## AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2013, MAKING OTHER APPROPRIATIONS, AND ESTABLISHING MISCELLANEOUS AND ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

#### **CHAPTER I**

#### **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

4 Section 1. Short Title. This Act *shall* be known as the *"General* 5 Appropriations Act of 2013". Except as otherwise provided by this Act, the 6 appropriations made by this Act identifying Fiscal Year 2013 shall be available to pay for 7 obligations incurred on or after October 1, 2012 but no later than September 30, 2013. If 8 any appropriation in this Act is found contrary to federal law, all other portions of this 9 Act *shall* remain valid.

10 Section 2. Estimated Revenues for Fiscal Year 2013. *I Liheslaturan* 11 *Guåhan*, the Guam Legislature, adopts the following revenue estimates for Fiscal Year 12 2013 as the basis for the appropriations contained in this Act. 1 I. GENERAL FUND REVENUES

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#### **CHAPTER II**

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#### **APPROPRIATIONS FOR EXECUTIVE BRANCH OPERATIONS**

3 Section 1. Executive Branch Appropriations for Fiscal Year 2013. Five Hundred Twenty-six Million Six Hundred Seven Thousand Six Hundred Thirty-six 4 Dollars (\$526,607,636) are appropriated for the operations of the Executive Branch for 5 fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. This sum is composed of Four Hundred Eighteen 6 Million Eight Hundred Seventy-three Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-nine Dollars 7 8 (\$418,873,749) from the General Fund; Seventy-one Million One Hundred Sixty-one 9 Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-one Dollars (\$71,161,681) from Special Funds; and 10 Thirty-six Million Five Hundred Seventy-two Thousand Two Hundred Six Dollars 11 (\$36,572,206) from Federal Matching Grants-in-Aid. The appropriation shall be 12 expended as follows:

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#### **CHAPTER III**

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#### **MISCELLANEOUS APPROPRIATIONS**

3 Section 1. Appropriations to the University of Guam. Notwithstanding any 4 other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Four Million Three Hundred One 5 Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty-three Dollars (\$4,301,783) is appropriated from the 6 General Fund and the sum of Three Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars(\$340,000) is 7 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the University of Guam for the following 8 purposes:

9 (a) Student Scholarships, Financial Assistance Programs and Program 10 Administration. Such appropriation in this Section is for: Merit Awards, Student Loans, 11 Nurse Training Programs, Professional and Technical Awards, Reserve Officer Training 12 Corps (ROTC), Regent Scholarships, Marine Lab Graduate Assistance Programs, Early 13 High School Admission Programs, Pedro "Doc" Sanchez Scholarship Programs, John F. 14 Quan Memorial Scholarship Program and the administration of all student financial 15 assistance programs. The President of the University of Guam shall allocate this 16 appropriation in order to fund said student scholarships, financial assistance programs 17 and program administration.

(b) Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps. Such appropriation in this
Section is for the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps. The President of the
University of Guam *shall* disburse, pursuant to the directives and policies of the Educator
Corps Council, stipends for the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps and funds for
the administration of said program pursuant to Chapter 18 of Title 17 of the Guam Code
Annotated and §15107, Chapter 15 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated, as *amended*.

The President of the University of Guam *shall* post on the University of Guam's website
 all reports mandated by this Act regarding the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps.

3 (c) Aquaculture Development and Training Center. Such appropriation in
4 this Section is for the purpose of funding the continued operations of the Aquaculture
5 Development and Training Center.

(d) WERI's Guam Hydrologic Survey. Such appropriation in this Section is
for the purpose of funding the Guam Hydrologic Survey (GHS) administered by the
Water and Environmental Research Institute of the Western Pacific (WERI). WERI *shall*continue to administer the GHS for those purposes previously established by Guam law.

10 (e) WERI's Comprehensive Water Resource Monitoring Program. Such 11 appropriation in this Section is to fund the Water and Environmental Research Institute of 12 the Western Pacific (WERI). Such funds *shall* be used for the purpose of matching the 13 Federal funding for the Comprehensive Water Resource Monitoring Program. WERI 14 *shall* continue to administer the Comprehensive Water Resource Monitoring Program for 15 those purposes previously established by Guam law.

(f) Northern and Southern Soil and Water Conservation District
Program. Such appropriation in this Section is for operations and activities of the
Northern and Southern Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) Program and *shall*be equally divided between the Northern and Southern Soil Conservation Districts.
Expenditures from this appropriation *shall* be made upon the approval of the District
Directors, with the consent of the SWCD Board and *shall not* require further approval by
the University of Guam *or* any other government entity.

1 (g) KPRG (Public Radio). Such appropriation in this Section is for KPRG 2 (Public Radio) operations. The President of the University of Guam shall disburse the 3 funds to KPRG. No later than thirty (30) days after the close of each fiscal quarter of Fiscal Year 2013, the General Manager of KPRG shall submit to the President of the 4 5 University of Guam, and post on KPRG's website, all reports mandated by this Act.

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(h) Guampedia Foundation. Such appropriation in this Section is for the 7 operations of the Guampedia Foundation.

(i) 8 Rhinoceros Beetle Program. Such appropriation in this Section is for the 9 operations of the Rhinoceros Beetle Program.

10 Section 2. Appropriation to UOG for the Guam Cancer Trust Fund. For 11 Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of One Million Eight Hundred Twenty-two Thousand Forty-12 eight Dollars (\$1,822,048) is appropriated from the Healthy Futures Fund to the 13 University of Guam for the administration of the Guam Cancer Trust Fund, pursuant to 14 §26603(d)(2) of Article 6, Chapter 26 of Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated. This 15 appropriation shall be used to fund cancer screening, treatment, and support services for 16 qualified applicants.

17 Section 3. University of Guam Capital Improvements Fund Continuing Appropriation. The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) is appropriated 18 19 from the Guam Highway Fund to the University of Guam Capital Improvements Fund for 20 the purpose of paying for the debt services pursuant to §16132, Chapter 16 of Title 17, 21 Guam Code Annotated.

22 Appropriation Community College. Section 4. to the Guam Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Seven 23

Hundred Five Thousand Fifty-eight Dollars (\$705,058) is appropriated from the General Fund, the sum of Twenty-four Thousand One Hundred Fifty-four Dollars(\$24,154) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund, and the sum of One Million Six Hundred Eighty-eight Thousand Four Hundred Forty-eight Dollars (\$1,688,448) is appropriated from the Manpower Development Fund to the Guam Community College for the following training programs

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 (a) Licensed Practical Nursing and Vocational Guidance Programs. Such appropriation in this Section is to support the operations of the Licensed Practical Nursing Program and Vocational Guidance Program.

