AN ACT TO IMPOSE Α TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON THE ISSUANCE OF NEW AND EXTENSION OF **EXPIRING** QUALIFYING CERTIFICATES; AND TO ADD A NEW §58148 TO CHAPTER 58, DIVISION 2 OF TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO CREATING A **OUALIFYING** CERTIFICATE ASSESSMENT WORKGROUP.

## **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guahan* finds that the Qualifying Certificate program administered by the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority is intended to attract new investments and the incubation of new industries in Guam through the granting of certain tax rebates and tax abatements. It is further intended to create new economic development within the island and to expand and diversify our economic base.

A Qualifying Certificate allows tax abatements for a period up to ten (10) years applied to real property tax and an abatement of up to twenty years (20) for gross receipts tax depending on the eligible business activity engaged in as set forth in Chapter 58 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated.

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I Liheslatura also finds that it was never the original intention of the 1 program to re-issue Qualifying Certificates for existing, mature, and 2 established recipients, thereby allowing the Beneficiary to once again claim 3 exemption from having to pay certain taxes. It has become the rule rather than 4 the exception. Therefore, the process and criteria for the granting of 5 Qualifying Certificates must be re-evaluated to ensure that the initial intent of 6 7 bestowing economic incentives to investors in return for extending greater opportunities for the community-at-large is not being corrupted. 8

9 It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to impose a temporary 10 moratorium suspending the issuance of new Qualifying Certificates, 11 prohibiting the modification of existing Qualifying Certificates and granting 12 the extension of Qualifying Certificates.

13 It is further the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* to create a Qualifying 14 Certificate Assessment Workgroup to evaluate the effectiveness of the 15 Qualifying Certificate Program and to submit recommendations.

Section 2. Temporary Moratorium on Issuance of New and Extension
 of Expiring Qualifying Certificates. There shall hereby be a temporary
 moratorium placed on the issuance of new, extension and renewal of expiring
 Qualifying Certificates. The modification of all Qualifying Certificates is also
 prohibited.

Section 3. A new Section 58148 is hereby added to Chapter 58, Division
22 of Title 12 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

23 "§58148. (a) Establishment of the Qualifying Certificate Assessment
 24 Workgroup. There is hereby established a Qualifying Certificate Assessment

1 Workgroup which shall conduct a cost and benefits analysis on the 2 effectiveness of Qualifying Certificates issued in the Territory and to 3 formulate a permanent restructuring plan relative to the future of the 4 Qualifying Certificate program. The Workgroup shall issue, no later than six 5 (6) months from its initial meeting, a written report to the Speaker of *I* 6 *Liheslaturan Guahan* and *I Maga'lahen Guahan* which shall include, but not be 7 limited to:

- 8 (1) Analysis of the criteria used to grant qualifying certificate 9 and the effectiveness of the program as currently 10 administered by the Guam Economic Development and 11 Commerce Authority;
- 12 (2) Quantification of revenues from tax rebates and tax
  13 abatements that are deferred by the government with the
  14 granting of the abatements and rebates;
- 15(3)Quantification of the economic benefits derived by the16granting of Qualifying Certificates by recipients;
- 17 (4) Historical analysis of extending expired Qualifying
  18 Certificates;
- 19(5)Breakdown on Beneficiaries engaged in different industry20activities availing themselves of Qualifying Certificates;
- 21 (6) Strategies to increase investor relations without relying
  22 solely on the Qualifying Certificate program;
- 23 (7) Formulation of a plan to restructure the Qualifying
  24 Certificate program that allows for investor opportunities,

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but allows for greater benefits for our people and at the same
 time takes into consideration the tax abatement and tax
 rebate period;

- 4 (8) Effectiveness of the monitoring and compliance system
  5 currently in place and recommendations for changes;
- 6 (9) Recommendations in draft bill form for consideration by the
  7 Legislature to amend or repeal the existing statutes
  8 governing the Qualifying Certificate Program.

9 The Workgroup may invite government, private sector, 10 community entities and individuals to submit reports, provide 11 testimony, data and other information that may assist the 12 Workgroup to comply with its duties and responsibilities. The 13 committee is authorized to create sub-committees as needed.

(b) Composition of the Qualifying Certificate Assessment Workgroup. The
Workgroup shall be composed of seven (7) members as follows:

16 (1) The Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guahan* or his/her designee;

17 (2) The Administrator of the Guam Economic Development and18 Commerce Authority;

19 (3) The Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation or20 his/her designee;

21 (4) The Director of the Department of Administration or his/her22 designee;

23 (5) The Attorney General of Guam or his/her designee;

24 (6) A representative from the private business community who shall

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possess a degree in economics, finance or business related field appointed by 1 the Governor; and 2

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A representative from the Guam Small Business Development (7)4 Center appointed by the Governor.

The Chairperson of the Workgroup shall be the Administrator of the 5 Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority. The Vice 6 Chairperson shall be elected by the Workgroup at its first meeting. 7 All Workgroup meetings shall be open to the public as mandated by 5GCA, 8 Chapter 8, Section 8107. If the Governor fails to appoint members as 9 specified above within 30 days of enactment, the Speaker of I Liheslatura shall 10 make the appointment. 11

(c) Term and Vacancy of Qualifying Certificate Assessment Workgroup. 12 The Workgroup shall be formed and meet no later than forty-five (45) days 13 after the enactment of this Act. The members of the Workgroup shall serve 14 for the duration of its existence. Any vacancy shall be filled in the same 15 manner as the original appointment or selection, but only for the balance of 16 17 the term. The Workgroup members shall serve without compensation. The Workgroup shall be terminated upon the acceptance of its report by the 18 Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guahan and I Maga'lahen Guahan or 180 days after its 19 first meeting, if the first meeting is held within the 45 days after enactment of 20 this Act, otherwise the Workgroup shall terminate 250 days after enactment. 21

(d) Support Services. All government of Guam agencies and offices shall 22 assist the Workgroup in the performance of its duties and provide the 23 Workgroup with appropriate studies, data and other information as 24

1 requested."

Section 4. Effective Date. Section 2 of this Act shall become effective immediately after it has been signed into law. It shall remain in effect until such time the Workgroup submits its request and recommendations to *I Liheslatura* and *I Maga'Lahi* and is enacted into law. If no recommendations are enacted by *I Liheslatura* and signed into law by *I Maga'Lahi*, the moratorium shall be lifted on the granting of new Qualifying Certificates.

8 Section 5. Severability. If any of the provisions of this Act or the 9 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such 10 invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act which 11 can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this 12 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
