AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW CHAPTER 12 TO TITLE 17, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING GUAM ACADEMY CHARTER SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new Chapter 12 is *added* to Title 17, Guam Code Annotated,
- 3 to read as follows:

5 GUAM ACADEMY CHARTER SCHOOLS ACT OF 2009

1	§12101. Short Title. This Chapter shall be known and may be cited as the
2	"Guam Academy Charter School Act of 2009".
3	§12102. Purpose. The Guam Academy Charter School Act of 2009 is
4	enacted to provide opportunities for teachers, parents, guardians, students and
5	community members to establish and maintain schools that operate independently
6	from the Guam Public School System as a method to:
7	(a) improve student learning;
8	(b) increase learning opportunities for all students, with special
9	emphasis on expanded learning experiences;
0	(c) encourage the use of different and innovative teaching methods;
1	(d) create new professional opportunities for teachers, including the
2	opportunity to be responsible for the learning program at the school site;
3	(e) provide parents, guardians and students with expanded choices
4	in the types of educational opportunities that are available within the public
5	school system; and
6	(f) hold the schools established under this Chapter accountable for
7	meeting measurable student educational standards.
8	§12103. Definitions.
9	(a) Board means the Guam Education Policy Board;
20	(b) Academy Charter School means schools acknowledged as
21	Charter Schools by the Guam Academy Charter Schools Council under
22	Chapter 12 of Title 17 GCA;
23	(c) Chamorro Language Immersion Program is a method of
24	teaching the Chamorro language. Using the Chamorro language as the
25	teaching tool, surrounding or immersing students in the Chamorro language
26	in class activities such as math, science, social studies, history, and other

class subjects.

21	(a) a state	tement defining the mission and goals of the proposed
22	Academy Charter	School and the manner in which the Academy Charter
23	School will cond	uct any district-wide assessments required by the Guam
24	Public School Sys	tem;
25	(b) a sta	tement of the need for the proposed Academy Charter
26	School;	

(c) a description of the proposed instructional goals and methods for the proposed Academy Charter School, which *shall* include, at a minimum:

(1) the area of focus of the proposed Academy Charter

- (1) the area of focus of the proposed Academy Charter School, such as mathematics, science, the fine arts, language, technology, agriculture, vocational training, *Chamorro* language immersion_program, high school academy, information technology *or* criminal justice, *if* the Academy Charter School will have such a focus;
- (2) the methods that will be used, including classroom technology, to provide students with the knowledge, proficiency, and skills needed:
 - (A) to become nationally and internationally competitive students and educated individuals in the Twenty-first (21st) century; and
 - (B) to perform competitively on any district-wide assessments; and
- (3) the methods that will be used to improve student selfmotivation, classroom instruction, and learning for all students;
- (d) a description of the scope and size of the proposed Academy Charter School's program that will enable students to successfully achieve the goals established by the Academy Charter School, including, the grade levels to be served by the Academy Charter School and the projected and maximum enrollment of each grade level;
- (e) a description of the plan for evaluating student academic achievement at the proposed Academy Charter School and the procedures for remedial action that will be used by the Academy Charter School when

the academic achievement of a student falls below the expectations of the Academy Charter School;

- (f) an operating budget for the first two (2) years of the proposed Academy Charter School that is based on anticipated enrollment;
- (g) a description of the proposed rules and policies for governance and operation of the proposed Academy Charter School;
- (h) a description of the method for conducting annual audits of the financial, administrative, and programmatic operations of the proposed Academy Charter School;
- (i) an identification of a facility for the proposed Academy Charter School, including a description of the site where the school will be located;
- (j) the names and addresses of the members of the proposed interim Board of Trustees and the procedures for selecting trustees;
- (k) a description of the student enrollment, admission process, suspension, expulsion, and other disciplinary policies and procedures of the proposed Academy Charter School, and the criteria for making decisions in such areas;
- (l) a description of the procedures the proposed Academy Charter School plans to follow to ensure the health and safety of students, employees, and guests of the school and to comply with applicable health and safety laws, and all applicable civil rights statutes and regulations of the Federal Government and the government of Guam;
- (m) an explanation of the qualifications that will be required of employees of the proposed Academy Charter School;
- (n) a description of how parents, guardians, teachers, and other members of the community have been involved in the design and will

continue to be involved in the implementation of the proposed Academy Charter School:

