Schedule Of Fees and Charges with Rules And Regulations

ARTICLE I

AMBULANCE SERVICES (NON-EMERGENCY)

CHAPTER 1 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

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5 **A. SCOPE.** To establish the Guam Fire Department’s policy, rules or
6 regulations, and fee Schedule for the **non-emergency** use of Ambulance Services.

7 **B. DEFINITION.** For the purpose of this Chapter, the following
8 definitions apply:

9 **1. *Ambulance Services*** is the use or temporary deployment of the
10 department’s ambulance or it’s attending Emergency Medical Technician
11 (**EMT**), to treat or transport sick or injured persons, ambulatory or non-
12 ambulatory, to or from a medical facility; or remain on alert status at events,
13 concerts, games, races, promotions, functions, or activities requiring the
14 same presence.

15 **2. *Non-emergency Service*** is that which does not fall under the
16 definition of “Emergency Service” as defined by the American College of
17 Emergency Physicians.

18 The following examples would demonstrate the need for urgent or
19 unscheduled medical care in the prudent layperson’s opinion based on an
20 average knowledge of medicine and health. This list is not intended to be all
21 encompassing for all medical conditions or situations that may arise and
22 should be used only to conceptually embrace an unlimited number of
23 medical abnormalities that could constitute an emergent situation based on
24 the person’s current physical or mental condition.

25 Examples of these services (Emergency Services) would include the
26 following:

27 Evaluation or management of:

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- 1 · Acute or Significant pain.
- 2 · Any trauma (less than seventy-two (72) hours from time of incident)
- 3 and/or complications of trauma (regardless of time).
- 4 · Acute infection or sepsis.
- 5 · Shock or impending shock.
- 6 · Obstetrical crisis and/or labor
- 7 · Bleeding or threats of hemorrhage.
- 8 · Any condition resulting in admission of the patient to a hospital or
- 9 nursing home within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 10 · Suspected abuse or neglect of any person could result in temporary or
- 11 permanent physical or psychological harm.
- 12 · Any illness or injury that would cause loss or impairment of the
- 13 following systems: integumentary, musculoskeletal, HEENT, respiratory,
- 14 gastrointestinal, genitourinary, nervous, or cardiovascular.
- 15 · Congenital defects or abnormalities in an infant.
- 16 · A patient suspected to be suffering from a mental illness and/or
- 17 posing an apparent danger to the safety of him, her and others.
- 18 · Any Acute or significant symptom(s) that might indicate a condition
- 19 that constitutes a threat to the patient’s or family’s physical or
- 20 psychological well-being requiring prompt medical attention preventing
- 21 possible deterioration, disability or death.

C. SCHEDULING, STAND-BY SERVICES.

- 23 1. Persons requesting for an ambulance stand-by Service must call the
- 24 Emergency Medical Services/Rescue Division Office at the least two (2)

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1 weeks (fourteen (14) days) in advance for scheduling. The following
2 information must be provided:

- 3 a. Name of person requesting.
- 4 b. Type of Activity being conducted.
- 5 c. Location of “Stand-By Service.”
- 6 d. Time and duration of request.
- 7 e. Name of organization requesting.
- 8 f. Name of contact person and telephone number.
- 9 g. Complete mailing address.

10 2. The caller requesting the service will be given a Stand-By Service
11 Request Number which will be used for future reference.

12 3. The Guam Fire Department will contact the person requesting the
13 Stand-By Service at least one (1) week or seven (7) days prior to the activity
14 date for confirmation.

15 4. Stand-By Services may be cancelled by calling the E.M.S./Rescue
16 Division at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the stand-by. If a service is
17 not cancelled accordingly, the minimum first hour charge will be assessed.

18 See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and
19 Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

20 **D. FEES, “STAND-BY SERVICES.”**

21 1. A minimum one (1) hour fee will be charged for all Stand-By
22 Services. After the first hour, hourly fees will be charged for each additional
23 hour or each fifteen (15) minutes (one-fourth the hourly rate) portions
24 thereof of ambulance Stand-By Services.

