AN ACT TO ADD A NEW §77113.1 TO §77113 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 77, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO REQUIRING THAT NO PERSON BE APPOINTED TO THE RANKS OF POLICE SERGEANT AND POLICE LIEUTENANT WHO FAILS TO PASS A PHYSICAL AGILITY TEST AND WRITTEN EXAMINATION RELATIVE TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES, INCLUDING SPECIAL NEEDS AND MENTAL ILLNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the nature of work performed by Guam Police Department

4 ("GPD") officers involves a level of physical stress incomparable to

5 occupations outside military, law enforcement and public safety services. I

6 Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that other than the physical agility test new

police officers are required to pass, there are no policies within GPD that

require individuals appointed to the ranks of Police Sergeant and Police

Lieutenant to sustain such physical standards.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that working hours beyond the traditional eight-(8-) hour schedule to ensure a safe community, and having to deal with potential threats to their safety, are examples of what Police Officers are confronted with every day. With a limited police force responsible for preserving peace and order for Guam's growing community.

I Liheslatura finds it critical that Police Officers maintain good physical 1 health for their personal benefit and for the good of the community they are

sworn to protect. 3

It is therefore the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to add a new 4 §77113.1 to §77113 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam Code 5 This new section would require that no person shall be Annotated. 6 appointed to the ranks of Police Sergeant and Police Lieutenant without first 7 passing a physical examination, which shall include a physical agility test. I 8 Liheslatura also intends to include within this new section a requirement that 9 no person be appointed to the aforementioned ranks without first 10 establishing satisfactory evidence, through written examination, the ability 11 to recognize and understand persons with disabilities, including special 12 needs and mental illness. 13

Section 2. Selection of Applicants. A new §77113.1 is hereby added to §77113 of Article 1, Chapter 77, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§77113. Department; Appointment; Examination and Selection of Applicants.

The Chief of Police shall appoint a police force consisting of commissioned officers, non-commissioned officers and police officers who are, in the judgment of the Chief of Police, necessary to the performance of the duties of the Department. The Chief of Police shall, in accordance with the laws of the Territory, arrange for the examination and selection of applicants, and to establish ranks and grades.

§77113.1. Selection of Individuals Applying for Police Sergeant and Police Lieutenant.

Notwithstanding other provisions of law, no person shall be 1 appointed to the ranks of Police Sergeant and Police Lieutenant who 2 does not meet the following qualifications: 3 (a) pass a physical examination, which shall include a physical 4 agility test, and written examinations based upon standards 5 relevant to the duties to be performed, which standards shall be 6 established by the Chief of Police; 7 (b) establish satisfactory evidence, through written examination 8 administered by the Department of Administration ("DOA") or 9 a competent authority, of the ability to recognize and 10 understand persons with disabilities, including special needs 11 and mental illness. DOA shall include a minimum of two (2) 12 items within the written examination relative to persons with 13 disabilities, including special needs and mental illness. For the 14 purpose of this section, the term disability(ies), as is defined in 15 the Americans with Disabilities Act, shall mean a physical or 16 mental impairment that substantially limits one (1) or more 17 major life activities of an individual; and 18 (c) other necessary special qualifications as established by the 19 Department of Administration not inconsistent with §77113 and 20 §77113.1 of this Chapter." 21 22 Section 3. Effective Date. The provisions contained herein shall be effective within ninety (90) days following enactment. The Guam Police 23 Department, in coordination with the Department of Mental Health and 24 Substance Abuse and the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals 25 26 with Disabilities, shall recommend examination materials to DOA for consideration prior to the implementation of this Act. 27

- 1 Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its
- 2 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary
- 3 to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this
- 4 Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application,
- 5 and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
