AN ACT TO AMEND §§3108, 3111, 3115, 3117 (a) AND 3119, AND TO ADD A NEW §3111.1, ALL OF CHAPTER 3, TITLE 17 GCA, RELATIVE TO THE GUAM EDUCATION POLICY BOARD; AND TO AMEND CHAPTER 11 OF TITLE 17 GCA, RELATIVE TO THE EDUCATION SURUHANU.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. § 3108 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is

3 amended to read:

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"§ 3108. Attorney for the Board. The Board is authorized and may employ an attorney to assist and represent it during any meetings and in all civil matters. The Board *shall* set the terms and conditions for

employment of the attorney or law firm. The Board *shall* determine whether the appointment is a part-time, unclassified employee or an independent consultant. The Board is authorized to expend funds for hiring an attorney or procuring legal services."

Section 2. § 3111 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

- "§ 3111. Guam Education Policy Board. There is hereby created a Guam Education Policy Board (Board). The Board *shall* consist of at least eleven (11) members as follows:
 - (a) Nine (9) District Elected Voting Members. Beginning with the 2008 General Election, nine (9) members of the Board *shall* be elected through district-wide elections in a General Election and in the manner described in § 3111.1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, *except* for the student member and non-voting members, unclassified and contracted employees of the Executive and Legislative Branches and all employees of the Guam Public School System are *not* eligible to run. The candidates must be at least twenty-five (25) years old, and at least two (2) year resident of Guam, and a resident and domiciliary in that District the candidate will be representing for at least two (2) years immediately preceding the date on which the member takes office and continuing throughout the term. All candidates for the Board must be citizens of the United States of America.
 - (b) One (1) Student Non-Voting Member. One (1) student member of the Board *shall* be elected by the Island-wide Board of Governing Students.

(c) Appointed Non-Voting Member. The Board *shall* appoint one (1) non-voting member from a list of *not less than* three (3) nominees by the exclusive bargaining unit which represents teachers and other employees in the GPSS. The non-voting member *shall* serve a term of one (1) year.

- (d) Additional Non-voting members. The Board may add nonvoting, ex-officio members as needed. The terms for such ex-officio members *shall* be determined by the Board.
- (e) Votes needed for Action. Unless expressly provided for elsewhere by public law, actions of the Board are carried by a vote of five (5) voting members.
- (f) Quorum. A quorum for meetings of the Board *shall* consist of five (5) voting members."

Section 3. § 3115 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

- "§ 3115. Same: Term of Office of Elected Members. The members of the Board *shall* be elected by district at the next General Election or Special Election. The terms of office of Board members elected pursuant to this Section *shall* commence at 12:00 noon on the first Monday in January immediately following the date they were elected and terminate at 11:59 a.m. on the first Monday in January four (4) years hence, except as provided in § 3111.1 of this Chapter."
- **Section 4.** § 3117 (a) of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated, as contained in P.L. 28-150:V:36 and 38 (Sept. 30, 2006), to take effect on the election date of 2008, is *amended* to read:
- "§ 3117. Same: Vacancies. (a) Any vacancies, including initial vacancies, of elected member positions occurring on the Board shall be

filled forthwith by appointment of the unsuccessful candidate from the same district in which the vacancy occurs who received the next highest number of votes in the board election, *provided* that the individual received greater than fifty percent (50%) of the number of votes received by the declared winner of that seat. In the event that the individual declines or there is no candidate meeting the criteria in this § 3117 (a), *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* (the Governor of Guam) *shall* appoint a member for the term or remaining term of office, subject to confirmation by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* (the Guam Legislature). Vacancies, including initial vacancies, *shall* be filled by a person from the same district(s) in which the vacancies occur."

