CHAPTER I

SHORT TITLE

Section 1. Short Title. This Act, together with any other appropriations
act for Fiscal Year 2007, shall collectively be known as the "Amended General
Appropriations Act of 2007". The Administrative and Miscellaneous Provisions
of any other appropriations act for Fiscal Year 2007 shall continue in effect and

incurred on or after October 1, 2006, but no later than September 30, 2007. If any

(b) Every Customer-Bank Communication Terminal (CBCT), automated teller machine (ATM), or cash dispensing machine that is not contiguous to a main or branch facility established and operated by a bank, credit union or a non-bank entity is subject to an annual licensing fee of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

(c) The Banking and Insurance Commissioner is hereby authorized to assess each bank licensed in Guam a fee of \$0.022 for every One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) of the total assets of such bank. The total assets of each licensed bank *shall* be determined from the audited financial statement or from the call report or financial statement for the period ending December 31st of each year it is filed with the Banking and Insurance Commissioner. In addition, the limitations on gross income 5 contained in the same items of §26203(k) are decreased from Five Hundred 6 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) effective May 1, 2007. 7 The provision contained in this Act 8 Section 107. Streetlight Fund. requiring that ten percent (10%) of all fees to be deposited into the Better Services 9 Fund shall not apply to the fees designated for deposit into the Streetlight Fund 10

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pursuant to 16 GCA Section 7161.

The Guam Fire Department shall retain authority to adopt additional fees and may amend the schedule of fees and charges in Exhibit 1 pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Law, provided that such fees are not less than those established by this Act.
- (c) Proceeds of the Guam Fire Department Fees for Services. The proceeds of all fees collected pursuant to this Act *shall* be deposited in the Fire, Life and Medical Emergency (FLAME) Fund as provided in Title 10 GCA §72106.

- (c) For each additional lot or parcel of land involved in any single transaction as listed in paragraphs (a) or (b), a fee of: Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per parcel.

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- (d) For recording or filing of each cancellation, satisfaction, dismissal, release, termination, waiver, withdrawal, easement, consent, grant, notices, rights of way, rights of entry, revocation or other lien: Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) with Five Dollars (\$5.00) for every attachment or exhibit thereon, plus Fifty Cents (\$.50) per page of the attachment or exhibit.
- (e) For recording or filing of an approved survey map a fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) plus Five Dollars (\$5.00) per additional sheet thereof plus Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per lot created by a subdivision or parceling survey map and said fee shall also apply to land registration, resubdivision, retracement, recertification, or revisions of survey maps.
- (f) For a certified or authenticated copy of a certificate of title or a certificate of guaranteed claim a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) or for a bail bond a fee of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) plus One Dollar (\$1.00) per endorsement on the memorial estate.
- For furnishing written reports on areas, ownerships, lot numbers, descriptions, or other recorded information, for each lot or parcel of land: Ten Dollars (\$10.00).
- (h) For reproducing services costing the government less than One Dollar (\$1.00), the Director of Land Management shall promulgate a schedule of fees thereof, all such fees to be under One Dollar (\$1.00) plus Fifty Cents (\$.50) charge for each additional page over five (5) pages.
- (i) For recording or filing any documents required to be recorded by law for which a fee has not been provided, for each page or fraction thereof: Five Dollars (\$5.00).

Section 1. Effective Date. (a) The effective date for all fees, charges, penalties, provision, exemptions and moratoriums, excluding any de-appropriation penalties, contained in this Act *shall* be May 1, 2007.

- (b) Public Notification. The Department of Revenue and Taxation, the Guam Fire Department, the Department of Land Management, the Department of Labor, the Professional Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors Board, the Contractors License Board, the Department of Parks and Recreation, and the Guam Police Department *shall* provide proper and timely public notice to the community regarding the new or adjusted fees, fines and penalties imposed by this Act. Beginning in 2008, all such departments and agencies *shall* conduct such hearings on an annual basis prior to April 1 of each year and *shall* regularly adjust existing fees, pursuant to the Administrative Adjudication Act, *or* implement new fees for the purpose of cost recovery."

Comprehensive Cancer Therapy Center Initiative. 21 22 Comprehensive Cancer Therapy Center. Said contract *or* public-private partnership agreement *shall* provide for the care of indigent patients under the Medically Indigent Program (MIP) and Medicaid Program and *shall* require that invoices for cancer treatment be paid within sixty (60) days after receipt."

- Section 7. Prohibition on the Use of Funds Received Through the Public Welfare Assistance Program for the Purchase of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco Products. (a) The use of public welfare assistance program funds for the purchase of alcoholic beverages or tobacco products is prohibited.

1 (b) Each welfare recipient who violates subsection (a) hereof shall be 2 penalized as follows: A first offense shall result in the revocation of benefits from the 3 program in question for a period not to exceed three (3) months. 4 (ii) A second offense *shall* result in the revocation of benefits from 5 the program in question for a period *not to exceed* six (6) months. (iii) A third offense shall result in the revocation of benefits from 7 the program in question for a period not to exceed one (1) year. Members of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund who meet the minimum eligibility requirements for retirement shall be permitted to retire upon the complete remittance of their outstanding individual contributions to the Fund. Such contributions shall include the employee and employer retirement contributions. Any and all fees, interest at actuarial rates, and penalties associated with the requirements set forth by the Government of Guam Retirement Fund shall be paid by the Government.

This Section does not restrict the continuing remittance of existing Retirement Fund contributions as required by law or as set forth by the Government of Guam Retirement Fund. By the fifteenth (15th) day of each month, the Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund *shall* provide a detailed report to the Speaker of *I Llheslaturan Guåhan* regarding said remittances and number of retirements for the prior month pursuant to this Section. Nothing herein *shall* be construed to abrogate any of the provisions of Public Law 28-38."