- (o) a description of how parents, guardians, teachers and staff will be provided an orientation and other training to ensure their effective participation in the operation of the proposed Academy Charter School;
- (p) an assurance the proposed Academy Charter School will seek, obtain, and maintain accreditation from an accrediting body deemed appropriate by the Council;
- (q) an explanation of the relationship that will exist between the Academy Charter School and the school's employees; and
- (r) a description of how the proposed Academy Charter School plans to meet the transportation and food service needs of its students; and
- (s) a description of the facilities the Academy Charter School plans to use.

§12106. Process for Approving or Denying Charter School Petitions.

- (a) Schedule. An eligible applicant seeking to establish an Academy Charter School *shall* submit a petition pursuant to §12105 of this Chapter to the Council *no later than* the first Monday of January. However, it is recommended that an eligible applicant consult with the Council prior to submitting the petition. All petitions submitted *no later than* the first Monday in January *shall* be for the following school year.
- (b) Public Hearing. *Not later than* forty-five (45) days after a petition to establish an Academy Charter School is filed with the Council, the Council *shall* hold a public hearing on the petition to gather the information that is necessary for the Council to make the decision to approve *or* deny the petition.

Notice. Ten (10) days before the scheduled time of the public 1 (c) hearing on a petition to establish an Academy Charter School, the Council 2 shall: 3 send a written notification of the public hearing to the 4 **(1)** eligible applicant; 5 post notice of the public hearing at a place convenient to **(2)** 6 the public in the administrative office, cafeteria, and the 7 classrooms of the public school which is subject to be converted 8 9 into an Academy Charter School; post notice of the public hearing at a place convenient to **(3)** 10 the public in the administrative office, cafeteria and the 11 classrooms of the public school which is school grade lower than 12 the first school grade which is served by the public school which 13 is subject to conversion; and 14 post notice of the public hearing at a place convenient to (4) 15 the public in the Mayor's office which represents an area within 16 the attendance area of the public school which is the subject of the 17 conversion petition. 18 The Council shall approve a petition to establish an Academy (d) 19 Charter School, if: 20 the Council determines that the petition satisfies the (1) 21 requirements of this Chapter; 22 (2)the eligible applicant who filed the petition agrees to 23 satisfy any condition or requirement, consistent with this Chapter and 24 other applicable law that is set forth in writing by the Council as an 25 amendment to the petition; 26

(3) the Council determines that the Academy Charter School has the ability to meet the educational objectives outlined in the petition; and

- (4) the approval will *not* cause the Council to *exceed* a limit under subsection (g) of this Section.
- (e) The Council *shall* approve *or* deny a petition to establish an Academy Charter School *not later than* thirty (30) days after the conclusion of the public hearing on the petition.
- (f) Denial explanation. Written notice of the council's action *shall* be sent to the eligible applicant. *If* the petition is *not* approved, the reasons for the denial and suggested remedial measures, *if* any, *shall* be clearly stated in the notice sent by the council to the eligible applicant. *If* the petition is *not* approved, the eligible applicant may amend the petition to address objections and any suggested remedial measures and resubmit the petition to the Council. The Council *shall* approve *or* disapprove the resubmitted petition within twenty (20) days after receiving it. *If* the petition is *not* approved, the eligible applicant *may* appeal the decision of the Council to the Board.
- (g) The total number of Academy Charter Schools operating on Guam under this Chapter at any one time *shall not exceed* seven (7). At least two (2) Academy Charter School *shall* be an elementary school. At least one (1) *shall* be a middle school. At least one (1) high school. *No more than* three (3) non-converted public schools *shall* be authorized.