(b) Lodging Management Program/Pro Start. Such appropriation in this
 Section is for the Lodging Management Program/ProStart Program.

12 (c) Apprenticeship Program. Such appropriation in this Section is for the 13 Guam Community College Apprenticeship Program. In addition to the authorization 14 continued in §7120, Chapter 7 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated, the appropriation 15 herein shall be available and authorized to be used by the Guam Community College to 16 fund the operations of other programs at the College, as approved by the Board and 17 Administration of the College.

18 Section 5. Appropriation to the Guam Department of Education for 19 Education Programs. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 20 2013, the sum of Three Hundred Eighty-one Thousand One Hundred Twenty Dollars 21 (\$381,120) is appropriated from the General Fund and the sum of Eight Hundred Ninety-22 one Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-four Dollars (\$891,754) is appropriated from the

Healthy Futures Fund to the Guam Department of Education for the following education
 programs:

3 (a) *Chamoru* Studies. Such appropriation in this Section to the *Chamoru* 4 Studies Division administered by the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) is to be 5 expended for personnel salaries and benefits, contractual services, supplies and materials, 6 and equipment for the support and the implementation of the Content Standards and 7 Performance Indicators of the course syllabi for the emphasis of fluency and for the 8 promotion of the proficiency skills in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and 9 writing in the *Chamoru* language.

10 (b) Interscholastic Sports Fund. Such appropriation in this Section to the 11 Interscholastic Sports Fund administered by the Guam Department of Education is to be 12 expended pursuant to § 7108 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated. Appropriations 13 made herein *shall* be available to fund the Outrigger Canoe, Rugby, and other sports 14 programs, to include the payment of head coaches, assistant coaches, league fees, busing 15 services, and other expenses normally associated with a sport interscholastic program.

(c) Health and Physical Education Activities. Such Appropriation in this
Section to GDOE is for the Guam Department of Education for Health and Physical
Education programs, intramural sports, and similar activities,

19 Section 6. Guam Department of Education Textbooks and Collateral 20 Materials. The following are appropriations to the Guam Department of Education 21 (GDOE) for the purchase of textbooks, e-book readers and collateral materials, to include 22 software, sheet music and music books, in accordance with the following terms and 23 conditions:

(a) For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand
Dollars (\$1,500,000) is appropriated from the General Fund from Fiscal Year 2014
revenues to the GDOE for the purchase of textbooks, e-book readers and related
classroom instructional materials, to include software, sheet music and music books. The
Superintendent of GDOE may, *if* necessary, through agreements with textbook vendors,
defer payment for said materials until after October 1, 2013, but *no later than* December
31, 2013, with the full faith and credit of the Government of Guam.

8 **(b)** The Superintendent of GDOE shall order materials funded by this Section 9 no later than March 1, 2013 for Fiscal Year 2014. The Bureau of Budget and 10 Management Research *shall* release such allotments as are necessary to ensure that said 11 materials are ordered by March 1, 2013. The Superintendent of GDOE shall receive said 12 materials and distribute them to schools no later than thirty (30) days before the start of 13 the school calendar established pursuant to §4111 of Title 17 of the Guam Code 14 Annotated. All funds appropriated for said materials shall not be used for any other 15 purpose.

16 (c) On the first (1<sup>st</sup>) day of each quarter of Fiscal Year 2013, the 17 Superintendent of GDOE *shall* provide to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I* 18 *Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and post on the GDOE website, a detailed report regarding all 19 receipts and expenditures for textbooks, e-book readers and collateral classroom 20 instructional materials, to include software, sheet music and music books. Said report 21 *shall* be accompanied by the certified list of textbooks approved by the Guam Education 22 Board (GEB) and all purchase orders issued. The report *shall* summarize:

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(1) purchases by allotment account number, unit cost and the total cost of books charged against an appropriation account, the vendor, quantity, title, copyright date and International Standard Book Number (ISBN) of books ordered, the allocation of such books by school and grade, whether books are for teachers or students, and whether books are textbooks or e-books; and

6 (2) other information that may be useful *or* that is requested by *I* 7 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* regarding the funds appropriated and authorized herein. 8 Non-compliance with these reporting requirements by the Superintendent of 9 GDOE *shall* result in the sanctions and penalties imposed by this Act.

10 Section 7. Summer School Fund. From the Summer School Fund 11 established pursuant to §6119 of Article 1, Chapter 6, Division 1 of Title 17 of the Guam 12 Code Annotated, such sums as are necessary to fund the operations of the Fiscal Year 13 2013 Summer School Programs are appropriated to the Guam Department of Education. 14 The Superintendent of Education shall submit a detailed report to I Maga'lahen Guåhan 15 and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* regarding the receipt and expenditure of said 16 funds no later than thirty (30) days after the close of summer school and post the same on 17 the Guam Department of Education website. Such report shall include the following:

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(1) Total revenues received, including identification of each revenue source;

(2)

Total expenditures and encumbrance by object classification and by school; and

(3) The fund balance.

Section 8. Tiyan Lease Maintenance and Insurance Agreement. For
Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of One Million Five Hundred Sixty-eighty Thousand Dollars

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(\$1,568,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Department of
 Education for the payment of the Tiyan Lease Maintenance and Insurance agreement.

3 Section 9. Appropriation to the Guam Department of Education for GPA 4 Promissory Note. The sum of One Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,600,000) 5 is appropriated from the Territorial Education Facilities Fund to the Guam Department of 6 Education (GDOE) to pay Guam Power Authority (GPA) for the Guam Department of 7 Education Promissory Note (the agreement between the GDOE and the Guam Power 8 Authority signed on July 20, 2004, and referred to as the "installation payment agreement 9 for past due electrical service") for Fiscal Year 2013.

10 Section 10. Appropriation to the Department of Mental Health and 11 Substance Abuse. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the 12 sum of Eight Hundred Eighty-nine Thousand Forty Dollars (\$889,040) is appropriated 13 from the General Fund to the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse for the 14 following programs:

(a) Detoxification, Rehabilitation and Prevention Services. Such
Appropriation in this Section is for outsourcing of drug and alcohol detoxification,
rehabilitation, and prevention services, *provided* that the expenditure of such funds shall
comply with §1421b (p) of Title 48 of the United States Code.

(b) Oasis Empowerment Center for Women Alcohol Substance and
 Homeless Program. Such appropriation in this Section is for the Oasis Empowerment
 Center for Women Alcohol Substance and Homeless Program.