Section 25. The Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA) shall, in the future, enact all rules and regulations according to the Administrative Adjudication Act. GWA shall bring its current administrative rules and regulations into conformance with law, including the Administrative Adjudication Act, within one hundred twenty (120) days, or its rules shall be of no further force or effect. Any GWA employees or agents who enforce GWA rules and regulations shall specify, in writing, the rule or regulation being enforced or authorizing the action taken, without which specification said action shall be void. GWA employees or agents shall not be held personally liable for losses caused to ratepayers when acting at the direction of superiors, including the Consolidated Commission on Utilities, subject to the provisions of 4 GCA §3106, including costs incurred and attorney's fees, for actions undertaken in violation hereof."

- (b) The Chairperson, with the approval of the Commission, *shall* detail, in accordance with applicable Civil Service laws and personnel rules, and after consultation with the officials of the various instrumentalities of the Government of Guam, such personnel he deems necessary for the Commission to perform its duties.
- (c) The Commission *shall* formulate policy guidelines consistent with existing law that it *shall* follow in executing this Chapter.
- (d) The Commission *shall* suggest changes to existing law and new legislation and submit draft legislation to *I Liheslatura*.
- (e) The Commission *shall* conduct public hearings for the purposes of consulting with public officers and their employees and of reconciling conflicting interests that arise from modernization and streamlining.
- (f) The Commission shall consider and make use of such studies and recommendations as may be presented to it by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, the Department of Administration, the Bureau of Planning, the Department of Revenue and Taxation, the Office of the Public Auditor, the Civil Service Commission, the Office of the Attorney General of Guam, the University of Guam (UOG) School of Business and Public Administration, the Compiler of Laws, and such other governmental units or

agencies as it may designate, or such private entities and individuals as it may deem advisable.

- Eugenia Leon Guerrero UOG School of Business and Public Administration (SBPA) Building. The School of Business and Public Administration shall serve as the Secretariat of the Commission and shall provide administrative and professional services to the Commission. Logistical support and resources for the School of Business and Public Administration in support of the Commission shall be provided by the Bureau of Statistics and Plans and the Guam State Clearing House. If necessary, the School of Business and Public Administration shall provide a annual budget request to the Speaker of *I Liheslatura* on the Commission's behalf for Fiscal Year 2008.
 - (h) The Commission is authorized to:

- (1) review all legal mandates imposed on the government of Guam by existing law, including all unfunded and underfunded mandates (1950 to present);
- (2) recommend to *I Liheslatura* the merger, coordination, consolidation, *or* integration of departments, agencies, offices, instrumentalities, and functions of the government;
- (3) recommend to *I Liheslatura* the dissolution of departments, agencies, offices, instrumentalities, *or* functions which are *not* necessary for the efficient conduct of government functions, services and activities;

25	§13104. Evaluating Criteria. In its review of government agencies and in
26	proposing reforms pursuant to this Chapter, the following principles shall guide the

- (c) What are the savings, expenses, benefits and detriments of the options and consequences?
 - (d) Which options create the greatest savings and benefits for the people of Guam?

§13105. Timelines. The Commission shall submit an integrated plan of modernization and streamlining, which shall include all plans described by this Chapter, to I Maga'lahen Guåhan no later than November 1st, 2007. Within thirty (30) days after receipt, I Maga'lahi shall return the plan together with his comments thereon and revisions thereto to the Commission. The Commission shall, within thirty (30) days after the plan's return, submit to I Liheslaturan Guåhan the final plan, with or without further modification, together with a declaration that the plan will accomplish the purposes of this Chapter. No such plan shall become effective unless approved by I Liheslatura, which must either accept it or reject it in total. After approval, I Maga'lahi shall immediately implement the plan subject to the Appropriation Act for that fiscal year.

§13106. Provisions Regarding Personnel. If it is necessary to reduce the personnel of any instrumentality pursuant to the modernization and streamlining plan, Guam's Civil Service laws regarding reduction in workforce shall apply, provided, that no current employee shall lose employment. Employees affected by the plan may transfer to other positions in the government service with no loss in pay, no loss of civil service eligibility and no interruption of pay or benefits.

§13107. Guiding Principles. The Commission on Modernization of the Government of Guam (COM-21) *shall*:

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- a) Establish an administrative system that is transparent, development-oriented, and respectful of the current and future needs of the population;
- b) Consider past and present studies conducted by different entities in the government, the University of Guam, the federal government, and the private and non-profit sectors;
- c) Concentrate on factual analyses of conditions and problems on Guam to develop feasible recommendations for administrative improvement;
- d) Modernize and streamline administration to implement more effectively programs approved by *I Maga'lahi* and *I Liheslatura*;
- e) Promote the greatest possible output from the government's human, financial and other resources.
- f) Consolidate departments, agencies, offices, and other organizational units on the basis of major functions to minimize conflicts and duplication of activities and thus achieve simplicity, economy, and efficiency in government operations;
- g) Encourage administrative decentralization or delegation of authority that creates greater participation and more effective working relationships at various levels of management;
- h) Consider measures to clarify lines of authority, improve communication and strengthen accountability at various levels of management;
- i) Adopt measures that curtail and modify practices and attitudes that prevent sound, honest, ethical and effective public administration;
- j) Take into account appropriate cultural and environmental factors;

