AN ACT TO AMEND §11102, AND TO ADD A NEW §11112 TO CHAPTER 11, DIVISION 1, OF TITLE 10 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPRESSIONS OF SYMPATHY OR BENEVOLENCE IN CIVIL ACTIONS AGAINST PHYSICIANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that laws have been enacted across the nation to protect medical professionals in
- 4 circumstances where communication has been exchanged between physicians and
- 5 patients or their families expressing sympathy concerning pain, suffering, or death.
- 6 The expressions of sympathy or benevolence have, in many instances, conveyed a

- sense of responsibility on the part of the physician that oftentimes builds trust
- 2 between him or her and the patient and their families. The trust established also
- 3 creates a sense of compassion on both parties and as a result, patients and/or their
- 4 families are less inclined to initiate a suit, such as civil actions, against the
- 5 physician.
- Therefore, it is the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to protect such
- 7 communication expressing sympathy or benevolent gestures from being used
- 8 against health professionals in medical malpractice actions.
- 9 Section 2. §11102 of Chapter 11, Division 1 of Title 10 of the Guam Code
- 10 Annotated is hereby *amended* by *adding* Items (d) and (e) to read as follows:
- "(d) Benevolent gesture means any action which conveys a sense of
- compassion or commiseration emanating from human impulses.
- (e) Family means the spouse, reciprocal beneficiary, parent,
- grandparent, stepmother, stepfather, child, grandchild, brother, sister, half
- brother, half sister, adopted children of parent, or spouse's parent of the
- injured party."
- Section 3. A new §11112 is hereby *added* to Chapter 11 of Division 1 of
- 18 Title 10 Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:
- 19 "§11112. Admissibility of Expressions of Sympathy or
- Benevolence. (a) In any civil action that is brought against a health
- professional, as defined in §11102, or in any arbitration proceeding that
- relates to the civil action, a statement, writing *or* benevolent gesture that:
- 23 (1) expresses sympathy or a general sense of benevolence relating
- 24 to the pain, suffering or death of the patient involved in the incident with the
- health professional; and
- 26 (2) is made to the patient or to the family of the patient is
- inadmissible as evidence of an admission of liability.

A statement of fault, however, which is part of, *or* in addition to, any of the above *shall* be admissible."

Section 4. The Act shall *not* affect the rights *or* duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun before its effective date.

Section 5. Severability. *If* any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall *not* affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