Section 11. Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse for the
 Amended Permanent Injunction and Plan of Action. Pursuant to Court Order No. CV

1 01-0041 CBM, the sum of One Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars 2 (**\$1,250,000**) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Mental 3 Health and Substance Abuse for the payment of court ordered deposits that are due in 4 Fiscal Year 2013 in accordance with the modified funding schedule, for the 5 implementation of the Amended Permanent Injunction and Plan of Action.

6 Section 12. Guam Cancer Registry. Pursuant to §22603(d)(4), Article 6, 7 Chapter 26 of Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of 8 One Hundred Twenty-one Thousand Four Hundred Seventy Dollars (**\$121,470**) is 9 appropriated from the Healthy Futures Fund to the Department of Public Health and 10 Social Services (DPHSS) to maintain the Guam Cancer Registry pursuant to §3201.1, 11 Article 2, Chapter 3 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated.

12 Section 13. Appropriations to the Guam Environmental Protection 13 Agency. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of 14 Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) is appropriated as follows:

(a) Beach Monitoring. The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars
(\$100,000) is appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Guam Environmental
Protection Agency for the *sole* purpose of beach monitoring. This appropriation is *not*subject to transfer or use for any other purpose.

(b) Landfill Costs. The sum of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000)
is appropriated from the Solid Waste Operations Fund to the Guam Environmental
Protection Agency for costs in the closure, monitoring and opening of the island's
landfills.

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Section 14. Appropriations to the Department of Parks and Recreation.
 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Seven
 Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Three Hundred Seventy-seven Dollars (\$749,377) is
 appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Department of Parks and Recreation
 (DPR) for the following programs:

6 (a) Maintenance and Repair of Public Restrooms. Such appropriation in 7 this Section is for the maintenance and repair of restroom facilities in public parks island-8 wide. *No later than* thirty (30) days after the end of every fiscal quarter, the Director of 9 DPR *shall* submit a quarterly report of the expenditures from this appropriation to the 10 Public Auditor and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and post the same on DPR's 11 website.

(b) Maintenance of Pool Facilities. Such appropriation in this Section is for the maintenance of pool facilities for Fiscal Year 2013. These funds *shall* be used for the northern pool and the *Hagatña* pool. *No later than* thirty (30) days after the end of every fiscal quarter, the Director of DPR *shall* submit a quarterly report of the expenditures from this appropriation to the Public Auditor and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and post the same on DPR's website.

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#### Section 15. Retirees' Supplemental Annuity Benefits and Other Costs.

(a) The sum of Eleven Million Six Hundred Ninety-six Thousand Three
Hundred Three Dollars (\$11,696,303) is appropriated from the General Fund to the
Supplemental Annuity Benefits Special Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, for direct payments to
government of Guam retirees who retired *prior* to October 1, 1995, or their survivors, for
the continuing payment of Four Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$4,238)

per year in supplemental annuity benefits, consisting of the sums of One Thousand Two
 Hundred Dollars (\$1,200), One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500), Seven
 Hundred Dollars (\$700), and Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$838) in annual
 benefits authorized by various General Appropriation Acts.

5 (b) *No* retiree who is eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits 6 provided for in Subsection (a) hereof *shall* receive said Benefits *if* his annual retirement 7 annuity, *excluding* survivor benefits and excluding the Supplemental benefits authorized 8 herein, is *greater than* Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000). No retiree who is eligible for 9 Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits *shall* receive *more than* the sum of Forty 10 Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) in combined retirement annuities and Supplemental Annuity 11 Benefits in any one Fiscal Year.

12 (c) The Director of Administration *shall* disburse to the retirees *or* their 13 survivors, the supplemental annuity benefits provided for in Subsection (a) of this 14 Section. The Government of Guam Retirement Fund *shall* provide the Director of 15 Administration with the information he needs to effect disbursement.

(d) Funds held in the Supplemental Annuity Benefits Special Fund *shall not*be commingled with the General Fund *or* any other fund, *shall* be held in a separate bank
account that *shall* continue to be administered by the Director of Administration and *shall not* be subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority.

(e) For Fiscal Year 2013, the Guam Power Authority, the A.B. Won Pat
International Airport Authority, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam
Housing Corporation, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, the Jose D. Leon
Guerrero Commercial Port, the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Visitors

Bureau shall remit to DOA an amount equal to the number of retirees eligible pursuant to
 Subsection (a) hereof who have retired from that entity multiplied by Four Thousand
 Two Hundred Thirty-Eight Dollars (\$4,238). Prior to DOA's remittance to the Guam
 Retirement Fund, said remittances shall be paid from the entities listed above, to DOA on
 or before October 10, 2012. Said remittances shall not be subject to I Maga'låhen
 Guåhan's transfer authority.

7 (f) The sum of Twenty-four Million Four Hundred Twenty-two Thousand Six 8 Hundred Sixty-eight Dollars (**\$24,422,668**) is appropriated from the General Fund to the 9 Government of Guam Retirement Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, to pay the following two 10 (2) items for current retirees:

11 (1) Retiree group health, dental and life insurance premiums (to
12 continue existing programs currently contained in the semi-monthly payments);
13 and

14 (2) Retiree life insurance subsidy (to continue existing programs
15 currently contained in the semi-monthly payments).

16 For Fiscal Year 2013, the Guam Power Authority, the A.B. Won Pat (g) 17 International Airport Authority, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam 18 Housing Corporation, the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, the Jose D. Leon 19 Guerrero Commercial Port, the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Visitors 20 Bureau shall remit to the GGRF payments for medical, dental, and life insurance 21 payments for retirees who have retired from those respective agencies. Prior to DOA's 22 remittance to the Guam Retirement Fund, said remittances shall be paid from the entities 23 listed above, to DOA on or before October 10, 2012. The agencies' remittances for

medical, dental and life insurance mandated herein are ex gratia payments, and are for
 Fiscal Year 2013 only.

(h) The sum of One Million Nineteen Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy
Dollars (\$1,019,970) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of Guam
Retirement Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, to pay the cost of Medicare premiums for
Government of Guam retirees and their survivors who are eligible to receive Social
Security income benefits and who are required by the government of Guam Group Health
Insurance Program to pay said premiums to participate therein.

9 (i) The sum of Two Hundred Forty-two Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-five 10 Dollars (**\$242,845**) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of Guam 11 Retirement Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, for *I Maga'lahi* and *I Segundu na Maga'lahi/I* 12 Segundu na Maga'haga Pensions.