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1 2. Fees will be charged from the time a unit arrives at a stand-by until
2 the time the unit leaves the scene.

3 3. Adjustments will be made to the charges should Guam Fire
4 Department be unable to meet the scheduled time or must remove a unit
5 from a stand-by.

6 4. A Stand-by Service which is not cancelled prior to the required
7 twenty-four (24) hour notice will be billed for one (1) hour of service.

8 See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and
9 Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

10 **E. GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT’S RESPONSIBILITY.**

11 1. The Guam Fire Department’s primary medical mission is to
12 emergency patients. Therefore, no ambulance can be said to be dedicated to
13 a Stand-By Service. The Guam Fire Department will do its best to have its
14 unit arrive promptly and remain at the location for the time duration
15 requested. If a unit must be pulled from a Stand-By Service to respond to an
16 Emergency, the Guam Fire Department will do its best to replace that unit
17 within fifteen (15) minutes. If this is not possible, appropriate adjustments
18 will be made to the stand-by charges based on the time a unit returns to the
19 scene.

20 2. The Guam Fire Department will schedule an ambulance for
21 each Stand-By Service Requested, however, at the time of the service, if an
22 ambulance is not immediately available because of an emergency, the
23 department has the option to temporarily replace the unit with another

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1 patient transport. An ambulance will be placed at the scene as soon as
2 possible upon availability.

3 3. Should an ambulance unit not be available at all for the entire
4 duration of the Stand-By Service due to shortage of ambulances, other units
5 manned by Emergency Medical Technicians such as Engine Companies and
6 Rescue Units will be utilized for such Stand-By services.

7 **F. COLLECTION OF FEES.**

8 1. An invoice will be mailed to the requesting organization or
9 individual within fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due
10 within thirty (30) days of the statement date.

11 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who
12 shall deposit these collections in the Guam Fire Department’s Fire, Life and
13 Medical Emergency Fund (“FLAME”).

14 3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts.
15 Subsequent reminder notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within
16 fifteen (15) days of the date of the issuance.

17 See Chapter 2 Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and
18 Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

19 **G. SCHEDULING, NON-EMERGENCY PATIENT TRANSPORT** 20 **SERVICES.**

21 1. Requests for non-emergency patient transport services will be
22 categorized as follows:

23 a. Routine Scheduled Transports.

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1 i. This category will include all transports which can be
2 scheduled at east forty-eight (48) hours ahead of time. Examples may
3 be: weekly therapy, doctor’s appointments, lab services, etc.

4 ii. An individual may request for a Routine Scheduled
5 Transport by calling the Emergency Medical Services/Rescue
6 Division Office at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance.

7 iii. Individuals should schedule the patient transport at the same time
8 as they are scheduling the appointment with the clinic or lab to ensure that
9 transport service is available at the proposed appointment time.

10 iv. If this coordinated scheduling is not done, and there are multiple
11 transports and conflicting schedules, a patient may be requested to change
12 his appointment time or date.

13 v. The Guam Fire Department will call the contact person, on the day
14 of the scheduled transport, to verify and confirm the service requested.

15 vi. A person requesting a Routine Scheduled Transport service, who
16 does not cancel the same before an ambulance checks out to the requested
17 location, will be charged as provided for in Chapter 2 – Fee Schedule for
18 Ambulance Stand-by and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services,
19 Section(4).

20 See Chapter 2 Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency
21 Patient Transport Service

22 b. **Unscheduled Transport.**

23 i. This category will include all transports which cannot be scheduled
24 forty-eight (48) hours ahead of time. (Examples may be: transport of

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1 patients’ release from Guam Memorial Hospital, special transports from
2 G.M.H. to lab for inpatients, etc.).

3 ii. Individuals may request for unscheduled transports by contacting
4 the Guam Fire Department Integrated Emergency Communications Center
5 (E 9-1-1/Fire Dispatch).

6 iii. Requests received with less than twelve (12) hours notice will be
7 entertained as best as possible by the Guam Fire Department Ambulance
8 service. Emergency responses will take priority and non-emergency
9 services may be delayed.

