospital shall use its best judgment and efforts to secure the best equipment and supplies at the lowest cost, utilizing businesses licensed to do business on Guam whenever possible."
- **Section 3.** §80107.1. of Chapter 80 of Title 10 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *repealed* and *reenacted* to read as follows:
 - "Section 80107.1. Chief Financial Officer. (a) The position of Chief Financial Officer is established within the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority. The Chief Financial Officer shall meet the following minimum qualifications:
 - (i) Possession of a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) certificate in the United States and a Bachelor's degree in Health Services

Management (HSM) or health related work experience, plus one (1) year supervisory experience; or

- (ii) Graduation from a recognized college or university with a Master's degree in accounting, finance, economics, business administration or a related field, plus four (4) years experience as an administrator for general accounting and fiscal services of which one (1) year must be management-level fiscal experience in a hospital or health related work experience; or
- (iii) Graduation from a recognized college or university with a Bachelor's degree in accounting finance, economics, business administration or a related field, plus five (5) years as an administrator responsible for general accounting and fiscal services of which two (2) years must be management-level fiscal experience in a hospital or health related work experience; and
- (iv) shall have experience in negotiating contracts with external parties, including third party payers, vendors, insurance carriers and other contracting parties."

Section 4. Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