(j) The sum of Four Hundred Eighty-seven Thousand One Hundred Fifty
Dollars (\$487,150) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Government of Guam
Retirement Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, for retirement annuities for former judges and
justices of the Superior Court and Supreme Court of Guam.

17 (k) The Government of Guam Retirement Fund Board of Trustees *shall* enact 18 and, *if* necessary, amend administrative regulations that establish procedures to ensure the 19 proper submission, receipt and accounting of all sums remitted pursuant to Subsections 20 (e) and (g) hereof.

# 21 Section 16. Survivor Supplemental Annuity Additions. §8135(d) (6) of 22 Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:

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"(6) the prospective payment of supplemental benefits for the period of
 [October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2012] October 1, 2012, through
 September 30, 2013 for Fiscal Year 2013 for survivors of those employees who
 retired *prior* to October 1, 1995, to be paid in the following manner:

(i) Four Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$4,238.00) in
Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits, known as the sum of One Thousand Two
Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00), One Thousand five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00),
Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00), and Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars
(\$838.00) in annual benefits formerly contained in various General Appropriation
Acts.

11 (ii) No person eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits 12 provided for in this Section shall receive such benefits if his regular annual 13 retirement annuity exclusive of the supplemental amounts authorized hereby 14 exceeds Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). No persons eligible for Retiree 15 Supplemental Annuity Benefits shall receive more than the sum of Forty 16 Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) in combined retirement annuities and 17 supplemental retirement annuities."

18 Section 17. Disability Supplemental Annuity Additions. §8129(g) of Title 4
19 of the Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:

"(g) Any disability retirement annuitant who commenced receiving a disability
retirement annuity *prior* to October 1, 1995, and who is entitled to disability
retirement benefits under this Chapter *shall* receive, during the period
commencing on [October 1, 2011, and ending on September 30, 2012] October 1,

9 (2) *No* persons eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits 10 provided for in Paragraph (g) of this Section *shall* receive such benefit *if* their 11 regular annual retirement annuity, *excluding* survivor benefits, *prior* to the 12 supplemental amounts herein exceeds Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). No 13 persons eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits shall receive more 14 than the sum of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) in combined retirement 15 annuities and supplemental retirement annuities."

16 Section 18. Retirees Supplemental Annuity Additions. §8122(d) (6) of Title
17 4 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"(6) Any retirement annuitant who commenced receiving a retirement annuity
 *prior* to October 1, 1995, and who is entitled to retirement benefits under this
 Chapter, shall receive, during the period commencing on [October 1, 2011, and
 ending on September 30, 2012] October 1, 2012, and ending on September 30,
 2013 for Fiscal Year 2013, prospective, non-cumulative supplemental annuity
 benefits as follows:

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(i) Four Thousand Two Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars (\$4,238.00) in
 Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits, known as the sum of One Thousand Two
 Hundred Dollars (\$1,200.00), One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00),
 Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00), and Eight Hundred Thirty-eight Dollars
 (\$838.00) in annual benefits formerly contained in various General Appropriation
 Acts.

7 *(ii)* No retiree who is eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity 8 Benefits provided for in this Section *shall* receive such benefit *if* his regular 9 annual retirement annuity, excluding the supplemental amounts authorized herein 10 and survivor benefits, exceeds Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00). A retiree 11 who is eligible for Retiree Supplemental Annuity Benefits shall receive no more 12 than Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) in combined retirement annuities and 13 supplemental retirement annuities."

14 Section 19. **Residential Treatment Fund.** The sum of One Million Two 15 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,200,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the 16 Department of Administration (DOA) to pay the expenses of persons under the 17 jurisdiction of the Superior Court of Guam who require residential care because of 18 physical, mental or emotional disabilities or severe emotional disturbances for Fiscal 19 Year 2013. All such persons and their escorts referred off Guam for treatment and care 20 shall submit to the Director of DOA appropriate documentation to justify and receive 21 reimbursement of their travel expenses. The Director of DOA shall submit reports to I 22 Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan describing all

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 end of each quarter of Fiscal Year 2013 and post the same on the DOA website.

3 Section 20. Government Claims Fund. The sum of One Hundred Thousand 4 Dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 5 Administration (DOA) for the Government Claims Fund for payment of approved 6 government claims in Fiscal Year 2013. The Director of DOA shall, no later than thirty 7 (30) days after the close of each quarter of Fiscal Year 2013, submit to the Speaker of I8 Liheslaturan Guåhan, in a Microsoft Excel file and written report describing 9 expenditures made pursuant to the appropriations herein, and post the same on the 10 Department's website.

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## Section 21. Government of Guam's Single Audit Reports.

12 (a) For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Three Hundred Seventy-seven Thousand 13 Dollars (\$377,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 14 Administration for the Government of Guam's General Purpose Financial Statement and 15 the Single Audit Reports for Fiscal Year 2012. The Public Auditor *shall* administer said 16 funds and *shall* oversee the annual audit.

(b) For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) is
appropriated from the Tourist Attraction Fund to the Department of Administration for
the Government of Guam's Tourist Attraction Fund Financial Statement and Single Audit
Reports for Fiscal Year 2012. The Public Auditor *shall* administer said funds and *shall*oversee the annual audit.

(c) For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000) is
 appropriated from the Guam Highway Fund to the Department of Administration for the

Government of Guam's Highway Fund Financial Statement and Single Audit Reports for
 Fiscal Year 2012. The Public Auditor *shall* administer said funds and *shall* oversee the
 annual audit.

4 Section 22. Department of Administration Training and Continuing 5 Education. For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) is 6 appropriated from the Indirect Cost Fund to the Department of Administration (DOA) for 7 training and continuing education of persons employed as government accountants, and 8 in related positions. Of the amount appropriated in this Section, the amount of Ten 9 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) shall be used for Department of Administration Training and 10 Development Section for its training, equipment, and training facilities.

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## Section 23. Cost of Living Allowance (COLA).

(a) *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* shall provide a "Cost of Living Allowance"
(COLA) of One Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100) to each Government of Guam
Retirement Fund retiree, or his/her survivor, who has retired as of September 30, 2012 for
Fiscal Year 2013 to be prorated monthly. The sum of Six Million Seven Hundred
Seventy Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$6,770,500) is appropriated from the General
Fund to the Department of Administration for Fiscal Year 2013, to pay said COLA.

(b) The Guam Power Authority, the A. B. Won Pat International Airport
Authority, the Guam Economic Development Authority, the Guam Housing Corporation,
the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port,
the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Visitors Bureau shall pay a COLA in a
single payment of One Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$1,100) to every Government of
Guam Retirement Fund retiree who retired from each respective aforementioned agency

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as of September 30, 2012, or his survivor, no later than November 1, 2012, unless the
 annuitant chooses in writing to receive bi-monthly payments from October 1, 2012
 through September 30, 2013.