k) Organize modernization and streamlining panels, each of whi	ich

Hearings *shall* be conducted to seek input of knowledgeable individuals and professional groups. Proposals developed *shall* be reviewed by the Commission as a body through panel Chairpersons.
- (e) Panel reports *shall* be completed and submitted by June 1st, 2007 and *shall* subsequently be voted upon by the Commission, which *shall* obtain input from the departments, agencies and offices concerned and the general public. The Modernization and Streamlining Plan *shall* reflect the ideas and practical insights of a cross-section of the Guam community, including political representatives, career civil servants, technician, professors, business executives, labor leaders and others.
- (f) To maintain the integrity of the various modernization and streamlining plans and to insure legislative approval, *I Maga'lahi shall* issue an Executive Order creating the Governor's Committee to review and revise the Integrated Modernization and Streamlining Plan. The Committee *shall* assist *I Maga'lahi* in reviewing the proposals and *shall* obtain input from the Governor's cabinet and the community.
- (g) Upon submission of the Plan to *I Maga'lahi*, he *shall* immediately call a series of Cabinet meetings to discuss the Plan. Subsequently, *I Maga'lahi* may invite members of *I Liheslatura* from both parties to provide their opinions regarding the Plan."

Section 27. Subsection (d) of Section 4403 of Chapter 4, 4 GCA is *repealed* and *reenacted* to read:

"(d) All personnel actions regarding the classified service *shall* be filed with the Commission within twenty (20) days after their effective date. The Commission may set aside and declare null and void any personnel action if the Commission finds that it was taken in violation of personnel laws or rules, provided, however, that this Section *shall not* be deemed to permit appeals by employees from adverse actions not covered by Subsection (b) above. Prior to declaring any personnel action null and void, the Commission *shall* provide written notice of the alleged violation to the agency head. The agency head *shall* respond within ten (10) days after receipt of the notice to the Commission's proposed action. All actions taken by the Commission pursuant to this Section *shall* be taken within one hundred twenty (120) days after the personnel action is filed with the Commission. The Civil Service Commission *shall* submit its final decision to *I Liheslatura*. The Commission's decision *shall* be final but subject to judicial review."

Section 28. Effective sixty (60) days from the enactment of this Act, the nomenclature "Business Privilege Tax" shall be used in all laws, documents, regulations and on all official forms and documents of the government of Guam to describe any transactions or activities formerly described as the Gross Receipts Tax.

Section 29. Statement of Legislative Purpose. The Office of Finance and Budget was originally established by Section 23 of Public Law 25-176, a supplemental appropriations act to the General Appropriations Act of 2001, a section which has not been codified. This Act codifies the laws creating the Office of Finance and Budget and expands OFB's purpose, functions and duties.

OFFICE OF FINANCE AND BUDGET

§13101. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan recognizes the need for the independent forecasting of government revenues, with the minimum goal of adopting the best econometric model for the government of Guam. There is a need to compile and provide to I Liheslaturan Guåhan, I Maga'lahen Guåhan and the public, forecasts of revenues no less than five (5) years immediately beyond the operating budget year; expenditure information no less than five (5) years past; consistent year-by-year analysis of the impact of federal expenditures on Guam's economy and employment; and information related to the formulation of short and long-term fiscal policy.

Future fiscal policy must be consistent with government reorganization, performance-based budgeting, measurable program goals and transparency. The present relationship between traditional and performance-based budgeting is crucial to our fiscal maturity, a goal that requires improved articulation and standards to measure goal-driven objectives and practical technological applications in budget formulation.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan, therefore, hereby creates the Office of Finance and Budget ("OFB") to renew fiscal discipline through the practice of open government, cooperation between the legislative and executive branches, and the assignment of fiscal responsibility to appropriate government entities and officials, all to promote public confidence and government efficiency.

§13102. Creation of Office. There is hereby created, within *I* Liheslaturan Guåhan, under the supervision of the Committee on Ways and Means, or equivalent Standing Committee, the Office of Finance and Budget

("OFB"), organized and operating as *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* may from time to time provide through its Standing Rules.

§13103. Budget of Office. The budget of the OFB shall not be included as part of I Liheslaturan Guåhan's annual operating budget.

§13104. Purpose of Office. The OFB *shall* administer this Chapter and perform the responsibilities assigned to it by law and the Standing Rules. It *shall* coordinate and gather information relevant to government revenue projections, fiscal policy, legislative appropriations, taxation, revenue collection, government expenditures, general fund revenues, and special fund revenues.

§13105. Administration of Office. The Chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means, or equivalent Standing Committee, *shall* appoint a Director who *shall* administer the OFB and perform other duties as prescribed by law and the Standing Rules. The Director *shall* also be responsible for any and all matters assigned to OFB by the Chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means, or equivalent Standing Committee.

§13106. Duties of Office. The Office of Finance and Budget shall:

- (a) use all available resources to develop and adopt a model for Guam's existing and projected economy which *shall* simulate the effect of revenue raising, the effect of any proposed benefits, optional revenue generation and the utility thereof;
- (b) compile and provide to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, to *I Maga'lahi*, and to the public, forecasts of revenues, current and prior year expenditures, and surpluses or deficits;
 - (c) assess the impact of federal expenditures in Guam; and

(d) perform such other duties as are assigned to it by the Standing Rules of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* or the Chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means.

§13107. Special Accounting Service. There is hereby established a Special Accounting Service work group comprised of a senior staff member of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan's* Office of Finance and Budget; the Controller of the Department of Administration; the Chief of the Taxpayer Services Administration Branch of the Department of Revenue and Taxation; and the Budget Analyst Supervisor of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research. Said service *shall* meet from time to time to discuss and develop recommendations on fiscal policy, provide technical assistance to the Office of Finance and Budget, and share information relative to government finances. The senior staff member of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan's* Office of Finance and Budget *shall* serve as Chairperson of the Special Accounting Service.