Section 5. § 3119 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is amended to read:

"§ 3119. Same: Officers of the Board. Officers of the Board shall include the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, and such other positions which the Board deems necessary to effectively carry out its responsibilities. Such Board officers upon election shall serve for a term of one (1) year. Board officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the members of the Board during one (1) of the Board's meetings held in January of each year. Members may serve as Chairperson for multiple terms, except that no person may serve as Chairperson for more than two (2) consecutive terms at a time."

Section 6. A new § 3111.1 of Chapter 3 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is *added* to read:

"§ 3111.1 Provision for Staggered Elections. (a) Except as provided in Subsection (b) of this § 3111.1, each member of the Board shall be elected to serve a term of four (4) years, commencing at 12:00 noon on the first Monday in January following their election.

(b) A	At the election for members of the Board held at the General
Election in N	November 2008, and only at this election, four (4) candidates,
one (1) from	each of the four (4) districts, shall each serve four (4) year
terms, and fiv	ve (5) candidates shall each serve two (2) year terms as follows:

(1) Upon the Guam Election Commission's determination of the nine (9) successful candidates, the successful candidate in each district who received the highest number of votes *shall* be certified to serve a four (4) year term. The remaining successful candidates in each district *shall* be certified to serve two (2) year terms."

Section 7. Chapter 11 of Title 17 Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 11

OFFICE OF THE ADEQUATE EDUCATION SURUHANU (OMBUDSMAN)

§1100. Creation of Office. The Office of the Adequate Education Suruhanu (hereinafter referred to as the 'Education Suruhanu') is hereby established as an independent entity of the government of Guam. It is operationally independent from I Maga'lahen Guåhan, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Guam Public School System (GPSS) and the Guam Education Policy Board (Board). I Maga'lahen Guåhan, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, GPSS or the Board shall not prevent, impair, or prohibit the Education Suruhanu from initiating, carrying out, or completing his duties. The Education Suruhanu shall be the head of the office.

§1101. Qualifications. (a) The Education *Suruhanu* shall be a person of judgment, objectivity and integrity who can analyze problems of law, administration and public policy.

(b) No Education Suruhanu shall:

l	(1) engage in political party activities;
2	(2) be a candidate for or hold either elective or
3	appointive public office;
4	(3) engage in any other occupation, business or
5	profession; or
6	(4) be a former or current employee of GPSS or be a
7	member of the Board within two (2) years of that individual's
8	period of service.
9	(c) The Education Suruhanu shall have the following
10	educational/professional requirements:
11	(1) be a citizen of the United States and a resident of
12	Guam;
13	(2) be an active member in good standing of the Guam
14	Bar Association on Guam for at least two (2) years;
15	(3) not have been convicted of a felony; and
16	(4) not have been suspended from the practice of law in
17	any jurisdiction for violation of ethical rules governing the
18	practice of attorneys.
19	§1102. Removal and Termination. (a) The Education Suruhanu
20	may only be removed from office for cause as described in Subsection (b) of
21	this Section within the three (3) year appointment by I Maga'lahen Guåhan,
22	who must then report the reasons for the removal to I Liheslaturan Guåhan
23	within twenty-four (24) hours.
24	(b) Only the following are cause for termination:
25	(1) holding financial interests that conflict with the
26	conscientious performance of his duties:

1	(2) engaging in financial transactions using confidential or
2	non-public GPSS information or allowing the improper use of such
3	information to further any private interests;
4	(3) solicitation or acceptance of any item of value from any
5	person or entity seeking official action from, doing business with, or
6	conducting activities regulated by GPSS, or from persons whose
7	financial interests may be substantially affected by the performance of
8	the Education Suruhanu 's duties or the functions of GPSS;
9	(4) knowingly making commitments or promises that purport
10	to bind GPSS, except as permitted by law;
11	(5) using his position for his private gain or that of others;
12	(6) failing to disclose waste, abuse and corruption to the
13	appropriate authorities;
14	(7) failing to respect the rights and privacy of others and using
15	his position or authority to injure another person for personal reasons
16	or malicious purposes;
17	(8) committing fraud or misrepresentation in securing his
18	appointment;
19	(9) refusal or failure to perform duties mandated by law;
20	(10) unlawful use, possession or sale of illegal drugs and
21	alcohol;
22	(11) criminal acts involving moral turpitude;
23	(12) political activity prohibited by law;
24	(13) misuse, misappropriation or theft of government property
25	or funds;
26	(14) prohibited acts of discrimination, including sexual
27	harassment: ar

(15) abandonment of his position.

