AN ACT RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A FINANCING MECHANISM FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF A PERMANENT HEADQUARTERS AND ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDING FACILTY FOR THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT; THROUGH AMENDING §77134 OF CHAPTER 77, ARTICLE 1, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

**Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** 

The Liheslaturan Guahan finds that the Guam Police Department 3 is confronted with a restricted timeline to identify a building facility 4 for the conduct of its headquarters and administrative office 5 operations due to an impending termination of its existing lease 6 arrangement with the Antonio B. Won Pat Guam International 7 Airport Authority. This situation highlights the need for the Guam 8 Police Department to apply its effort and resources on the 9 identification, construction, purchase or lease-to-own of a permanent 10 facility for the operations of the Department. Thus, it is critical that 11 the government of Guam aggressively pursue options available and 12

within its means to ensure that the Guam Police Department realize a
 permanent headquarters and administrative office building facility
 within the foreseeable near future.

The *Liheslaturan Guahan* further finds that the "Public Safety Facilities Construction Initiative Act of 2005" was enacted more than five (5) years ago, which primarily set forth the framework for establishing an arrangement on the construction or acquisition of a building facility that would be sufficient to accommodate the permanent facility needs of the pertinent public safety agency; but it lacked the identification and dedication of a financing mechanism to allow the respective government of Guam entity to aggressively proceed with the planning and eventual realization of its permanent headquarters and administrative office facilities.

Therefore, it is the intent of the *Liheslaturan Guahan* to work collectively with the Guam Police Department to realize a permanent home for the agency. This provision would identify and dedicate the funding mechanism necessary to initiate the financing and eventual construction of a permanent headquarters and administrative office building complex for one of Guam's premiere public safety agencies. The construction of a permanent headquarters and administrative facility would result in annualized cost-savings associated with existing lease payment obligations, and would ensure that the people of Guam and the government of Guam would benefit from the

- Section 2. Dedication of Revenues Generated through the
- 4 "Police Services Fund" for the Financing and Construction of a
- 5 Permanent Headquarters and Administrative Building Complex for
- 6 the Guam Police Department.
- 7 §77134 of Chapter 77, Article 1, Title 10, Guam Code
- 8 Annotated, relative to the Guam Police Department is hereby
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 **"§ 77134. Fees.**
- 11 (a) The Chief of Police may prescribe in accordance with the
- 12 Administrative Adjudication Law fees to be charged and collected by
- the Department that are directly related to the need of the agency to
- 14 recover administrative costs in servicing the public. These fees shall
- be deposited in a special account known as the Police Services Fund
- 16 (hereafter referred to as the "Fund"), established separate and apart
- 17 from the General Fund to be administered by the Director of
- 18 Administration for the benefit of the Guam Police Department. All
- 19 proceeds from the Police Services Fund shall heretofore be
- 20 continuously appropriated annually to the Guam Police Department
- 21 <u>for the primary purpose of financing the annualized debt or lease</u>
- 22 payments required for the effective and timely implementation of the
- 23 Public Safety Facilities Construction Initiative Act of 2005 (Chapter

- 59, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated), as applicable to the Guam Police
- 2 Department. Funds generated and accumulated in excess of the
- 3 aforementioned annualized debt service or lease payments from the
- 4 Fund shall be subject to appropriation by the *Liheslaturan Guahan* The
- 5 Guam Legislature shall make appropriations from the Police Services
- 6 Fund for the purpose of funding the general operational needs of the
- 7 Guam Police Department on a fiscal year basis. These funds, once
- 8 appropriated to the Department, are not subject to the transfer
- 9 authority of the Governor.
- 10 (b) As used in this Subsection, administrative costs in servicing
- the public means costs incurred in providing administrative services,
- such as issuing licenses or permits, providing police clearances for
- 13 private parties and taking finger prints, but does not include
- 14 performing essential crime prevention and law enforcement duties
- described in Section 77103 of this Chapter."

## Section 3. Effective Date.

- 17 The funding set aside provision for the Police Services Fund
- 18 contained herein shall be effective Ninety (90) days from the
- 19 enactment of this Act.

- 20 Any Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Guam Police
- Department in the adoption or adjustment of fees and charges to be
- 22 deposited into the Police Services Fund as a result of provisions

- 1 contained herein shall be effective upon the date specified per
- 2 existing statutory mandate.
- 3 **Section 4. Severability.**
- 4 If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or
- 5 circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity
- 6 shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can
- 7 be given effect without the invalid provisions application, and to this
- 8 end the provisions of this Act are severable.