§12107. Duties and Powers, and other Requirements, of Charter Schools.

(a) An Academy Charter School *shall* comply with all of the terms and provisions of its Charter.

An Academy Charter School shall be subject to all federal and 1 state laws and constitutional provisions prohibiting discrimination on the 2 basis of disability, race creed, color, gender, national origin, religion, 3 ancestry or need for special education services. 4 Each power conferred upon an Academy Charter School under 5 this Chapter can only be used for the sole purpose of operating the Academy 6 7 Charter School. An Academy Charter school shall have the following 8 powers: 9 **(1)** to adopt a name and corporate seal, but only if the name selected includes the words 'Academy Charter School'; 10 **(2)** to acquire real property for use as the Academy Charter 11 School's facilities, from public or private sources, but Academy 12 Charter Schools shall not have the power to acquire property by 13 eminent domain; 14 (3) to receive and disburse funds for Academy Charter 15 School purposes; 16 (4) to secure appropriate insurance and to make contracts 17 and leases, including agreements to procure or purchase services, 18 equipment, and supplies; 19 to incur debt in reasonable anticipation of the receipt of 20 funds from the general fund of the government of Guam or the receipt 21 of Federal or private funds; 22 (6) to solicit and accept any grants or gifts for the Academy 23 Charter School's purposes, if the Academy Charter School: 24 Does not accept any grants or gifts subject to any 25

condition contrary to law or contrary to its Charter; and

1	(B) Maintains, for financial reporting purposes,
2	separate accounts for grants or gifts;
3	(7) to be responsible for the Academy Charter School's
4	operation, including preparation of a budget and personnel matters;
5	and
6	(8) to sue and be sued in the Academy Charter School's own
7	name.
8	(d) An Academy Charter School shall not charge an application fee
9	and tuition.
10	(e) An Academy Charter School may impose reasonable fees or
11	otherwise require payment, at rates established by the Trustees of the school,
12	for any field trips or similar activities not funded in whole or part through
13	appropriation by I Liheslaturan Guåhan.
14	(f) An Academy Charter School shall exercise exclusive control
15	over its expenditures, administration, personnel, and instructional methods,
16	within the limitations imposed in this Chapter.
17	(g) An Academy Charter School shall be exempt from Guam
18	statutes, policies, rules, regulations, and collective bargaining agreements
19	established for the Guam public schools, except as otherwise provided in the
20	Academy's Charter or this Chapter.
21	(h) An Academy Charter School shall comply with all federal and
22	Guam health and safety requirements applicable to public schools.
23	(i) An Academy Charter School shall be governed by the Trustees
24	in a manner consistent with the Charter granted to the school and the
25	provisions of this Chapter.

No employee of the Guam Public School System shall be (j) 1 2 required to accept employment with, or be assigned to, an Academy Charter School. 3 (k) No student enrolled in a public school shall be required to 4 attend an Academy Charter School; 5 6 (1) An Academy Charter School shall not levy taxes or issue bonds. 7 An Academy Charter School seeking to revise its Charter shall 8 9 prepare a petition for approval of the revision and file the petition with the Council. The provisions of §12105 of this Chapter shall apply to such a 10 petition in the same manner as such provisions apply to a petition to 11 establish an Academy Charter School. 12 An Academy Charter School shall submit an annual report no 13 later than thirty (30) days after the end of the fiscal year to the Council, the 14 Superintendent of Education, and the Board. The Academy Charter School 15 shall permit the public to review any such report upon request. A report 16 *shall* include the following data: 17 **(1)** a report on the extent to which the school is meeting its 18 mission and goals as stated in the petition for the Academy Charter 19 School; 20 student performance on any district-wide assessments; **(2)** 21 (3) grade advancement for students enrolled in the Academy 22 Charter School: 23 graduation rates, college admission test scores, and **(4)** 24 college admission rates, if applicable; 25 types and amounts of parental involvement; (5) 26

official student enrollment;

(6)