10 iv. A person(s) requesting a Routine Schedule Transport Service,
11 who does not cancel the same before an ambulance checks out to the
12 requested location, will be charged as provided in Chapter 2 – Fee Schedule
13 for Ambulance standby and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services,
14 Section(4).

15 See Chapter 2 Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency
16 Patient Transport Services.

17 2. All requests for transports shall comply with the following procedures.

18 a. Upon calling the appropriate office to request the transport, the
19 following information must be provided:

- 20 i. Name of person requesting.
- 21 ii. Location/address of patient pick-up.
- 22 iii. Location/address of the destination to transport the patient.
- 23 iv. Time of scheduled appointment (if applicable)
- 24 v. Time of requested pick-up
- 25 vi. Name and phone number of contact person.

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1 vii. Patients’ complete mailing address.

2 viii. Name of an insurance carrier (if any).

3 b. Individual requesting services should notify the intended receiving party
4 (doctors’ office, clinic, lab, etc.) that appointment times be flexible as the Guam
5 Fire Department cannot guarantee an arrival time at the destination.

6 c. Patients must be accompanied by an appropriate family member or care
7 giver.

8 d. If the patient is unaccompanied and staff and facilities (wheelchair,
9 stretcher, etc.) are not available at the receiving facility to monitor the patient, the
10 G.F.D. ambulance crew will remain with the patient, however, additional fees for
11 this service will be charged.

12 See Chapter 2 of Article I: Fee Schedule for Stand-by Services and Non
13 Emergency Patient Transport Services.

14 3. The caller requesting the service will be given a Non-Emergency Transport
15 Service number which will be used for future reference to the request.

16 **H. FEES, NON-EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.**

17 1. Fees for all non-emergency transports will be charged a flat trip rate, regardless
18 of distance or time required for transport; except that Wait Time Fees will be added to the
19 charge if the allotted time stipulated below is exceeded.

20 2. The Trip Rate will encompass travel time to the pick-up point, a maximum
21 fifteen (15) minute wait and load time at the pick-up point, travel time from the pick-up
22 point to the delivery point, and a maximum fifteen (15) minute wait and off-load time.

23 3. If the wait, by the ambulance crew, at the time of pick-up or delivery exceeds
24 fifteen (15) minutes, a fee per each fifteen (15) minutes will be charged.

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1 4. Any Wait Time will be based on the ambulance crew’s arrival at the scene time
2 and en route to location time, or the arrival at location time and ready for service time, as
3 received and recorded by the Guam Fire Department Integrated Emergency
4 Communications Center – E 9-1-1/Fire Dispatch.

5 See Chapter 2 of Article I: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-
6 Emergency Patient Transport Services.

I. COLLECTION OF FEES, NON-EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.

7 1. An invoice will be mailed to the requesting organization or individual within
8 fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due within thirty (30) days of the
9 statement date.
10

11 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who shall deposit these
12 collections in the Guam Fire Department’s Fire, Life and Medical Emergency Fund
13 “FLAME”, Title 10 GCA §72106.

14 3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts. Subsequent reminder
15 notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within fifteen (15) days of the date of
16 issuance.

17 See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-
18 Emergency Patient Transport Services.

J. COLLECTION OF FEES, EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.

19 1. An invoice will be mailed to the individual or the individual’s Health Insurance
20 Company within fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due within thirty
21 (30) days of the statement date.
22

23 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who shall deposit these
24 collections in the Guam Fire Department’s Guam Fire Department’s Fire, Life and
25 Medical Emergency Fund “FLAME”, Title 10 GCA §72106.

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3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts. Subsequent reminder notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within fifteen (15) days of the date of issuance.

See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

K. SERVICES APPEAL.

Any person seeking relief from a decision, action or inaction of a member of the Guam Fire Department, on matters concerning this article, shall present, either verbally or in writing, an appeal and recommended solution to the Fire Chief. The Fire Chief shall investigate the matter, and accordingly, determine the course of action. Written appeals require that the Fire Chief notify the appellant in writing of the Fire Chief’s decision. Verbal appeals will require that the appellant make contact with the Fire Chief for notification of the Fire Chief’s decision.