4 (c) Each agency mentioned in Subsection (b) shall remit to the General Fund
5 the amount required for the implementation of Subsection (b) above no later than October
6 15, 2013 by each respective entity. No payments shall be made for this purpose until such
7 time as these funds have been remitted.

8 Section 24. Support of Child in Custody. For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of 9 Six Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Nine Hundred Sixty-two Dollars (\$649,962) is 10 appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Administration for the *sole* 11 purpose of paying orders of the court pursuant to \$5116 of Title 19 of the Guam Code 12 Annotated.

## 13 Section 25. Section 1 of Public Law 28-38 as amended is hereby further 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "Section 1. Special Retirement Provisions for the Guam Department of Education 16 (GDOE) and Guam Memorial Hospital Authority (GMHA). On the first day of 17 the first month following the enactment hereof and on every first day of every 18 month thereafter, the Department of Administration (DOA) shall compute and 19 recognize interest owed for both the GDOE and GMHA retirement liabilities to 20 the Government of Guam Retirement Fund (GGRF) equal to outstanding liability 21 multiplied by the one twelfth (1/12) of the most recent historical five (5) year 22 average annual rate of return of the defined benefit investment portfolio, inclusive 23 of performance which yielded negative returns. Liability payments made by the

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1 GDOE or GMHA *shall* be credited to the respective liability balance prior to the 2 next month's interest calculations. The GGRF shall not be entitled to any 3 additional interest for liabilities identified in this Section beyond what the DOA 4 calculates on the first day of each month. The GGRF shall accept and approve for 5 retirement any eligible employee of the GDOE or the GMHA upon condition that the respective agency's employer and employee contributions to the GGRF for 6 the applicable fiscal year are current and paid in full as provided in Section 13, 7 8 Chapter VI of Public Law 27-106. If the GDOE or GMHA fails to make current 9 payments for the applicable fiscal year, the GGRF shall cease processing 10 applications from employees of that agency until payment is made in full.

11 The GGRF and the DOA *shall* reconcile the annualized interest paid during the 12 current fiscal year upon release of the GGRF rate of return performance report for 13 Quarter ending September 30 for the same twelve (12) month period. The GGRF 14 *shall* invoice the DOA for any underpayment of interest computed by subtracting 15 actual interest payments from interest calculated using the current fiscal year 16 monthly principal balances outlined in Section 1 and the twelve (12) month 17 average rate of return for the same period.

On the first day of the first month following the enactment hereof and on every first day of every month thereafter, with a grace period of *no more than* ten (10) days, the Treasurer of Guam *shall* pay "interest only" payments for the GDOE deficiency to the GGRF and the Treasurer of Guam *shall* pay "interest only" payments for the GMHA deficiency to the GGRF on the first day of the first month following the enactment hereof and on every first day of every month

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1 thereafter. The GGRF shall accept and approve for retirement any eligible 2 employee of the GDOE or the GMHA upon the condition that the respective 3 agency's employer and employee contributions to the GGRF for the applicable fiscal year are current and paid in full as provided in Section 13, Chapter VI of 4 Public Law 27-106, including interest and penalties pursuant to § 8137 (c) of Title 5 6 4 of the Guam Code Annotated and interest at the actuarial rate determined in the 7 latest completed actuarial valuation prepared for the Board of Trustees by the 8 actuary appointed by the Board, which is seven and one-half (7.5%). If the 9 Treasurer of Guam fails to make current payments as required by this Section or if 10 GDOE or GMH fails to make current payments for the applicable fiscal year, the GGRF shall cease processing applications from employees of that agency until 11 12 payment is made in full."

a) For Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of Three Hundred Thirty-two Thousand
Seven Hundred Fifty-three Dollars (\$332,753) is appropriated from the General Fund to
DOA for "interest only" payments for the GDOE and GMHA deficiency to the GGRF
pursuant to this Section. Any balance remaining from this appropriation shall revert to
the General Fund.

18 Section 26. Department of Labor for Workers Compensation Fund. The 19 sum of Seven Hundred Ninety-eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-three Dollars 20 (\$798,593) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Labor for the 21 Workers Compensation Fund for Fiscal Year 2013, for the Workers Compensation 22 payments pursuant to \$9144 of Title 22 of the Guam Code Annotated, including 23 obligations incurred in past years and in the future. Said appropriations may be used to

pay for medical, surgical, and other treatment; nurses; hospital services; medical travel and per diem costs; medicine; crutches; and equipment required by a claimant for such period as his injury and the recovery there from may require. Said appropriations *shall not* be expended for disability compensation payments for Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs) funded by this Act. The Director of Labor may use *no more than* Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) from said appropriations to pay for legal services for Workers Compensation hearings.

8 Section 27. Public Streetlights. The sum of Three Million Five Hundred 9 Ninety Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-one Dollars (\$3,590,261) is appropriated from the 10 Street Light Fund and the sum of Three Million Seven Hundred Nine Thousand Seven 11 Hundred Thirty-nine Dollars (\$3,709,739) is appropriated from the Guam Highway Fund 12 to the Department of Public Works for Fiscal Year 2013, to pay to the Guam Power 13 Authority for the operation of public streetlights.

Section 28. Prior Years Cost of Care and Custody for Prisoners Confined in Federal Facilities. The sum of Six Hundred Ninety-six Thousand Dollars (\$696,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections for Fiscal Year 2013, for the payment of current year obligations for prisoners confined in federal facilities of the Federal Bureau of Prisons.

19 Section 29. Appropriation to Unified Judiciary Notwithstanding any other 20 provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of One Million Three Hundred Ninety-six 21 Thousand Seven Hundred Ten Dollars (\$1,396,710) is appropriated from the General 22 Fund and the sum of One Hundred Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$145,000) is

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appropriated from the Safe Streets Fund to the Unified Judiciary for the following
 programs:

3 (a) **Court-Appointed Attorney Fees.** Such appropriation in this Section is 4 for the purpose of paying court-appointed attorney fees arising from the defense of 5 indigent peoples for Fiscal Year 2013. Said funds shall be deposited into the Judicial 6 Client Services Fund account, as created by Chapter 9.6, Division 1 of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated and shall not be subject to any transfer authority. 7 Anv unexpended funds appropriated herein shall be reverted to the General Fund at the end of 8 9 Fiscal Year 2013.

