AN ACT TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS TO THE GUAM PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY, THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT, AND THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*finds that the refinancing of the government of Guam General Obligation Bonds,
1993 Series A will generate the sum of Eleven Million Seven Hundred Ten
Thousand Eight Hundred Eighty-seven Dollars (\$11,710,887) and further finds that

there are additional funding requirements for the Guam Public School System, the
 Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, the Department of Public Health and Social
 Services, the Guam Police Department and the Office of the Attorney General.
 Pursuant to these findings, the following amounts are appropriated to these entities
 in this Act.

Section 2. Amend Section 3(A) of Chapter I of Public Law 29-19 to read:
"A. GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS 2007 SERIES A
(Authorized by Section 1, Chapter VIII of P.L. 29-19, net of UOG

Bond Payment Obligation \$2,027,377)

11 Section 3. Appropriation to Guam Public School System (GPSS). 12 Notwithstanding §22425(1) of Chapter 22 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, 13 the sum of Four Million Seventy-six Thousand Six Hundred Forty Dollars 14 (\$4,076,640) is appropriated from the Territorial Education Facilities Fund, as a 15 result of the debt service savings from the refinancing of the government of Guam 16 General Obligation Bonds, 1993 Series A, to the Guam Public School System for 17 school operations.

18 Section 4. Appropriations. Notwithstanding any other provision of 19 law, the sum of Seven Million Six Hundred Thirty-four Thousand Two Hundred 20 Forty-seven Dollars (\$7,634,247) is appropriated from the savings as a result of the 21 refinancing of the government of Guam General Obligation Bonds, 1993 Series A, 22 as follows:

(a) The sum of Seventy-three Thousand Three Hundred Sixty Dollars
(\$73,360) to the Guam Public School System for school operations.

(b) The sum of One Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,000)
to the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority to supplement its operations.

The sum of One Million Eighty-two Thousand Four Hundred Fifty-1 (c) 2 eight Dollars (\$1,082,458) to the Medically Indigent Program Payment Revolving 3 Fund (MIPPR) to supplement the funding for the Medically Indigent Program (MIP). The Department of Public Health and Social Services is authorized to 4 5 use these funds for payment of prior years' MIP obligations.

The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) to the Office 6 (d) 7 of the Attorney General for the payment of the court settlement in the case of Haeuser vs. Law vs. CSC (SP0003-92/CIV94-00007). 8

9 The sum of Three Million One Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand Four (e) Hundred Twenty-nine Dollars (\$3,178,429) to the Guam Memorial Hospital 10 Authority to fund renovations, repairs and essential collateral equipment for the 11 12 Hospital's Emergency Room.

The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) to I 13 (f)Liheslaturan Guåhan for operations. 14

The sum of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars 15 (g)(\$1,500,000) to the Guam Police Department for the purchase of furniture and 16 17 equipment for the Forensic Science Lab currently under construction on the 18 campus of the Guam Community College.

19 (h) The sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) to the Office of the Mayor of Barrigada for the repair and resurfacing of the community 20 21 basketball and volleyball/tennis courts and replacement of rotting power poles and 22 installation of adequate lighting facilities.

The Mayor of Barrigada, together with the Director of Public 1. 24 Works *shall* submit a status and expenditure report to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan* 25 *Guåhan no later than* thirty (30) days after the end of each quarter.

26 Section 5. The sum of Two Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-five Dollars 27 (\$2,855) shall be transferred from the appropriation made to I Liheslaturan

Guåhan in Section 16 of Part II of Chapter V of Public Law 29-19, to the 1 Department of Parks and Recreation to fund the following sports and electrical 2 3 equipment:

- 4 Eight (8) regulation size tennis nets totaling \$1,870 (a)
- 5 Five (5) 1000 watt light ballasts totaling \$579 (b)
- Ten (10) 1000 watt light bulbs totaling \$406 6 (c)

7 The Executive Director of I Liheslaturan Guåhan shall reduce the allocation made to the Office of Senator Frank T. Ishizaki, equal to the amount specified in 8 9 this Section.

I Maga'lahi's transfer authority with respect to this Act shall 10 Section 6. be subject to the same provisions of Section 13, Chapter VII of Public Law 29-19. 11

- Technical Amendment. Section 91 of Part II of Chapter VI 12 Section 7. of Public Law 29-19 is amended to read: 13
- "Section 91. Department of Public Health and Social 14 Services. Of the sum appropriated in Section 28 of Part II of Chapter V 15 of this Act to the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, Three Million 16 One Hundred Three Thousand Four Hundred Sixty Dollars (\$3,103,460) 17 18 shall be transferred to the Department of Public Health and Social Services for its operations for Fiscal Year 2008." 19

20 Section 8. Section 1(c) and (d) of Part I of Chapter III of Public Law 29-21 19 are *amended* to read:

Medically Indigent Program. The sum of Fifteen Million "(c) Eight Hundred One Thousand Four Hundred Thirty-three Dollars 23 24 (\$15,801,433) is appropriated from the General Fund to the Medically 25 Indigent Program Payment Revolving Fund (MIPPR) for the Medically 26 Indigent Program (MIP). The Department of Public Health and Social

Services is authorized to use these funds for payment of prior years' MIP
 obligations.