CHAPTER 4 – COLLECTION OF FEES AND FINES

10 1. Payment. Permits may be obtained and fees paid at the One-Stop Permit Center.

11 Fines shall be paid at the Traffic Violations Bureau of the Superior Court of Guam.

12 2. To Schedule inspections contact GFD Fire Prevention Division

13 3. Information to be provided by applicant.

14 Please bring with you the following items:

15 a. Inspection reports. (if applicable)

16 b. Driver’s License or an acceptable identification card.

17 4. Past due fees. The department will take necessary measure to obtain collection of past
18 due fees including the following:

19 a. Notification to Business License Branch, Department of Revenue and Taxation.

20 b. Non-issuance of permit.

21 c. Refer matter for collection to the Office of the Attorney General.

CHAPTER 5 – INSPECTIONS

22
23 The Guam Fire Department (G.F.D.) will take reasonable measures to ensure that
24 uniform fire code compliance is continually maintained and not just occasionally on or about

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1 permit renewal date or on notice of inspection possibility; protect the integrity of its Fire
2 Prevention Program; and address citizen concerns or complaints.

3 **The following provides the procedures for:**

- 4 A. Inspections for Occupancy Clearance.
- 5 B. Inspections for New Permits.
- 6 C. Inspections for Permit Renewals
- 7 D. Unannounced Inspections for Existing Permit Holders.
- 8 E. Unannounced Inspections for other regulations by the Uniform Fire Code.

9 **First Inspection.** The inspector *shall* conduct the inspection for code compliance. *If*
10 code compliance has not been achieved, except for new permit applicants, the following may
11 result: inspection fee assessed and/or a citation issued. Re-inspections *shall* be made until code
12 compliance has been obtained, providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger
13 created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done.

14 In all cases, an inspection report shall be filled out and a copy given to the responsible
15 person.

16 **Re-inspection(s).** The inspector *shall* conduct the inspection for code compliance and
17 assess a re-inspection fee. *If* code compliance has not been achieved, re-inspections will be
18 made after providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the
19 violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained.
20 A citation may also be issued and/or the establishment closed.

21 In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the responsible
22 person.

23 **A. INSPECTIONS FOR OCCUPANCY CLEARANCE**

24 Inspections for Occupancy Clearance will be conducted after completion of
25 construction of new or renovated buildings. This inspection is not considered a First

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1 Inspection and does not include a permit fee. (See Fee Schedule for Permits). Fees for
2 inspections for Occupancy Clearance include Plan Review and inspections up to issuance
3 of Fire Safety Certificate. (See Fee Schedule for Occupancy Clearance on Chapter 3).

4 The Uniform Fire Code authorizes the Chief, Fire Prevention Division, hereinafter
5 known as: *Fire Marshal* to issue “**Conditional Clearance**” for Occupancy Clearance.
6 Conditional Clearances are granted with a specified time frame given for applicant to
7 come into full compliance with the Fire Code. Inspections conducted upon full
8 compliance of the code or expiration of conditional clearance, whichever occurs first, will
9 be assessed a re-inspection fee.

10 **B. INSPECTIONS FOR NEW PERMITS**

11 New permits must be preceded by an inspection for code compliance. There is no
12 charge for this First Inspection; it is included in the permit fee which must be received by
13 the G.F.D. at the One Stop Building Permit/Business Service Center, before a permit is
14 issued. See Fee schedule for Permit.

15 *If* code compliance cannot be achieved during this inspection, the Inspector *shall*
16 schedule a re-inspection, providing reasonable time, dependant on the hazard and danger
17 created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance
18 has been obtained. A fee will be charged for each re-inspection. See Fee Payment
19 Schedule for Inspections.

