AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §4129 TO CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO EMPLOYEE LEAVE FOR PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT IN SCHOOL ACTIVITIES WHICH MAY BE CITED AS THE 'INVEST IN GOOD PARENTING ACT'.

## 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

**Section 1. Title.** This Act shall be known as the "Invest in Good 2 3 Parenting Act." Section 2. A new §4129 is hereby added to Chapter 4 of Title 4 of the 4 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows: 5 "§ 4129 Parental Involvement in School Activities Leave. (a) Any 6 employee of the Government of Guam shall be granted administrative 7 leave for the purpose of participating in activities of the school or 8 9 childcare facility in which such employee's children are enrolled. The amount of administrative leave shall be as follows: 10 (1) Two (2) hours of administrative leave for attending 11 parent-teacher conferences or any other meetings with 12 school or childcare officials; 13

14	(2) Two (2) hours of administrative leave for attending
15	school or childcare facility programs, competition, or
16	other school activity;
17	(3)Up to Four (4) hours of administrative leave for
18	chaperoning school field trips;
19	(4) Additional leave may be granted in the event that a
20	school administrator determines that more time is
21	necessary for meetings on behavioral or academic
22	issues.
23	(b) The approving authority may require from the employee up
24	to five (5) days notice of the date of the school activity except for
25	urgent meetings requested by the school administrator.
26	(c) The employee shall provide certification of the dates and
27	times of any meetings or school field trips from the school or
28	childcare facility. The employee shall provide copies of activity
29	notices or announcements for any other school activity.
30	(d) This provision shall apply to employees who are the parents
31	or legal guardians of minor children or adult children with disabilities,
32	and who is not otherwise prohibited from such contact with his or her
33	child by order of a court."
