AN ACT TO AMEND §66103 OF CHAPTER 66, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO THE CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER POLICE RESERVE, TO NEW §66103.1 TO **SAID CHAPTER** ADD RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING THE "ACCESSIBLE PARKING AND LAW ENFORCEMENT FUND", AND TO AMEND §3401.1(e) OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ACCESSIBLE PARKING FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan 2 finds that the Accessible Parking Fund ("Fund"), established as the Disabled 3 Parking Fund in 1985 through P.L. 18-28, was originally used to pay for the

- installation and maintenance of accessible parking spaces at government of 5
- the Director of the Department of Public Works, was also used to cover 7

Guam buildings. The *Disabled Parking Fund*, administered at the time by

- costs for the installation of appropriate parking signs and for the fabrication 8
- of removable windshield placards for registered users. 9
- 10 I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that in 1995 through P.L. 23-11, the Disabled Parking Fund was renamed to its current nomenclature and the 11 Governor's Commission on Persons with Disabilities was assigned the 12 responsibility of maintaining such fund. Proceeds of the Fund were 13

designated for use in an aggressive media campaign to help educate the public about the human aspects of parking in an accessible parking space and its impact on persons with disabilities.

In 1997 through P.L. 24-16 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further amended the Fund's enabling statute, 5GCA §50111(c), and assigned the Department of Integrated Services for Individuals with Disabilities with the responsibility of maintaining fund proceeds. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* also mandated that the Fund be used to cover costs associated with monitoring compliance of accessible parking laws.

Nearly a decade later P.L. 28-130, through recommendations made in the Office of the Public Auditor's Report No. 06-03 dated April 2006, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* repealed 5GCA §50111(c) which effectively closed what was reported to be an inactive fund account of the government of Guam. P.L. 28-130 also appropriated Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from a balance of Five Thousand, Five Hundred Sixty Six Dollars (\$5,566.00) to the Guam Police Department (GPD) for the purpose of training volunteers who would assist with the enforcement of accessible parking laws. The remaining balance was to be transferred into the General Fund.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan, through information recently received from the Chief of Police, finds that the Accessible Parking Fund was not closed and that fines and fees continue to be deposited into the Fund. As of the latter part of August 2011, the Fund has a balance of approximately Two Hundred Fifty Thousand, Two Hundred Seventy Six Dollars and Eighty Eight Cents (\$250,276.88). Based on this information the Chief of Police has requested the assistance of the Chairman of the Committee on Public Safety, Law Enforcement and Judiciary by introducing legislation that

- would authorize GPD to use proceeds from the Fund for the Civilian
- 2 Volunteer Police Reserve (CVPR) and Community Assisted Policing Effort
- 3 (CAPE) programs. Funds would be used to pay for equipment, supplies, and
- 4 training activities for reservists and volunteers assigned to these units.
- 5 Police Reservists and CAPE volunteers continue to assist regular full-time
- 6 officers with the enforcement of accessible parking and other public safety
- 7 and law enforcement mandates.

- I Liheslaturan Guåhan also finds that the Chief of Police has requested that such legislation authorize GPD to extend the use of Fund proceeds to pay for similar requirements of the agency's operations bureau, including repairs to highway patrol vehicles, acquisition of police equipment and supplies, and for other purposes aimed at strengthening GPD's ability to enforce accessible parking and other public safety and law enforcement
 - It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to re-establish the Accessible Parking Fund and to specifically designate such Fund within Chapter 66 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated relative to the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve program. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends for GPD to maintain the use of the Fund and ensure that proceeds are used to assist with the enforcement of accessible parking and other public safety and law enforcement mandates toward the preservation of law and order.
- Section 2. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records;

 Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund. Section 66103 is hereby

 amended and a new Section 66103.1 is hereby added, both of Chapter 66,

 Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, to read:
 - "66103. Training, Equipping and Maintenance of Records.

The Chief of Police shall devise a program whereby the police and fire divisions of the Guam Police Department, and the Civil Defense Office, provide the members of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve training in crime and fire prevention control, law enforcement and operational techniques and procedures for natural and man-made emergencies. The Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve shall maintain a roster of volunteers who have received the training prescribed herein. In order to maintain membership in the Reserve, each member must keep up with his scheduled training and no volunteer may remain in the Reserve if he or she is unable to keep up with or otherwise absorb the training. Additionally, basic supplies and equipment shall be provided to assure a constant and operability of the Civilian Volunteer Police Reserve, including a continuing program for replacement.

§66103.1. Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund.

There is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam, a fund to be known as the "Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund". Fines collected pursuant to §3401.1 of Article 4, Chapter 3, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated shall be deposited into this Fund.

This Fund shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other fund of the government of Guam. The Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund shall not be transferred by I Maga'låhen Guåhan nor borrowed against.

Proceeds of this Fund *shall* be used exclusively for the purpose of enforcing the public's compliance with accessible parking and other public safety and law enforcement mandates toward the preservation of law and order. The Chief of Police *shall* determine

appropriate use of the Fund's proceeds, which *shall* be limited to the purchase of equipment and supplies, training of active and volunteer personnel, and other purposes he or she deems critical to strengthening the work of the agency's Civilian Volunteer Police and Community Assisted Policing Effort programs.

The Chief of Police shall account for and administer the Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund, and shall prepare and submit to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* monthly reports reflecting all transactions and other information summarizing the financial condition of this Fund."

Section 3. Accessible Parking for Persons with Disabilities. §3401.1(e) of Article 4, Chapter 3, Title 16, Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"(e) A violation of Subsections (b), (c), or (d) of this Section is punishable by a fine of *no less than* Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and *no more than* Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). A violation of Subsections (b)(1) or (c) of this Section, or of Title 16 GCA Chapter 3, or \$3401(d) by any individual(s) qualifying as a disabled person, as defined within Title 16 GCA \$7120.1(a)(2), may have citation(s) dismissed upon the presentation of a special license plate or a removable windshield placard obtained pursuant to \$7120.1 of Title 16, GCA before the Court. The Courts may, at its discretion and by direction, create a methodology and system that authorizes the administrative support services of the Courts to certify the presentation of a placard by a person with a disability for the purposes of dismissal in order to forgo the need of a personal court appearance, and that such methodology and system strongly consider the potential

for abuse. All fines imposed hereunder by the Court *shall* be deposited into the Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund, maintained by the Guam Police Department pursuant to Title 510 GCA §50111(e)66103.1. Additionally, any vehicle(s) illegally parked pursuant to this Subsection, may be towed; and the owner of such vehicle(s) will be liable for reasonable towing expenses, which *shall* constitute a lien against the offending vehicle."

Section 4. References made to the "Accessible Parking Fund".

References made in the Guam Code Annotated relative to the "Accessible Parking Fund" shall be replaced with the "Accessible Parking and Law Enforcement Fund".

Section 5. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