10 (b) Adult and Juvenile Drug Courts. Such appropriation in this Section is
11 for the operations of the Adult and Juvenile Drug Courts.

12 (c) Family Visitation Center. Such appropriation in this Section is to pay 13 for contractual services for the operation of the Family Visitation Center, *provided*, that 14 the Judiciary must comply with §18125(c) and (d) of Title 16 of the Guam Code 15 Annotated, and §9211(b) of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated.

16 Section 30. **Appropriations** to the Mayors' Council of Guam. 17 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, for Fiscal Year 2013, the sum of One Million Thirty-eight Thousand Two Hundred Forty-five Dollars (\$1,038,245) is 18 19 appropriated from the General Fund and the sum of One Million Five Hundred Six 20 Thousand Nine Hundred Forty-seven Dollars (\$1,506,947) is appropriated from the 21 Tourist Attraction Fund to the Mayors' Council of Guam for the following programs.

(a) Streets Maintenance and Beautification. Such appropriation in this
Section is for the maintenance and beautification of village secondary and tertiary roads,

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1	and for the operations of Mayors' offices, but not for personnel costs. Said funds shall
2	not be subject to any transfer authority of I Maga'lahen Guåhan and shall be divided
3	among the Village Mayors as follows:
4	(1) Each Mayor <i>shall</i> receive the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars
5	( <b>\$20,000</b> ); and
6	(2) The remaining balance of the fund <i>shall</i> be distributed to each
7	Mayor pro rata based on the total road mileage in his village as a percentage of
8	Guam's total road mileage in the 2006 Guam Roads Pavement Inventory of the
9	Department of Public Works.
10	(b) Island-wide Village Beautification Projects. Such appropriation in this
11	Section is for Island-wide Village Beautification Projects to include:
12	(1) The maintenance and repair of the village's recreational facilities
13	under the jurisdiction of the Mayor;
14	(2) The maintenance and repair of each village's main roads; and
15	(3) The planting and maintenance of each village's official flower and
16	other flowering plants, shrubs and trees adjacent to the village's main
17	roads, public restrooms and recreational facilities. A Mayor may contract
18	with a private entity to provide the services authorized by this Section
19	subject to the Guam Procurement Law, Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam
20	Code Annotated.
21	(c) <b>Grounds Maintenance for Schools.</b> Such appropriation in this Section is
22	for the grounds maintenance of Guam Department of Education schools. Subject to
23	approval and scheduling of the public school principals, the Mayors are responsible for

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1 regular ground maintenance of Guam Department of Education school grounds in their 2 respective districts where ground maintenance is not already subject to an existing 3 contract for a minimum of twice a month during a regular school calendar year. Subject to approval of scheduling with the public school principals, the Mayor may contract with 4 5 a private entity to provide the services authorized by this Section.

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**(d)** Public Safety and Social Education Programs. Such appropriation in 7 this Section is for the public safety and social education programs.

8 (e) Veterinarian and Animal Control Services. Such appropriation in this 9 Section is for veterinarian and animal control services.

10 Section 31. Appropriations to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority. 11 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of Fourteen Million Twenty-one 12 Thousand One Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$14,021,188) is appropriated for Fiscal 13 Year 2013 as follows:

Two Million Four Hundred Thirteen Thousand Four Hundred Ninety-five 14 **(a)** 15 Dollars (\$2,413,495) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Guam Memorial 16 Hospital Authority to supplement its operations.

Pursuant to §§ 26208 and 26208.1 of Chapter 26, Division 2 of Title 11 of 17 **(b)** the Guam Code Annotated, Nine Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Fifty-four Dollars 18 (\$9,150,054) is appropriated from the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority 19 20 Pharmaceuticals Fund to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority.

21 **c**) Pursuant to §26603(d)(3) of Chapter 26 of Title 11 of the Guam Code 22 Annotated, One Million Four Hundred Fifty seven Thousand Six Hundred Thirty Nine

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Dollars (\$1,457,639) is appropriated from the Healthy Futures Fund to the Guam
 Memorial Hospital Authority for its operations.

d) Pursuant to §22603(d), Article 6, Chapter 26 of Title 11 of the Guam Code
Annotated, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) is appropriated from the Healthy Futures
Fund to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority for the line of credit pursuant to
§80104(t), Chapter 80 Division 4 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated.

7 Section 32. Appropriations to the Guam Regional Transit Authority.
8 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of Three Million Nine Hundred Five
9 Thousand Eight Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$3,905,899) is appropriated for Fiscal
10 Year 2013 as follows:

a) Three Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Two Hundred Ten Dollars
(\$349,210) is appropriated from the Public Transit Fund to the Guam Regional Transit
Authority Fund for the operations of the Guam Regional Transit Authority pursuant to
§26503(b), Chapter 26 of Title 11 of the Guam Code Annotated.

b) Three Million Five Hundred Fifty-six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-nine
Dollars (\$3,556,689) is appropriated from the Guam Highway Fund to the Guam
Regional Transit Authority Fund for the operations of the Guam Regional Transit
Authority.

Section 33. Guam Solid Waste Authority Appropriation. For Fiscal Year
2013, the sum of Seven Million Seven Hundred Fifty-nine Thousand One Hundred Six
Dollars (\$7,759,106) is appropriated from the Solid Waste Operations Fund to the Guam
Solid Waste Authority pursuant to Public Law 31-20.

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#### **CHAPTER IV**

#### **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

Section 1. Retirement Option for Government of Guam Employees. A member of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund who is eligible for retirement may retire upon the complete remittance of his outstanding individual contributions to the Fund, including the employee and employer retirement contributions. Any and all fees, interest at actuarial rates, and penalties required by the Government of Guam Retirement Fund *shall* be paid by the Government.

9 This Section *shall not* restrict the continuing remittance of existing Retirement 10 Fund contributions as required by law *or* by the Government of Guam Retirement Fund. 11 By the fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) day of each month, the Director of the Government of Guam 12 Retirement Fund *shall* provide a detailed report to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* 13 regarding said remittances and the number of retirements pursuant to this Section during 14 the previous month. Nothing herein *shall* be construed to abrogate any provision of 15 Public Law 28-38.

16 Section 2. Volunteers and Donations for Skinner Plaza, Plaza De Espana 17 and Guam Congress Building. The Executive Director of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* may 18 receive donations, including, but *not* restricted to, donations of goods, materials and 19 services, for the purpose of maintaining and renovating Skinner Plaza, the Plaza De 20 Espana, and the Guam Congress Building (also known as the Old Legislative Building).