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Appointment. I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall appoint the **§1103.** Education Suruhanu with the advice and consent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan. The Education Suruhanu shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years.

§1104. Salary. The salary of the Education Suruhanu shall be at the rate of Eighty Thousand dollars (\$80,000.00) per annum. The Education Suruhanu's salary shall not be reduced during his term of office except as part of a government-wide reduction of salaries of all elected officials and appointed officers of the government of Guam. The Education Suruhanu may participate in any employee benefit or retirement plan available to government of Guam employees.

§1105. Powers. The Education Suruhanu shall have the following powers:

- (a) To investigate any complaints of a person pursuant to Public Law 28-45, 'Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act'.
- (b) To enact, amend and rescind rules and regulations, pursuant to Title 5 GCA Chapter 9 (Administrative Adjudication Law), and in consultation and with the approval of I Liheslaturan required for the discharge of his duties, including Guåhan. procedures for receiving and processing complaints, conducting investigations and reporting his findings, provided that he shall not charge fees for the submission or investigation of complaints.
- (c) To examine the records and documents privileged from inspection because of their confidential nature, but only after a confidentiality agreement has been executed between Superintendent of Education and the Education Suruhanu.

1	(d) To enter and inspect without notice the premises of any
2	GPSS school, office, or facility.
3	(e) To subpoena any employee or agent of the government of
4	Guam to appear and give sworn testimony or to produce documentary
5	or other evidence that is material to an inquiry.
6	(f) To administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses.
7	(g) To undertake, participate in or cooperate with persons and
8	agencies in such conferences, inquiries, meetings or studies as might
9	improve compliance with Public Law 28-45.
10	(h) To obtain such information and make such inquiries from
11	any agency or person as required to discharge his duties.
12	(i) To maintain confidentiality with respect to all matters and
13	the identities of the complainants or witnesses coming before him.
14	(j) To strengthen procedures and practices that lessen the risk
15	of objectionable administrative acts.
16	(k) To investigate, on complaint of a person of any actions or
17	inactions not included in the "Fourteen (14) points" of Public Law 28-
18	45, but may however impede the delivery of an adequate public
19	education.
20	§1106. Rights of Complainant - Communication with
21	Complainant.
22	(a) When the Education Suruhanu receives a complaint, he
23	shall so inform the complainant in writing that the complaint will be
24	investigated within twenty (20) working days and shall specify the
25	date in which the investigation shall be completed.
26	(b) The Education Suruhanu shall, within five (5) days after
27	completing an investigation, inform the complainant of his conclusion

1	or recommendation in writing and, if appropriate, any action taken or
2	to be taken by the agency involved.
3	(c) If the complainant has not received the Education
4	Suruhanu's conclusion or recommendation within ten (10) days of the
5	completion date specified pursuant to sub part (a) the complainant
6	may bring a mandamus action to compel the Education Suruhanu to
7	perform.
8	§1107. Investigation of Complaints.
9	(a) The Education Suruhanu shall investigate every complaint
10	alleging that an agency's action is:
11	(1) contrary to or inconsistent with law, regulation or
12	agency practice;
13	(2) based on mistaken facts or irrelevant considerations;
14	(3) inadequately explained or justified when the reasons
15	for said action should have been revealed;
16	(4) inefficiently performed; or
17	(5) unreasonable, unfair or otherwise objectionable,
18	even though in accordance with law.
19	(b) The Education Suruhanu may decide not to investigate a
20	complaint because:
21	(1) the complainant should pursue another legal remedy,
22	provided that the Education Suruhanu shall instruct the
23	complainant in writing as to how to proceed;
24	(2) the complaint is trivial, frivolous, vexatious or not
25	made in good faith;
26	(3) the complaint is over one hundred twenty (120) days
27	old, since the act or inaction was alleged to have occurred; and