1	(7) average daily attendance;
2	(8) annual financial audit and subsequent fiscal year annual
3	financial audits, a financial statement audited by the Public Auditor;
4	(9) a report on school staff indicating the qualifications and
5	responsibilities of such staff; and
6	(10) a list of all donors and grantors that have contributed
7	monetary or in-kind donations having a value equal to or exceeding
8	Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) during the year that is the subject of the
9	report.
10	(A) Data described in items (1) through (8) of this
l 1	subsection shall not identify the individuals to whom the data
12	pertain.
13	(n) An Academy Charter School shall provide to the Guam Public
14	School System student enrollment data.
15	(o) An Academy Charter School shall establish a formal complaint
16	resolution process.
17	(p) An Academy Charter School shall provide a program of
18	education, which shall include any grade or grades from kindergarten
19	through grade twelve (12).
20	(q) An Academy Charter School shall be nonsectarian and shall not
21	be affiliated with a sectarian school or religious institution.
22	(r) An Academy Charter School shall not be home based.
23	(s) An Academy Charter School shall not be converted from any
24	existing private or parochial school.
25	(t) An Academy Charter School shall initiate the process for
26	accreditation within the first one hundred twenty (120) days of
27	opening and attain accreditation within five (5) years of opening.

- 1 (u) An Academy Charter School *shall not* hire a for-profit management company to operate the school.
 - (v) An Academy Charter School *shall* provide instruction each year for at least the same number of days required of the Guam Public School System.
 - (w) An Academy Charter School, and its incorporators, Trustees, officers, employees, and volunteers, *shall* be immune from civil liability, both personally and professionally, for any act *or* omission within the scope of their official duties unless the act *or* omission:
 - (1) constitutes gross negligence;
 - (2) constitutes an intentional tort; or
 - (3) is criminal in nature.

- 13 (x) Upon termination of the Charter, all assets of the Academy
 14 Charter School *shall* revert to the Guam Public School System.
 - §12108. Board of Trustees of a Charter School. (a) There is established the Board of Trustees. The Trustees of an Academy Charter School *shall* be elected *or* selected pursuant to the Charter granted to the Academy Charter School. The Board of Trustees *shall* consist of *not less than* five (5) members and *not more than* nine (9) members. At least one (1) member *shall* be parent *or* guardian of a student attending the Academy Charter School. At least one (1) member *shall* be from the general public with an accounting *or* finance background. The Principal of the Academy Charter School *shall* be a non-voting member.
 - (b) In the case of the first Trustees of an Academy Charter School to be elected *or* selected after the date on which the school is granted a Charter, the election *or* selection of the members under subsection (a) of this Section *shall* occur on the earliest practicable date after classes at the school have commenced. Until such date, any other members who have been elected *or* selected *shall* serve

as interim Trustees. Such an interim Board of Trustees may exercise all of the powers, and *shall* be subject to all of the duties, of a Board of Trustees.

- (c) The Trustees of an Academy Charter School *shall* be fiduciaries of the school and *shall* set overall policy for the school. The Trustees *may* make final decisions on matters related to the operation of the school, consistent with the Charter granted to the school, this Chapter, and other applicable law.
- (d) Meetings held by the Board of Trustees *shall* be in compliance with the Open Government Law of Guam.
- §12109. Academy Charter Schools; Admission Requirements. (a) An Academy Charter School *shall* enroll all students who submit a timely application, unless the number of applications exceeds the capacity of a program, class, grade level *or* building. An Academy Charter School *shall* give enrollment preference to students returning to the Academy Charter School in the second *or* any subsequent year of its operation and to siblings of students already enrolled in the Academy Charter School. *If* capacity is insufficient to enroll all students who submit a timely application, the Academy Charter School *shall* select students through an equitable selection process such as a lottery. A public school converted to an Academy Charter school *shall* give enrollment preference to students attending the public school prior to conversion and students who reside within the former attendance zone of that converted public school.
 - (b) *Except* as provided in subsection (c), an Academy Charter School *shall not* limit admission based on ethnicity, national origin, gender, income level, disabling condition, proficiency in the English language *or* athletic ability.
- 24 (c) An Academy Charter School *may* limit admission to students within a 25 given age group *or* grade level.