§13108. Special Economic Service. There *shall* be a Special Economic Service work group comprised of the Chairman of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan's* Committee on Ways and Means, *or* equivalent Standing Committee; the Director of the Office of Finance and Budget; the Public Auditor; the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research; the Director of Revenue and Taxation; the Director of Administration; the Administrator of the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority; the Senior Economist of the Department of Labor; the Chief Planner of the Bureau of Statistics and Plans; and the Administrator of Research and Evaluation (Research Manager) of the Guam Visitors Bureau. Said Service *shall* meet from time to time to discuss and develop recommendations on economic policy, provide technical assistance to the

Office of Finance and Budget, and share information relative to the state of the economy. The Chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means, or equivalent Standing Committee, *shall* serve as Chairperson of the Special Economic Service.

§13109. Executive Branch Accounting, Financial, and Economic Services. I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall provide the Office of Finance and Budget with any and all information and services it requires to fully execute this Chapter.

- (a) Reports. I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall report to I Liheslaturan Guåhan as follows:
 - (1) No later than thirty (30) days after the end of each month of a fiscal year, the revenue tracking for the General Fund, the Tourist Attraction Fund, Solid Waste Operations Fund (Tipping Fees), Territorial Education Facilities Fund, and the Guam Highway Fund for the balance of the fiscal year, based upon the actual collections of the preceding month, and prepare a comparative statement of "actual" and "projected" revenues. Such information shall be compiled in a report, in collaboration with the Director of Revenue and Taxation and the Director of Administration, certified by the Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, and submitted to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than thirty (30) days after the end of each month of the fiscal year;
 - (2) On July 1, 2007, and on a semiannual basis thereafter, the impact of federal expenditures, including projections of federal expenditures on Guam, on Guam's economic growth, employment, tax revenues, and other variables, for the next year compared with the previous five (5) years; identify significant federal expenditures or

potential expenditures on Guam affecting military bases, installations, active duty and retired military personnel within Guam, as well as any impact of the changes in these expenditures. Such information *shall* be compiled in a report, certified by a majority of the members of the Special Economic Service, and submitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*;

- (3) On July 1, 2007, and on a semiannual basis thereafter, the impact of tourism expenditures on Guam's economy and employment, including projections of tourism expenditures on Guam, on Guam's economic growth, employment, tax revenues, and other variables, for the next year compared with the previous five (5) years; identify significant tourism expenditures *or* potential expenditures coming into Guam affecting tourism as well as the impact of the changes in these expenditures. Such information *shall* be compiled in a report, certified by a majority of the members of the Special Economic Service, and submitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*; and
- (4) Long-range forecasts of revenues and expenditures for each of the five (5) years immediately beyond the budget year. Such information *shall* be compiled in a report, certified by a majority of the members of the Special Economic Service and submitted to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*."
- Section 30. §23 of Public Law 25-176 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- Section 31. Public Law 27-19 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- Section 32. Public Law 27-42 is hereby *repealed* in its entirety.
- Section 33. Public Law 28-149, Chapter II, Part VII is hereby *repealed* in its entirety.

- (a) Fraud. Fraud *or* misrepresentation of any material fact in the application for such Certificate;

- (e) Noncompliance with laws and rules. Failure to comply with any provision of this Chapter *or* with the applicable rules and regulations of the Authority."

Section 35. Executive Branch Travel Restrictions. Funds appropriated by this Act, *shall not* be used for off-island travel *or* per diem by executive branch employees and officials except for:

(a) Travel that is federally funded;

- (b) Travel that is specifically required to administer *or* secure federal grant programs;
- (c) Travel by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, I Segundu Na Maga'lahen Guåhan, Mayors and Vice-Mayors, and other officials to represent the people of Guam at meetings and functions deemed critical to the well-being of the people of Guam by I Maga'lahen Guåhan, provided that the Director of Administration shall provide a monthly report to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan on such travel expenses by the 5th day of each subsequent month thereafter;
- (d) Travel to promote tourism on Guam, provided that such travel is paid for by the Tourist Attraction Fund and is restricted to the General Manager *or* his designee, Board Members, professional staff of the Guam Visitors Bureau, and those individuals required for promotional activities;
- (e) Travel by law enforcement personnel providing escort services for criminal suspects, detainees, and convicted felons being returned to Guam for judicial proceedings or being transferred to off-island correctional facilities;
- (f) Travel by medical personnel providing escort services for patients requiring off-island medical treatment, and other escorts as specifically authorized by the Department of Public Health and Social Services pursuant to Guam law;
- (g) Travel necessary for the enforcement of court orders;

(h) Travel under the Residential Treatment Fund;

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- 2 (i) Travel required for employees requiring professional certification and training.
- Section 36. Wireless Communications Restrictions. Notwithstanding any 4 5 other provision of law, no government of Guam funds shall be expended for the 6 use of cellular telephones, cellular telephone service and other wireless telephone 7 service. This Section shall apply to the expenditure of any or all government of 8 Guam funds, regardless of source and inclusive of all funds expended by 9 autonomous agencies. Government of Guam funds may be spent on wireless 10 telephone service if the government of Guam will be reimbursed from Federal 11 funds or other grants. This Section shall not apply to I Maga'lahen Guåhan, I 12 Segundu Na Maga'lahen Guåhan, the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Chief 13 Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court 14 of Guam, the Crisis Hotline Program of the Department of Mental Health and 15 Substance Abuse (for official use only), law enforcement officials, and on-call 16 health professionals at the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Department of Public Health and Social 17 Services, the Village Mayors and Vice Mayors, GFD and EMS officials, on-call 18 19 emergency management personnel and the Guam Medical Examiner."
 - Section 37. Restriction on the Home Use of Government of Guam Vehicles. Except where *expressly* permitted by 4 GCA, §1103(c), no government of Guam owned, leased *or* rented vehicles may be driven home by an employee unless such employee is on call as an emergency first responder.
 - Section 38. §3111 of Chapter 3, Title 2 GCA is amended to read:
 - "§3111. Oaths and Affirmations. The Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan,
 or the Chairperson of a Committee, or their designee, including the legislative
 Sergeant-at-Arms or Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms, may administer oaths or

affirmations to a witness in any matter under examination in furtherance of a legislative proceeding, whether he is under subpoena *or* not, except that oaths *shall* be administered to all witnesses whenever fiscal matters are under examination."