1 **(4)** the Education Suruhanu's resources are insufficient for adequate investigation, in which he shall notify the 2 complainant in writing and shall refer the complaint to the 3 proper legislative committee for investigation. 4 (c) If the Education Suruhanu declines to investigate a 5 complaint, he may nevertheless review on his own initiative agency 6 actions not included in the complaint that come to his attention. 7 (d) The Education Suruhanu shall have twenty (20) working 8 9 days to investigate a complaint filed in accordance with this Chapter. (e) If the Education Suruhanu declines to investigate a 10 complaint as described in subsection (b) of this Section, the Education 11 Suruhanu must then report the reasons for not investigating to I 12 Maga'lahen Guåhan, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Superintendent of 13 Education and the Board within forty-eight (48) hours. 14 The Education Suruhanu shall report criminal investigative 15 matters to the Guam Police Department and the Attorney General. 16 17

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- §1108. Reports. The Education Suruhanu shall report monthly on his activities to I Maga'lahen Guåhan, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, the Superintendent of Education and the Guam Education Policy Board. The monthly report shall be posted on I Maga'lahen Guåhan's website, I Liheslaturan Guåhan's website and the Guam Public School System's website. The report should include all complaints filed under this Chapter, the issue of each complaint, the status of each complaint, and the conclusion or recommendations by the Education Suruhanu.
- §1109. Confidentiality. The Education *Suruhanu* shall treat all matters, including the identities of students, complainants, and individuals from whom information is acquired, as confidential, except as necessary to

enable the Education *Suruhanu* to perform the duties of the office. Upon receipt of information that by law is confidential or privileged, the Education *Suruhanu* shall maintain the confidentiality of such information and shall not further disclose or disseminate the information except as provided by applicable local or federal law.

§1110. Liability for Good Faith Performance - Privileged Communications.

- (a) The Education *Suruhanu* shall not be liable for good faith performance of responsibilities under this Chapter.
- (b) No discriminatory, disciplinary, or retaliatory action may be taken against any student or employee of GPSS, the office of the Superintendent of Education, or the Guam Education Policy Board, for any communication made, or information given or disclosed, to aid the Education *Suruhanu* in carrying out his duties and responsibilities, unless the same was done without good faith or maliciously. This subsection is not intended to infringe upon the rights of the Guam Public School System to discipline, or terminate an employee for other reasons or to discipline a student for other reasons.
- (c) All communications by the Education *Suruhanu* or the Education *Suruhanu's* staff or designee, if reasonably related to the Education *Suruhanu's* duties and responsibilities and done in good faith, are privileged and that privilege shall serve as a defense to any action in libel or slander.
- **§1111. Relation to Other Laws.** This Chapter does not restrict or modify any other statute that creates other rights and procedures. The Education *Suruhanu* may act notwithstanding any provision in law that an administrative action shall be final or unappealable.

§1112. Budget Requirements. GPSS shall provide the Education *Suruhanu* with the resources needed, including clerical services and office space, to fulfill his duties. A budget request prepared by the Education *Suruhanu* shall be included in the annual GPSS budget submission.

- **§1113. Severability.** If any part of this Chapter shall be declared invalid, all other parts shall remain in full force and effect; the provisions of this Chapter are declared to be severable."
- **Section 8.** From Dormant and Inactive Accounts and Unclaimed Funds identified and transferred by banks to the Treasurer of Guam pursuant to § 106119 of Title 11 GCA, the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated to the Guam Public School System for the Office of Education *Suruhanu*.