- (d) An Academy Charter School *may* refuse to admit any student who has been expelled from another educational institution *or* who is in the process of being expelled from another educational institution.
- (e) For schools preparing students for specific professions, admissions may be limited to students who meet Bona Fide Occupational Qualifications (BFOQ) selection criteria for the profession. *If* the profession exists in an equivalent government position, the admissions criteria may be based on the government of Guam's employment selection criteria.

§12110. Employees.

- (a) An employee of an Academy Charter School who transferred from the Guam Public School System *shall* be considered to be on three (3) years leave of absence from the Guam Public School System. The leave of absence *shall* commence on the initial date of employment at the Charter School. Upon request of the employee, the three (3) years leave of absence *shall* be renewed for up to two (2) additional one (1)-year periods, absent good cause.
- (b) The time during which an employee is on a leave of absence *shall* be counted for service credit on the Guam Public School System's salary schedule.
- (c) During the period of time that an employee is on a leave of absence from the Guam Public School System and is actively employed by the Charter School, the Academy Charter School as the employer *shall* continue the retirement *or* other benefits previously granted to the employee make applicable retirement contributions.
- (d) A leave of absence *shall not* be considered a break in service with the Guam Public School System with which and employee was previously employed.

An employee who is on leave of absence and actively teaching 1 at an Academy Charter School and who submits a notice of intent to return 2 to a public school in which the employee was employed immediately prior 3 employment in the Charter School shall be given employment 4 preference by the Guam Public School System if: 5 the employee's notice of intent to return is submitted to 6 the Guam Public School System within three (3) years after ceasing 7 employment with the Guam Public School System; and 8 **(2)** if the employee is a teacher, a position for which the 9 teacher is certified or is qualified to become certified is available. If 10 the employee is not a teacher, a position for which the employee is 11 qualified is available. 12 (f) An employee who is on leave of absence and employed by an 13 Academy Charter school and is discharged or terminated for just cause by 14 the Academy Charter School may be considered discharged or terminated by 15 the Guam Public School System. 16 §12111. Guam Academy Charter Schools Council; Membership; 17 Terms; Compensation. 18 There is established the Guam Academy Charter Schools (a) 19 Council. The Council shall consist of seven (7) voting members and one 20 non-voting member and shall include: 21 **(1)** one (1) retired teacher; 22 one (1) retired school administrator; 23 **(2)** two (2) members with accounting or finance **(3)** 24 background; 25

three (3) members from the general public; and

1	(5) the Superintendent of Education or the Superintendent's

3	(b) The voting members shall be appointed by I Maga'lahen

(a) The Council: (1) may grant Academy School Charter status to qualifying applicants pursuant to this Chapter; (2) shall monitor the operations of each Academy Charter School; (3) shall ensure that each such Academy Charter School complies with applicable laws and the provisions of the charter granted to such school;

shall ensure that each Academy Charter School complies (5) 1 2 with the annual reporting requirements, including, submission of the audited financial statement. 3 The Council may require an Academy Charter School to 4 (b) produce any book, record, paper, or document, if the Council determines that 5 such production is necessary for the Council to carry out its functions under 6 7 this Chapter. The Council shall charge an eligible applicant or an Academy (c) 8 Charter School a non-refundable application or renewal fee of Five Hundred 9 Dollars (\$500). All such application or renewal fees shall be deposited to 10 the Guam Academy Charter School Fund. 11 The Council shall be immune from civil liability, both (d) 12 personally and professionally, for any act or omission within the scope of 13 their official duties unless the act or omission: 14 (1) constitutes gross negligence; 15 constitutes an intentional tort; or 16 (2) is criminal in nature. (3) 17 Meetings held by the Council shall be in compliance with the (e) 18 Open Government Law of Guam. 19 §12113. Academy Charter School Initial Term and Renewal. 20 A Charter granted to an Academy Charter School shall remain 21 in force for a five (5) year period. 22 A Charter may be renewed an unlimited number of times, each 23 (b) time for a five (5) year period. 24 The Council shall review a Charter at least once every year to 25

determine whether the Charter should be revoked for the reasons described

in §12115 of this Chapter in accordance with the procedures for revocation established under §12115 of this Chapter.