21 Section 3. Temporary Employment of Retired Corrections Officers. The 22 Department of Corrections may hire retired Guam Corrections Officers *if* a critical need 23 arises. Retired corrections officers hired under this Section may receive their retirement

1 annuity while employed on this temporary basis. Officers may only be hired under this 2 section only to fill positions left vacant because of military activation of corrections 3 officers filling those positions and *shall* be terminated when the incumbent returns from 4 military service. Retired officers may be hired only in the ranks of Corrections Officers 5 Supervisor I, at Step 1 only, and *shall not* receive sick and annual leave. Officers hired 6 under this section *shall* meet requirements for the position in question *except* for written 7 examinations and the Director of Corrections shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for 8 duty. Notwithstanding §8121(a) of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, a retiree hired 9 pursuant to this Section may continue to receive his annuity.

10 Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Police Officers. The Section 4. 11 Guam Police Department may hire retired Guam Police Officers if a critical need arises 12 because of military activation of police officers. The retiree hired shall fill such a vacant position and shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service. 13 Retired officers may be hired only at the ranks of Sergeant I and below, only at Step 1, 14 15 and shall not receive sick and annual leave. Officers hired under this Section shall first 16 meet the requirements, except for written examinations, for the position in question and 17 the Chief of Police shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding 18 §8121(a) of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to 19 this Section hereto may continue to receive retirement benefits.

20 Section 5. Temporary Employment of Retired Guam Fire Fighters. The 21 Guam Fire Department (GFD) may hire retired GFD firefighters *if* a critical need arises 22 because of military activation of GFD firefighters. The retirees hired *shall* fill such a 23 vacant position and shall be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service.

Retired fire personnel may be hired only at the ranks of Fire Specialist and below, only at Step 1, and shall not receive sick and annual leave. Retired firefighters hired under this Section shall first meet the requirements, except for written examinations, for the position in question and the Fire Chief shall certify that every retiree hired is fit for duty. Notwithstanding §8121(a) of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant to this Section hereto may continue to receive retirement benefits.

7 Section 6. **Temporary Employment of Retired Customs and Quarantine** The Customs and Quarantine Agency may hire retired Customs and 8 **Officers.** 9 Quarantine Officers when a critical need arises as a result of military activation of 10 Customs officers or when vacancies cannot be filled within six (6) months because of the 11 lack of qualified applicants. The retired officer shall fill such a vacant position and shall 12 be terminated when the incumbent returns from military service or when a fully-qualified 13 applicant is available. Retired officers may be hired *only* in the ranks of Customs Officer 14 III and below, only at Step 1, and *shall* not receive sick and annual leave. Retirees hired 15 pursuant to this Section *shall* meet requirements for the position in question, *except* for 16 written examinations, and the Director of Customs *shall* certify that every retiree hired is 17 fit for duty. The requirements of Article 3, Chapter 32 of Title 17 of the Guam Code 18 Annotated, are waived for employment pursuant hereto except for §32304(b) (4). 19 Notwithstanding §8121(a) of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant hereto may continue to receive their retirement benefits. 20

21 Section 7. Temporary Employment of Retired Department of Revenue 22 and Taxation Employees. The Department of Revenue & Taxation may hire retired 23 employees of the Department of Revenue & Taxation when a critical need arises in the

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areas of Tax Collection, Taxpayer Assistance, Tax Investigation, Auditing, and Tax
Processing. Said retirees *shall* be hired at Step 1 for the position in question and *shall* not
receive sick and annual leave. Notwithstanding §8121(a), Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the
Guam Code Annotated, retirees hired temporarily pursuant hereto may continue to
receive their retirement benefits.

6 Section 8. Locum Tenens Exemption during the Absence of the Chief 7 Medical Examiner. The Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is exempt from the 8 government of Guam Procurement Law in contracting for the professional services of a 9 qualified medical examiner to be provided when the Chief Medical Examiner is absent 10 from work.

11 Section 9. Advance Payments for Medical Services. In order to expedite 12 acceptance of Medically Indigent Program (MIP) clients by facilities in California, 13 Hawaii or Manila for medical treatment approved by the MIP, the Director of Public 14 Health and Social Services may advance payments for said medical treatment, and may 15 establish escrow accounts for immediate and advance payment of medical treatment at 16 those Joint Commission Accredited hospitals determined by the Director to be best able 17 to serve Medically Indigent Program clients.

18 Section 10. Transfer of Employees. Notwithstanding any other provision of 19 law, and in recognition of personnel shortages in certain areas, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* is 20 authorized to transfer employees within *or* between any department *or* agency of the 21 government of Guam, *except* that:

22 (a) This Section shall *not* apply to any employee of the Legislative *or* Judicial
23 Branches of government;

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The transfer of an employee shall *not* result in a loss of pay *or* salary;

2 (c) No employee *shall* be transferred if the employee has filed a viable 3 grievance with the Civil Service Commission for discrimination based on political 4 affiliation, gender, *or* sexual harassment, *unless* the employee consents to said transfer;

5 (d) No employee of an autonomous agency may be transferred to a line
6 department *or* agency;

7 (e) *I Maga'lahi shall* transfer the funding authorized for that employee's 8 position from the transferor agency to the transferee agency, including the Guam 9 Memorial Hospital Authority, Department of Public Health and Social Services, and 10 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, unless the transfer is from a line 11 agency to an autonomous agency; and

12 (f) This Section *shall not* be used to transfer employees acting in good faith 13 who report *or* expose bad business practices, illegal activities, *or* inappropriate conduct 14 by public officials.

15 Section 11. Moratorium on Compensation for Boards and Commissions. 16 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule, or regulation, except for the Civil 17 Service Commission, the Guam Education Policy Board, and the Consolidated 18 Commission on Utilities, a moratorium is hereby placed on the compensation of all 19 members of government boards and commissions for their attendance at hearings or 20 meetings, through the end of Fiscal Year 2013.

Section 12. Contracts. Positions in the classified and unclassified service
 *shall not* be filled pursuant to a contractual arrangement, *except* as provided in this
 Section for Fiscal Year 2013.

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1 (a) Subject to Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, government 2 of Guam departments and agencies may contract with independent contractors, provided 3 that no agency may contract for services customarily provided by employees in the 4 classified service, except as provided by law.

5 (b) Government of Guam departments and agencies that do not customarily 6 obtain professional services, such as licensed health professionals, licensed architects, 7 licensed engineers, legal services, actuarial services and auditing services through an 8 employee in the classified service in that department or agency may contract to obtain 9 such services.