Section 39. Revenue Tracking Report. Section 5 of Chapter V of Public Law 28-150 is *amended* to read:

"Section 5. Revenue Tracking Report. The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research, in collaboration with the Director of Revenue and Taxation and the Director of Administration shall determine, no later than thirty (30) days after the end of each month of Fiscal Year 2007, the revenue tracking for the balance of the fiscal year, based upon the actual collections of the preceding month and prepare a comparative statement of the "actual and "projected" revenues. Such information shall be compiled in a report, certified by each of the aforementioned Directors and submitted to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan no later than thirty (30) days after the end of each month of the fiscal year. Such reports shall be submitted in written and electronic format and shall be posted quarterly on the Bureau of Budget and Management Research's website."

Section 40. Additional Revenues to General Fund. Except as otherwise provided for by this Act, exclusive of Guam Fire Department Fees, Alien Labor Certification Fees and fees deposited into the Better Public Services Fund, all revenues resulting from adjusted or new fees adopted by this Act shall be deposited into the General Fund.

Section 41. The Department of Revenue and Taxation *shall* include in its proposed fiscal year budget the costs, expenses, and attorney fees *or* salaries necessary for the Office of the Attorney General to provide legal services to the Department.

- (a) Authorizing the Solicitation, Acceptance, Use and Administration of Gifts, Bequests and Donations by the Guam Medical Referral Office. The Administrator of the Guam Medical Referral Office may solicit, accept, use and administer gifts, bequests and donations on behalf of the Guam Medical Referral Office. The Administrator shall deposit said funds into the Guam Medical Referral Office Trust Fund created by Subsection (b) hereof. Said fund shall be used for operations of the various Medical Referral Offices outside of Guam, except for privatized operations in the Republic of the Philippines, for purposes stated and intended by the donor that are consistent with the duties of the Guam Medical Referral Office. The Administrator shall submit to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the Public Auditor, and post on the office's website, a quarterly report identifying each donor and the amounts donated, including the fair market value of all gifts, bequests and donations, and describing the solicitation, acceptance, use and administration of gifts, bequests and donations.
 - (b) Creation of a Guam Medical Referral Office Trust Fund. There is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam, a special fund known as the "Guam Medical Referral Office Trust Fund." The Fund shall not be commingled with the General Fund or any other funds of the government of Guam. The Administrator of the Guam Medical Referral Office shall be the administrator of the Fund, may issue warrants of expenditure and shall maintain a record of all donations and expenditures.

- Section 43. Section 4 Chapter IV Part I of Public Law 28-150 is hereby amended to read:
- "Section 4. Transfer Authority of I Maga'lahen Guahan. I Maga'lahen Guahan is authorized to transfer funds between Fiscal Year 2007 General Fund Executive Branch appropriations provided that he shall transfer no more than fifteen percent (15%) of the appropriations made to the Department of Law, the

- 1 Mayors Council, the University of Guam, the Guam Community College, the
- 2 Guam Public School System and the Guam Public School System Operations
- 3 Fund. I Maga'lahen Guahan shall provide a monthly report to the Speaker of I
- 4 Liheslaturan Guahan on all transfers from or to the Special Funds, the Department
- 5 of Law, the University of Guam, the Guam Community College, the Guam Public

- 18 Section 45. Reductions. The appropriations for the departments and
- agencies' operations contained in Chapters III and IV of this Act shall be further
- 20 reduced by the respective amounts itemized in the attached Appendix."
- 21 Section 46. Prohibition on the Use of Appropriations to Fill Vacant
- 22 **Positions.** Upon the effective date of this Act, appropriations made by Public Law
- 23 28-149, Public Law 28-150 or this Act shall not be used to hire full-time

9	textbooks according to their varying scholastic abilities, the following curriculum

The chairperson shall make appointments from both the public and the private school sectors. The Board shall also establish two subcommittees, one of which shall be composed of educators from the public schools and the other of educators from the private schools. Each subcommittee shall examine textbooks and make recommendations thereon to the Committee, which will then make recommendations for adoption or disapproval of the proposals to the Board. Textbooks and other instructional materials adopted for each grade and subject field shall come from a multiple listing to meet the varying ability levels of elementary and secondary students in the territory. The Board shall also establish a textbook adoption calendar setting forth the subjects or courses for each grade level that are to be selected and ordered each year, on a rotation basis, not to exceed seven (7) years of continuous use for any one (1) textbook, and the critical dates to be met each year. In addition, the Board shall establish a similar but separate calendar for the textbook ordering process which will ensure that new and replacement textbooks are available in the classroom for the opening of school each year.