20 **C. INSPECTIONS FOR PERMIT RENEWALS**

21 All permit renewals must be preceded by an inspection for code compliance. *If* not
22 in compliance, the inspector shall schedule a re-inspection, providing reasonable time,
23 dependant on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the
24 work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will be charged for
25 each re-inspection. See Fee Payment Schedule for Inspections.

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1 Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeat violations
2 within the past two (2) years. Citation normally will not be issued on the First Inspection.
3 Citations for violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

4 **Exception: Citation issued for violations which present imminent life hazards**
5 **such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted areas,**
6 **failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or**
7 **procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not**
8 **require prior notice.**

9 There is no charge for the First Inspection; it is included in the permit fee, which
10 must be received by the G.F.D. at the One Stop Building Permit/Business License
11 Service Center before a permit is renewed. (See Fee Schedule for Permits).

12 In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the
13 responsible person.

14 **D. UNANNOUNCED INSPECTIONS FOR EXISTING PERMIT HOLDERS**

15 Unannounced inspections may be conducted for code compliance by any duly
16 authorized official of the Guam Fire Department on any building and premises, business,
17 activity, engagement, or function regulated by the applicable code at all reasonable times.

18 *If* not in compliance, the Inspector *shall* schedule a re-inspection, providing
19 reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the
20 complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will
21 be charged for this inspection (only if a violation is noted) and each re-inspection.
22 Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeat violations within the
23 past two (2) years.

24 Citations normally will not be issued on the First Inspection. Citations for
25 violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

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1 **EXEMPTION: Citations Issued for violations which present imminent life**
2 **hazards such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted**
3 **areas, failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or**
4 **procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not**
5 **require prior notice.**

6 In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the
7 responsible person.

8 **E. UNANNOUNCED INSPECTIONS FOR OTHERS REGULATED BY**
9 **THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE.**

10 Unannounced inspections may be conducted by any duly authorized official of the
11 Guam Fire Department on any building and premises, business, activity, engagement, or
12 function regulated by the applicable code at all reasonable times.

13 If not in compliance, the inspector *shall* schedule a re-inspection after providing
14 reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the
15 complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will
16 be charged for this inspection (only if a violation is noted) and each re-inspection.
17 Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeated violations within
18 the past two (2) years.

19 Citations normally will not be issued on the First Inspection. Citations for
20 violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

21 **EXCEPTIONS: Citation issued for violations which present imminent life**
22 **hazards such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted**
23 **areas, failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or**
24 **procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not**
25 **require prior notice.**

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1 In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the
2 responsible person.

ARTICLE III

CHAPTER 1 – GRACE PERIODS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE UFC.

3
4 **CHAPTER 1 – GRACE PERIODS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE UFC.**
5 *§73112 of 10 Guam Code Annotated authorizes the Guam Fire Department to*
6 *promulgate rules setting forth grace periods within which parties not in conformance with*
7 *Uniform Fire Code shall bring their premises up to code.* The following grace periods have
8 been established within which existing buildings *shall* be brought to conformance with the
9 Uniform Fire Code.

A. Life-Safety Requirements for Existing Buildings Other Than High Rise.

10
11 Within eighteen (18) months after the owner of an existing building other than a high rise
12 has been notified of life-safety violations, plans for compliance shall be submitted and
13 approved, and within eighteen (18) months thereafter the work shall be completed or the
14 building shall be vacated until made to confirm.

B. Life-Safety Requirements for Existing High Rise Buildings

15
16 Plans and specifications for the necessary alterations *shall* be filed with the Chief within
17 the time periods are not physically practical or pose an undue hardship. The granting of an
18 extension of time for compliance shall be based upon the showing of good cause and subject to
19 the filing of an acceptable systematic progressive plan of correction with the Chief.

C. Appeals

20
21 Appeals of the determinations of the Chief in applying the provisions of this code may be
22 made by an appeal directed to the board of appeals as established by Sections 103.4. of the
23 Uniform Fire Code.”

24 **Section 2. Severability.** *If any provision of this Law or its application to any person*
25 *or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other*

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- 1 provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions
- 2 or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
