# BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM: Section 1. A new Article 1A is hereby added to Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read: "Article 1A"

4	§4A101. Title. Article1A of Title 4, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby
5	created to make its title the Military Family Leave Act of Guam (MFLAG) and
6	throughout the Chapter the acronym MFLAG will be referred to as this Act.
7	§4A102. Purpose. In order to serve the families of those troops currently
8	serving in military conflicts in Iraq, Afghanistan, and throughout the world,
9	serving in the Global War on Terrorism, and to assure that these families are
10	able to spend time together during the qualified service member's leave to and
11	from deployment, to include pre-deployment, post-deployment, during
12	deployment, any return for Rest and Relaxation (R&R) leave during
13	deployment or reintegration from deployment, and to handle their personal
14	affairs by their spouse or designated next of kin or attorney-in-fact, it is
15	necessary that this Act take effect immediately.
16	§4A103. Definitions. The following definitions shall be used in
17	interpreting this Article.
18	(a) Qualified Employee means a person who satisfies all of the
19	following:
20	(1) Is the spouse, authorized representative, designated
21	next of kin, or attorney-in-fact of a qualified member.
22	(2) Performs service for hire for an employer for an
23	average of twenty (20) or more hours per week, but does not
24	include an independent contractor.
25	(3) Provides the qualified employer with notice, within
26	two (2) business days of receiving official notice that the qualified

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member will be on leave from deployment, of his *or* her intention to take the leave provided for in §4A104 of this Article as requested.

- (4) Submits written documentation to the qualified employer certifying that the qualified member will be on leave from deployment during the time the leave provided for in subdivision (e) is requested.
- (b) Qualified Employer means any government of Guam instrumentality, Military related unit on Guam, municipal village instrumentality, public authority, or any other governmental entity on Guam subdivision, that employs fifteen (15) or more employees.
  - (c) Period of military-conflict means either of the following:
  - (1) A period of war declared by the United States Congress;
  - (2) A period of deployment for which a member of a reserve component is ordered to active duty pursuant to either of the following: (i) Sections 12301 and 12302 of Title 10 of the United States Code, *or* (ii) Title 32 of the United States Code.
- (d) Qualified Service Member means a person who is any of the following:
  - (1) A service member of the Armed Forces of the United States who has been deployed during a period of military conflict to an area designated as a combat theater *or* combat zone by the President of the United States; or
  - (2) A service member of the National Guard who has been deployed during a period of military conflict; or

1	(3) A service member of the Reserves who has been
2	deployed during a period of military conflict.
3	(e) Qualified leave period means the period during which the
4	qualified service member is on leave from deployment during a period of
5	military conflict, to include pre-deployment, post deployment, return for
6	rest and relaxation (R&R), reintegration, or after deployment.
7	§4A104. Leave Required. Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
8	a qualified employer may allow a qualified employee to take up to fifteen (15)
9	days of unpaid leave during a qualified leave period.
10	§4A105. Provisions.
11	(a) A qualified employer shall not retaliate against a qualified
12	employee for requesting or taking the leave provided for in this Section.
13	(b) The leave provided for in this Section shall not affect or
14	prevent a qualified employer from allowing a qualified employee to take
15	a leave that the qualified employee is otherwise entitled to take.
16	(c) This Section shall not affect a qualified employee's rights
17	with respect to any other employee benefit provided for in other laws."
18	Section 2. A new §4119.1 is hereby added to Chapter 4 of Title 4, Guam
19	Code Annotated, to read:
20	"§4119.1. Military Family Leave Act. The provisions of the Military
21	Family Leave Act of Guam (MFLAG) contained in Article 1A of Title 4, Guam
22	Code Annotated, shall apply to all qualified employees of the government of
23	Guam as defined in this Chapter."