10 (c) The Office of the Attorney General and the Public Defender Service 11 Corporation are authorized to contract with attorneys as independent contractors to 12 provide services in areas in which it is impracticable or impossible for the office to 13 proceed. Such contracts *shall* be in accordance with the procurement laws of Guam. No 14 such independent contractor hired pursuant to this Section may receive from the 15 government of Guam any remuneration in any form other than in payment for the 16 position into which such person is hired. The Office of the Attorney General and the 17 Executive Director of the Public Defender Service Corporation shall file a copy of every 18 such contract with the Chief Procurement Officer and the Director of Administration 19 together with a written certification stating why it is impracticable to handle the matter 20 within the office as otherwise constituted.

(d) This Section *shall not* apply to the Guam Department of Education; the
University of Guam; the Guam Community College; the Unified Judiciary when filling
positions of justices and judges pro tem, law clerks, and legal interns; the Department of

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Revenue and Taxation when filling the position of legal counsel; *I Liheslaturan Guåhan;* the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority; and the Department of Public Health and Social
 Services and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse when filling
 positions of licensed health professionals.

5 (e) Any instrumentality of the government of Guam that fills any classified or 6 unclassified positions by contractual arrangement in accordance with this Section *shall* 7 file a copy of every such contract with the Chief Procurement Officer together with a 8 written certification stating why it is impracticable to handle the matter within the 9 instrumentality as otherwise constituted.

Section 13. Repeal of Direct Deposit of Judiciary Appropriations. §22111
of Article 1, Chapter 22, Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *repealed* in its
entirety.

2	ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS			
3	Section 1. Authorization for Matching Requirements for Federal Grants-			
4	In-Aid. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all departments are authorized to			
5	expend funds appropriated in this Act for matching requirements of Federal grants for			
6	Fiscal Year 2013.			
7	Section 2. Carryover of Local and Federal Matching Program Funds for			
8	Grants. The Local and Federal Matching Funds for programs, whose expiration dates			
9	extend beyond September 30, 2013, shall not lapse and may be expended throughout the			
10	period of the grant award.			
11	Section 3. Government of Guam Retirement Fund Rate of Contribution.			
12	In accordance with §8137(e), Article 1, Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code			
13	Annotated, the government rate of contribution to the Retirement Fund throughout Fiscal			
14	Year 2013 shall be thirty and nine hundredths percent (30.09%).			
15	Section 4. Autonomous Agency Revenues and Expenditures Reported to <i>I</i>			
16	Maga'lahen Guåhan and I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Notwithstanding any other provision			
17	of law, every autonomous and semi-autonomous agency or public corporation in the			
18	government of Guam shall report all revenues and expenditures for all funds under its			
19	purview and administration to the I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the Speaker of I			
20	Liheslaturan Guåhan on a monthly basis and post the same on its website. Each monthly			
21	report shall be due no later than thirty (30) days after the end of each month.			

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Section 5. Special Fund Transfer. I Maga'lahen Guåhan is authorized to
 transfer to the General Fund any cash available from any appropriated Special Fund or
 Revolving Fund to fund the appropriations authorized by this Act.

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All cash from Special funds *or* Revolving funds transferred to cover the appropriations authorized by this Act *shall* be promptly reimbursed to the Special *or* Revolving Fund from which it was withdrawn as cash becomes available.

7 Section 6. Transfer Authority of I Maga'lahen Guåhan. I Maga'lahen 8 Guåhan is authorized to transfer funds between Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund 9 Executive Branch appropriations, and within departments and agencies Special Fund 10 Executive Branch appropriations for Fiscal Year 2013. This section does not apply to 11 appropriations made to the Judiciary, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, and the Office of Finance 12 and Budget.

Section 7. Independent Contractors. The Office of *I Maga'lahi*, the Office
 of *I Segundu Na Maga'lahen Guåhan* and the Guam State Clearinghouse may enter into
 agreements with independent contractors pursuant to Guam procurement laws.

16 Section 8. Facilities Insurance Requirements. Every department and 17 agency of the government of Guam, as part of its appropriations for operations contained 18 in this Act, may expend such sums as necessary for facilities insurance requirements.

19 Section 9. Reporting Requirements for Non-Profit Organizations. All 20 non-profit organizations that receive funds pursuant to this Act *shall* maintain financial 21 records that accurately account for said funds and *shall* provide a budgetary breakdown 22 by object category to the department *or* agency that oversees the appropriation. The non-23 profit organization *shall* also provide to said department:

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- (a) A quarterly report describing its activities during the reporting period and
   the results it achieved *no later than* twenty (20) days after the end of each
   quarter;
- 4 (b) Notification of all procurement of equipment and services of Five
  5 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or more prior to awarding the contract
  6 therefore;
- 7 (c) Access to the overseeing department *or* agency's duly authorized 8 representative, and Government of Guam auditors, to appropriate records 9 for the purpose of audit and examination of books, documents, papers and 10 records of funds expended under the appropriation;
- (d) Submission of a detailed inventory listing of each year's purchases, as
  certified by its certifying officer; and
- (e) A Final Report to the overseeing department or agency for submission to I *Liheslaturan Guåhan* containing a full disclosure of all expenditures of
  funds appropriated by this Act no later than November 15, 2013, for
  Fiscal Year 2013. The overseeing department or agency shall post the
  same on its website.
- (f) Non-compliance with these reporting requirements will subject the nonprofit organization to a three percent (3%) reduction of its appropriation(s)
  and the overseeing agency's contract with the organization *shall* so
  provide.
- 22 Section 10. Unless otherwise specified in this Act:

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1 **(a)** General Fund Reversion. All unexpended or unencumbered 2 appropriations made from the General Fund pursuant to this Act shall revert to the General Fund on the last day of Fiscal Year 2013. 3

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Tourist Attraction Fund Reversion. All unexpended or unencumbered **(b)** appropriations made from the Tourist Attraction Fund pursuant to this Act shall revert to 5 the Tourist Attraction Fund on the last day of Fiscal Year 2013. 6

7 (c) Healthy Futures Fund Reversion. All unexpended or unencumbered appropriations made from the Healthy Futures Fund pursuant to this Act shall revert to 8 the Healthy Futures Fund on the last day of Fiscal Year 2013. 9

10 Authorization for Payment of Prior Years' Obligations. Section 11. 11 Appropriations made in this Act may be expended for the payment of prior years' obligations, provided it does not negatively impact the current operational needs of the 12 13 department or agency requesting such prior years' payment.
