AN ACT TO AMEND § 3102.1 OF TITLE 17 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE DUTIES OF THE GUAM EDUCATION BOARD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. § 3102.1 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 4 "3102.1. Duties of the Guam Education Board. The Guam Education
- 5 Board shall have general supervision over the Department of Education
- 6 (hereinafter 'Department') and the control and direction of all funds of, and
- 7 appropriated to, the Department subject to such restrictions as may be
- 8 prescribed by law. The Board shall submit an annual budget to I Liheslatura
- 9 in the manner prescribed by law. The Board shall have the authority to
- delegate such of its powers as it may deem appropriate, but shall retain the
- ultimate responsibility for the exercise of its powers. The Board, among other

1	duties, shall perform the following in accordance with applicable law:
2	(a) select and appoint a Superintendent and support him/her in the discharge
3	of his/her duties;
4	(b) receive, evaluate and act upon the recommendations and reports of the
5	Superintendent;
6	(c) adopt an annual budget and control expenditures accordingly; review
7	periodic financial reports and modify the budget if and when necessary;
8	(d) adopt attendance areas and school boundaries;
9	(e) sue and/or defend itself in suits at law;
10	(f) report routine complaints and concerns related to the department's
11	operations; directly to the Superintendent for appropriate investigation and response;
12	(g) have no business or pecuniary interest which will conflict with the
13	activities of the Board;
14	(h) establish student discipline policy;
15	(i) establish a school calendar;
16	(j) establish graduation standards;
17	(k) periodically review established policies for refinement and improvement;
18	(1) serve as Guam's State Education Policy/Governing Board for Federal
19	programs where such a board is required by Federal Law to include, but not be limited
20	to, the Head Start Program.
21	(m) act as the approving authority on behalf of the department for collective
22	bargaining agreements;
23	(n) make recommendations to I Maga'lahen Guåhan or I Liheslaturan
24	Guåhan for changes, additions or deletions to Guam Education Laws;
25	(o) each newly elected or appointed board member shall complete during the
26	first year of the member's first term a training program to be prepared and offered by
27	the University of Guam and the department, regarding the skills and knowledge

1	necessary to serve as a local school board member. The training program shall
2	include:
3	(1) review of the Guam Code Annotated and other laws pertaining to DOE;
4	(2) Roberts Rules of Order;
5	(3) the budgeting procedures and guidelines of the government of Guam and
6	the department; and
7	(4) difference(s) between policy making and micromanagement of the affairs
8	of the department; and
9	(p) the role of the Board, as with any legislative body, is to act collectively, not
10	individually. Any Board member shall report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan any potential
11	or alleged violation of this subsection. The Board shall not:
12	(1) interfere in or micro-manage the affairs of the department or schools
13	within the department; and
14	(2) involve itself with student discipline cases, unless expressly authorized by
15	public law, and only to the extent authorized by public law."