- (d) In the case of an Academy Charter School that desires to renew its charter, the Trustees of the school *shall* file an application to renew the charter with the Council *not later than* one hundred twenty (120) days *nor* earlier than three hundred sixty-five (365) days before the expiration of the charter. The application *shall* contain the following:
 - (1) a report on the progress of the Academy Charter School in achieving the goals, student academic achievement expectations, and other terms of the approved Charter; and
 - (2) all audited financial statements for the Academy Charter School for the preceding four (4) years, *if* applicable.
- (e) The Council *shall* approve an application to renew the Charter that is filed in accordance with subsection (b) of this Section, *except* that the Council *shall not* approve such application *if* the Council determines that:
 - (1) the Academy Charter School committed a material violation of applicable laws *or* a material violation of the conditions, terms, standards, *or* procedures set forth in its Charter, including violations relating to the education of children with disabilities; or
 - (2) the Academy Charter School failed to meet the goals and student academic achievement expectations set forth in its Charter.
- (f) In an application to renew a Charter filed by the Trustees in accordance with this Chapter, the Council *shall* provide written notice to the Trustees of the public hearing on the application *not later than* fifteen (15) days after the date on which the Council received the application.
- (g) Not later than thirty (30) days after the date on which the Trustees receive a notice under subsection (e) of this Section, the Trustees

may request, in writing, a public hearing on the application before the Council.

- (h) Upon receiving a timely written request for a pubic hearing under subsection (f) of this Section, the Council *shall* set a date and time for the public hearing and *shall* provide notice of the date and time, as well as the procedures to be followed at the public hearing, to the Trustees.
- (i) A public hearing under this subsection *shall* take place *not later* than thirty (30) days after the Council receives a timely written request for the public hearing under subsection (f) of this Section.
- (j) The Council *shall* render a final decision, in writing, on an application to renew a Charter *not later than* thirty (30) days after the date on which the public hearing is concluded.
- (k) A decision *not* to renew the Charter of an Academy Charter School *may* be appealed to the Board as described by §12115 of this Chapter.

§12114. Basis and Procedures for Academy Charter School Probation or Revocation.

- (a) The Council may place an Academy Charter School on probation *or* revoke the Academy Charter School's Charter *if* the Council determines that the Academy Charter School:
 - (1) committed a violation of applicable law *or* material violation of the conditions, terms, standards, *or* procedures set forth in the Charter, including violations relating to the education of children with disabilities;
 - (2) has failed to meet the goals and student academic achievement expectations set forth in the Charter;

(3) has engaged in a pattern of non-adherence to generally 1 accepted accounting principles; 2 has engaged in a pattern of fiscal mismanagement; or **(4)** 3 (5) is *no* longer economically viable. 4 Procedures for consideration of probation *or* revocation: (b) 5 The Council shall provide to the Trustees a written notice **(1)** 6 stating the reasons for the probation of the Academy Charter School 7 or the revocation of the Academy Charter School's Charter. The 8 notice shall inform the Trustees of the right to have a public hearing. 9 **(2)** Not later than fifteen (15) days after the date on which 10 the Trustees receives a notice under (b)(1) of this Section, the Trustees 11 may request, in writing, a public hearing on the probation of the 12 Charter School or the revocation of the Academy Charter School's 13 Charter before the Council. 14 Upon receiving a timely written request for a public (3) 15 hearing under this Section, the Council shall set a date and time for 16 the public hearing and shall provide reasonable notice of the date and 17 time, as well as the procedures to be followed at the public hearing, to 18 the Trustees. 19 A public hearing under this Section shall take place not 20 (4) later than thirty (30) days upon written request for a public hearing 21 under this subsection. 22 The Council shall render a final decision no later than thirty 23 (c) (30) days after the conclusion of the public hearing. The vote of two-thirds 24 (2/3) of all the members of the Council shall be required to revoke the 25

Charter.