(d) It shall be the duty of the Committee to:

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- (1) Establish the criteria for the selection of texts for use by students attending public and private schools in Guam and ensure that such criteria are met;
- (2) Review the curriculum changes and textbook adoption proposals submitted to it by the subcommittees, and make recommendations to the

Board to adopt *or* disapprove proposals of the subcommittees, and state the reasons therefore;

- (3) Review the list of textbooks requested by the public and private schools for the next school year to ensure that the textbooks were selected from the multiple listing of textbooks adopted by the Board;
- (4) Recommend to the Board the amount of advance appropriation necessary to purchase the textbooks; and
- (5) Ensure that the textbook adoption calendar and the textbook ordering calendar established by the Board are adhered to.
- (e) No school official or member of any committee or subcommittee created by the Board *shall* accept any emolument, money, *or* other valuable thing, *or* any inducement to directly *or* indirectly introduce, recommend, vote for, *or* otherwise influence the adoption *or* purchase of any textbooks *or* other instructional materials. Anyone who violates any of these prohibitions *shall* be guilty of a misdemeanor and *shall* be removed from the position occupied.
- (f) The Board *shall* select and adopt a multiple list of textbooks for use by elementary and secondary grades. The list of textbooks *shall* be based on the recommendations of the subcommittees established pursuant to subsections (c) and (d) of this Section. The list *shall* consist of textbooks for each subject matter *or* course that address the varying scholastic abilities of students in Guam's schools. The Board *shall* act on the recommendation of the subcommittees and Committee within thirty (30) days after submission.
- (g) It is the policy of the Board that no public funds *shall* be expended to purchase religious *or* sectarian books, *or* books used for religious *or* sectarian purposes.
- Section 48. Pursuant to the Personnel Rules and Regulation of the Department of Administration, no permanent classified employee of any

- department or agency of the government of Guam shall be subject to layoff or
- 2 furlough before the following categories of employees within said department or
- 3 agency have been first subjected to layoff or furlough. All layoff or furlough
- 4 actions *shall* be imposed in the following order:

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- 1. Part time, short term *or* seasonal employees (unclassified employees shall be considered short term *or* seasonal);
 - 2. Provisional employees;
 - 3. Temporary *or* limited term employees; and
 - 4. Probational (initial) employees.
 - Section 49. Review of Business Privilege Tax Exemptions. Each business privilege tax exemption authorized in §26203 of 11 GCA shall be evaluated by the Legislative Tax Review Commission pursuant to Chapter 11 of 2 GCA, using the principles of economic efficiency, equity, simplicity, administrative feasibility, accountability and regarding the purpose of economic growth. The Commission shall provide its evaluation of said exemptions and make recommendations for permanent repeal or reauthorization thereof to I Maga'lahen Guåhan and I Liheslatura no later than September 1, 2007.

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ARTICLE I AMBULANCE SERVICES (NON-EMERGENCY) CHAPTER 1 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

- A. SCOPE. To establish the Guam Fire Department's policy, rules or regulations, and fee Schedule for the non-emergency use of Ambulance Services.
- **B. DEFINITION.** For the purpose of this Chapter, the following definitions apply:
 - 1. Ambulance Services is the use or temporary deployment of the department's ambulance or it's attending Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), to treat or transport sick or injured persons, ambulatory or non-ambulatory, to or from a medical facility; or remain on alert status at events, concerts, games, races, promotions, functions, or activities requiring the same presence.
 - 2. Non-emergency Service is that which does not fall under the definition of "Emergency Service" as defined by the American College of Emergency Physicians.

The following examples would demonstrate the need for urgent or unscheduled medical care in the prudent layperson's opinion based on an average knowledge of medicine and health. This list is not intended to be all encompassing for all medical conditions or situations that may arise and should be used only to conceptually embrace an unlimited number of medical abnormalities that could constitute an emergent situation based on the person's current physical or mental condition.

Examples of these services (Emergency Services) would include the following:

23	1. Persons requesting for an ambulance stand-by Service must call the

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- 2. Fees will be charged from the time a unit arrives at a stand-by until the time the unit leaves the scene.
- 3. Adjustments will be made to the charges should Guam Fire Department be unable to meet the scheduled time or must remove a unit from a stand-by.
- 4. A Stand-by Service which is not cancelled prior to the required twenty-four (24) hour notice will be billed for one (1) hour of service.

See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

E. GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT'S RESPONSIBILITY.

- 1. The Guam Fire Department's primary medical mission is to emergency patients. Therefore, no ambulance can be said to be dedicated to a Stand-By Service. The Guam Fire Department will do its best to have its unit arrive promptly and remain at the location for the time duration requested. If a unit must be pulled from a Stand-By Service to respond to an Emergency, the Guam Fire Department will do its best to replace that unit within fifteen (15) minutes. If this is not possible, appropriate adjustments will be made to the stand-by charges based on the time a unit returns to the scene.
- 2. The Guam Fire Department will schedule an ambulance for each Stand-By Service Requested, however, at the time of the service, if an ambulance is not immediately available because of an emergency, the department has the option to temporarily replace the unit with another

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patient transport. An ambulance will be placed at the scene as soon as possible upon availability.

3. Should an ambulance unit not be available at all for the entire duration of the Stand-By Service due to shortage of ambulances, other units manned by Emergency Medical Technicians such as Engine Companies and Rescue Units will be utilized for such Stand-By services.

F. COLLECTION OF FEES.

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- 1. An invoice will be mailed to the requesting organization or individual within fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due within thirty (30) days of the statement date.
- 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who shall deposit these collections in the Guam Fire Department's Fire, Life and Medical Emergency Fund ("FLAME").
- 3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts. Subsequent reminder notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within fifteen (15) days of the date of the issuance.

G. SCHEDULING, NON-EMERGENCY PATIENT TRANSPORT SERVICES.

- 1. Requests for non-emergency patient transport services will be categorized as follows:
 - a. Routine Scheduled Transports.

