AN ACT TO *ADD* SUBSECTION Q TO §50110, CHAPTER 50 OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROHIBITED ACTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that, under Public Law 29-26, it has adopted a comprehensive Guam Pesticides Act intended to provide safeguards against contamination of Guam's groundwater and surface water, and against loss of biodiversity and incidence of immunological effects, cancers and other serious health effects. Thereafter, Public Law 30- 197 was passed to approve the Regulations to implement the Guam Pesticide Act. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the Regulations have had the unintended consequence of creating discriminatory adverse economic impact on certain products, not based on the product which are not deceptive or intended to deceive the consumer.

These are products which the regulations specifically find "are not considered to be pesticides unless pesticidal clam is made on their labeling or in connection with their sale and distribution", being more specifically "deodorizers, bleaches, and cleaning agents". *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that distinction is one of form and not substance and that the Guam Pesticides Act should not have adverse economic impact

on one product and not another simply because of nondeceptive claims made about the product.

Therefore, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* desires to exempt such products from certain requirements of the Guam Pesticides Act, and regulations, regarding the importation, licensing, handling and record keeping of such products.

Section 2. Subsection q is hereby *added* to §50110 of Chapter 50 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:

"(q) The provisions of §50107 of this Chapter, (relative to Licensing, Importation and Sale of Restricted Use Pesticides, Certification and Record Keeping) and of §§50112 and 50114 (relative to Notice of Arrival of Pesticides and Devices and Shipments Arriving without Notice of Arrival) *shall not* apply to any person to the extent such person may imp0ort, distribute, sell, *or* offer for sale in Guam any product not considered to be a pesticide but for a pesticidal claim made on the labeling or in connection with the sale of distribution of the product."