3 (d) Medicaid Program. The sum of Twelve Million Nine Hundred 4 Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$12,911,000) is appropriated from the General Fund to 5 the Department of Public Health and Social Services for the local match 6 requirement of the Medicaid Program. The Department of Public Health and 7 Social Services is authorized to use these funds for payment of prior years' 8 Medicaid obligations."

9 Section 9. The Department of Youth Affairs (DYA) is authorized to pay 10 prior years' obligations, including obligations to Sanctuary, Inc., from the 11 appropriations made to DYA in Public Law 29-19.

12 For the payments of prior years' obligations authorized in this Section 10. Act, I Maga'lahen Guåhan shall deliver notice to the Speaker of I Liheslaturan 13 Guåhan of each such proposed expenditure no less than thirty (30) days before the 14 The expenditure will be effective if no action is taken by I 15 expenditure. Liheslaturan Guåhan. For this purpose only, Title 2 GCA §2103, requiring a 16 17 public hearing for bills, and Title 5 GCA §8107, requiring notice of regular meetings, including legislative sessions, shall not apply. At the end of quarter, the 18 19 departments authorized to pay prior years' obligations pursuant to this Act, shall report to the Speaker of I Liheslatura, and post on its website, all payments of the 20 21 previous quarter's prior year obligations by payee, date of payment, amount of 22 payment, purpose of the expenditure and the reason for non-payment in the prior 23 year.

Section 11. Of the Four Million One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$4,150,000) appropriated to the Guam Public School System in Section 3 and 4(a) of this Act, this *shall* be utilized exclusively for the following:

Prior to any expenditure of funds appropriated herein, GPSS *shall* provide
the Speaker and the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, Taxation, Commerce
and Economic Development, a complete list of proposed retirees and vendors to be
addressed by the appropriation. Authorization to expend the funds *shall* be
effective twenty-one (21) days after submittal of the list to *I Liheslatura*.

Section 12. Section 2 of Public Law 29-04 is hereby *amended* as follows:

"Section 2. Fund Authorized for COLA Settlement Payment. The promissory note for Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) plus interest and any

11 proceeds therefrom executed pursuant to the GTA purchase agreement between the 12 government of Guam and TeleGuam Holdings, LLC, as part of the payment for the 13 purchase of the Guam Telephone Authority by TeleGuam Holdings, LLC, are 14 15 hereby irrevocably assigned and appropriated to payment of the judgment entered in Rios et al. v. Camacho, et al., Superior Court of Guam Case No. SP0206-93. 16 17 The assignment of the note and appropriation of its proceeds *shall* permit the COLA class to sell, pledge, assign, transfer or otherwise liquidate the note to 18 another party for the purpose of distributing cash payments to eligible COLA class 19 20 recipients. The Director of Administration shall guarantee this amount on behalf of the government of Guam in writing pursuant to §31202 of Title 18 GCA. If the 21 22 guarantee is called by the purchaser of the note, and the government performs on 23 the guarantee, the note *shall* become the property of the government of Guam. The Attorney General *shall* use all efforts to collect on the note." 24

25 Section 13. The sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) is 26 authorized from lapsed personnel fund from all departments and agencies and 27 autonomous instrumentalities within the government of Guam to contract with a 1 consulting expert on classification and compensation in public employment to 2 conduct a study of all government of Guam positions, including those in 3 autonomous, semi-autonomous, and non-autonomous agencies, public corporations 4 and all instrumentalities, and the Judiciary, to update the Unified Pay Schedule. 5 The contract *shall* include the conduct of compensation training to the Human 6 Resources staff throughout the government.

Section 14. The sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) shall be
transferred from the appropriation made to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in Section 16
Part II Chapter V of P.L. 29-19, to the Guam Police Department Crime Lab
Section to fund for the following equipment:

- 11(a) Digital Cameras and associated equipment for Crime12Scene processing.
- 13 (b) Digital Video Cameras and associated equipment for
 14 Crime Scene Recording.
- 15 (c) Digital Photography Management System.

The Executive Director of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan shall* reduce the allocation
made to the Office of Senator Frank T. Ishizaki, equal to the amount specified in
this Section.