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- i. This category will include all transports which can be scheduled at east forty-eight (48) hours ahead of time. Examples may be: weekly therapy, doctor's appointments, lab services, etc.
- ii. An individual may request for a Routine Scheduled Transport by calling the Emergency Medical Services/Rescue Division Office at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance.
- iii. Individuals should schedule the patient transport at the same time as they are scheduling the appointment with the clinic or lab to ensure that transport service is available at the proposed appointment time.
- iv. If this coordinated scheduling is not done, and there are multiple transports and conflicting schedules, a patient may be requested to change his appointment time or date.
- v. The Guam Fire Department will call the contact person, on the day of the scheduled transport, to verify and confirm the service requested.
- vi. A person requesting a Routine Scheduled Transport service, who does not cancel the same before an ambulance checks out to the requested location, will be charged as provided for in Chapter 2 Fee Schedule for Ambulance Stand-by and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services, Section(4).

See Chapter 2 Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Service

b. Unscheduled Transport.

i. This category will include all transports which cannot be scheduled forty-eight (48) hours ahead of time. (Examples may be: transport of

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patients' release from Guam Memorial Hospital, special transports from G.M.H. to lab for inpatients, etc.).

- ii. Individuals may request for unscheduled transports by contacting the Guam Fire Department Integrated Emergency Communications Center (E 9-1-1/Fire Dispatch).
- iii. Requests received with less than twelve (12) hours notice will be entertained as best as possible by the Guam Fire Department Ambulance service. Emergency responses will take priority and non-emergency services may be delayed.
- iv. A person(s) requesting a Routine Schedule Transport Service, who does not cancel the same before an ambulance checks out to the requested location, will be charged as provided in Chapter 2 Fee Schedule for Ambulance standby and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services, Section(4).

See Chapter 2 Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

- 2. All requests for transports shall comply with the following procedures.
- a. Upon calling the appropriate office to request the transport, the following information must be provided:
 - i. Name of person requesting.
 - ii. Location/address of patient pick-up.
 - iii. Location/address of the destination to transport the patient.
 - iv. Time of scheduled appointment (if applicable)
 - v. Time of requested pick-up
 - vi. Name and phone number of contact person.

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- vii. Patients' complete mailing address.
- viii. Name of an insurance carrier (if any).
- b. Individual requesting services should notify the intended receiving party (doctors' office, clinic, lab, etc.) that appointment times be flexible as the Guam Fire Department cannot guarantee an arrival time at the destination.
- c. Patients must be accompanied by an appropriate family member or care giver.
- d. If the patient is unaccompanied and staff and facilities (wheelchair, stretcher, etc.) are not available at the receiving facility to monitor the patient, the G.F.D. ambulance crew will remain with the patient, however, additional fees for this service will be charged.

3. The caller requesting the service will be given a Non-Emergency Transport Service number which will be used for future reference to the request.

H. FEES, NON-EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.

- 1. Fees for all non-emergency transports will be charged a flat trip rate, regardless of distance or time required for transport; except that Wait Time Fees will be added to the charge if the allotted time stipulated below is exceeded.
- 2. The Trip Rate will encompass travel time to the pick-up point, a maximum fifteen (15) minute wait and load time at the pick-up point, travel time from the pick-up point to the delivery point, and a maximum fifteen (15) minute wait and off-load time.
- 3. If the wait, by the ambulance crew, at the time of pick-up or delivery exceeds fifteen (15) minutes, a fee per each fifteen (15) minutes will be charged.

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4. Any Wait Time will be based on the ambulance crew's arrival at the scene time and en route to location time, or the arrival at location time and ready for service time, as received and recorded by the Guam Fire Department Integrated Emergency Communications Center – E 9-1-1/Fire Dispatch,

I. COLLECTION OF FEES, NON-EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.

- 1. An invoice will be mailed to the requesting organization or individual within fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due within thirty (30) days of the statement date.
- 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who shall deposit these collections in the Guam Fire Department's Fire, Life and Medical Emergency Fund "FLAME", Title 10 GCA §72106.
- 3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts. Subsequent reminder notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within fifteen (15) days of the date of issuance.

See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

J. COLLECTION OF FEES, EMERGENCY TRANSPORT SERVICES.

- 1. An invoice will be mailed to the individual or the individual's Health Insurance Company within fifteen (15) days of the service provided. Payment is due within thirty (30) days of the statement date.
- 2. All payment shall be remitted to the Treasurer of Guam, who shall deposit these collections in the Guam Fire Department's Guam Fire Department's Fire, Life and Medical Emergency Fund "FLAME", Title 10 GCA §72106.

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3. Penalty charges will be assessed on delinquent accounts. Subsequent reminder notices shall reflect such charges, which are due within fifteen (15) days of the date of issuance.

See Chapter 2 of Article 1: Fee Schedule for Stand-By Services and Non-Emergency Patient Transport Services.

K. SERVICES APPEAL.

Any person seeking relief from a decision, action or inaction of a member of the Guam Fire Department, on matters concerning this article, shall present, either verbally or in writing, an appeal and recommended solution to the Fire Chief. The Fire Chief shall investigate the matter, and accordingly, determine the course of action. Written appeals require that the Fire Chief notify the appellant in writing of the Fire Chief's decision. Verbal appeals will require that the appellant make contact with the Fire Chief for notification of the Fire Chief's decision.

CHAPTER 5 – INSPECTIONS

The Guam Fire Department (G.F.D.) will take reasonable measures to ensure that uniform fire code compliance is continually maintained and not just occasionally on or about

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remit renewal date or on notice of inspection possibility; protect the integrity of its Fire revention Program; and address citizen concerns or complaints.

The following provides the procedures for:

- A. Inspections for Occupancy Clearance.
- B. Inspections for New Permits.
- C. Inspections for Permit Renewals
- D. Unannounced Inspections for Existing Permit Holders.
- E. Unannounced Inspections for other regulations by the Uniform Fire Code.

First Inspection. The inspector *shall* conduct the inspection for code compliance. *If* code compliance has not been achieved, except for new permit applicants, the following may result: inspection fee assessed and/or a citation issued. Re-inspections *shall* be made until code compliance has been obtained, providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done.

In all cases, an inspection report shall be filled out and a copy given to the responsible person.

Re-inspection(s). The inspector *shall* conduct the inspection for code compliance and assess a re-inspection fee. *If* code compliance has not been achieved, re-inspections will be made after providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A citation may also be issued and/or the establishment closed.

In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the responsible person.

A. INSPECTIONS FOR OCCUPANCY CLEARANCE

Inspections for Occupancy Clearance will be conducted after completion of construction of new or renovated buildings. This inspection is not considered a First

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Inspection and does not include a permit fee. (See Fee Schedule for Permits). Fees for inspections for Occupancy Clearance include Plan Review and inspections up to issuance of Fire Safety Certificate. (See Fee Schedule for Occupancy Clearance on Chapter 3).

The Uniform Fire Code authorizes the Chief, Fire Prevention Division, hereinafter known as: *Fire Marshal* to issue "Conditional Clearance" for Occupancy Clearance. Conditional Clearances are granted with a_specified time frame given for applicant to come into full compliance with the Fire Code. Inspections conducted upon full compliance of the code or expiration of conditional clearance, whichever occurs first, will be assessed a re-inspection fee.

B. INSPECTIONS FOR NEW PERMITS

New permits must be preceded by an inspection for code compliance. There is no charge for this First Inspection; it is included in the permit fee which must be received by the G.F.D. at the One Stop Building Permit/Business Service Center, before a permit is issued. See Fee schedule for Permit.

If code compliance cannot be achieved during this inspection, the Inspector shall schedule a re-inspection, providing reasonable time, dependant on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will be charged for each re-inspection. See Fee Payment Schedule for Inspections.

C. INSPECTIONS FOR PERMIT RENEWALS

All permit renewals must be preceded by an inspection for code compliance. If not in compliance, the inspector shall schedule a re-inspection, providing reasonable time, dependant on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will be charged for each re-inspection. See Fee Payment Schedule for Inspections.

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Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeat violations within the past two (2) years. Citation normally will not be issued on the First Inspection. Citations for violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

Exception: Citation issued for violations which present imminent life hazards such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted areas, failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not require prior notice.

There is no charge for the First Inspection; it is included in the permit fee, which must be received by the G.F.D. at the One Stop Building Permit/Business License Service Center before a permit is renewed. (See Fee Schedule for Permits).

In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the responsible person.

D. UNANNOUNCED INSPECTIONS FOR EXISTING PERMIT HOLDERS

Unannounced inspections may be conducted for code compliance by any duly authorized official of the Guam Fire Department on any building and premises, business, activity, engagement, or function regulated by the applicable code at all reasonable times.

If not in compliance, the Inspector shall schedule a re-inspection, providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will be charged for this inspection (only if a violation is noted) and each re-inspection. Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeat violations within the past two (2) years.

Citations normally will not be issued on the First Inspection. Citations for violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

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EXEMPTION: Citations Issued for violations which present imminent life hazards such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted areas, failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not require prior notice.

In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the responsible person.

E. UNANNOUNCED INSPECTIONS FOR OTHERS REGULATED BY THE UNIFORM FIRE CODE.

Unannounced inspections may be conducted by any duly authorized official of the Guam Fire Department on any building and premises, business, activity, engagement, or function regulated by the applicable code at all reasonable times.

If not in compliance, the inspector shall schedule a re-inspection after providing reasonable time, dependent on the hazard and danger created by the violation and the complexity of the work to be done, until code compliance has been obtained. A fee will be charged for this inspection (only if a violation is noted) and each re-inspection. Citation may also be issued for imminent life hazards and/or repeated violations within the past two (2) years.

Citations normally will not be issued on the First Inspection. Citations for violations will generally be issued upon re-inspection(s).

EXCEPTIONS: Citation issued for violations which present imminent life hazards such as trespassing in a closed area, smoking in closed or restricted areas, failure to obey the lawful orders of a fire inspector, faulty equipment or procedures, repeat violations, and violations of a similar nature will not require prior notice.

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In all cases, an inspection report *shall* be filled out and a copy given to the responsible person.

ARTICLE III

CHAPTER 1 - GRACE PERIODS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH THE UFC.

§73112 of 10 Guam Code Annotated authorizes the Guam Fire Department to promulgate rules setting forth grace periods within which parties not in conformance with Uniform Fire Code shall bring their premises up to code. The following grace periods have been established within which existing buildings shall be brought to conformance with the Uniform Fire Code.

A. Life-Safety Requirements for Existing Buildings Other Than High Rise.

Within eighteen (18) months after the owner of an existing building other than a high rise has been notified of life-safety violations, plans for compliance shall be submitted and approved, and within eighteen (18) months thereafter the work shall be completed or the building shall be vacated until made to confirm.

B. Life-Safety Requirements for Existing High Rise Buildings

Plans and specifications for the necessary alterations *shall* be filed with the Chief within the time periods are not physically practical or pose an undue hardship. The granting of an extension of time for compliance shall be based upon the showing of good cause and subject to the filing of an acceptable systematic progressive plan of correction with the Chief.

C. Appeals

Appeals of the determinations of the Chief in applying the provisions of this code may be made by an appeal directed to the board of appeals as established by Sections 103.4. of the Uniform Fire Code."

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other

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provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