(d) The Council *may* place an Academy Charter School on probation, rather than revoke its Charter, in order to allow for the implementation of a remedial plan approved by the Council. *If* after ninety (90) days, *or* such longer period as the Council may specify, said plan is unsuccessful in remedying the problem *or* alleviating the causes of the probation, the Council *shall* revoke the Charter.

- (e) If the Council revokes a charter granted to an Academy Charter School, the Guam Public School System shall manage the Academy Charter School directly until alternative arrangements can be made for students at the Academy Charter School.
- (f) If the Academy Charter's School Charter is revoked, the Trustees may appeal the decision of the Council to the Board.
- §12115. Appeal Process. (a) The Board, upon receipt of a notice of appeal, shall review the decision of the Council.
- that wishes to appeal a decision of the Council concerning the denial, nonrenewal or revocation of an Academy Charter School shall provide the Board with a notice of appeal within thirty (30) days after the Council's decision. The eligible applicant or Trustees of the Charter School bringing the appeal shall limit the grounds of the appeal to the grounds for denial, nonrenewal or revocation specified by the Council. The notice shall include a brief statement of the reasons the eligible applicant or Trustees contends the Council's decision was in error. Within thirty days (30) after receipt of the notice of appeal, the Board shall hold a public hearing that may be held in the school district in which the proposed Academy Charter School has applied for or at the current location of the Academy Charter School. The Board shall review the decision of the Council and make its findings within ten (10) days after the completion of the public hearing. If the Board finds

that the Council's decision was contrary to the best interests of the students, *or* community, the Board *shall* reverse the decision of the Council. The decision of the Board *shall* be final and *not* subject to appeal.

- **§12116. Funding.** (a) The Trustees, in consultation with teachers and administrators, *shall* determine the school's curriculum and develop the school's annual budget. The Trustees of each Charter School *shall* submit to the Council a copy of its budget for each fiscal year.
- (b) The Council *shall* submit on a timely basis as required by the Board, the budgets of an Academy Charter Schools to the Superintendent of Education. The Superintendent of Education *shall* submit the budgets to the Board for approval as part of the Guam Public School System Fisçal Year Budget.
- operating budget for the fiscal year, the amount approved by *I Liheslatura* for the operation of each Academy Charter School *shall* be available for expenditure by the Trustees of such Charter School for any lawful purpose without further approval by the Superintendent of Education *or* the Board. In no case *shall* an Academy Charter School expend *or* incur obligations in excess of its budget request; provided, however, that a Academy Charter School *shall* be authorized to spend federal grants and other funds received independent of the Guam Public School System *not* accounted for in said Charter School's budget request without prior approval from the Superintendent of Education *or* the Board.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter, *no* capital improvement funds *shall* be awarded to a non-converted public school for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing *or* improving said school.
- (e) Academy Charter Schools *shall* be funded as follows: the Charter School *shall* receive a tuition amount from the General Fund equal to the number of students enrolled at the Charter School for the upcoming school year, multiplied

- by the per pupil cost. The Department of Administration is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to deduct said Charter School tuition amount from the total General Fund
- 3 appropriation to the Guam Public School System. Specific to the Charter, any
- 4 reimbursement for special education or bilingual education costs between the
- 5 Guam Public School System and the Academy Charter School shall follow such
- 6 formula and mechanisms adopted in the Academy's Charter.

- (f) A public school that converts into an Academy Charter School *shall* retain the identical school budget appropriated prior to its conversion to the following school year.
- §12117. Transportation. Students attending an Academy Charter School shall be provided transportation to the Charter School by the Department of Public Works on the same terms and conditions as transportation is provided to children attending other public schools. In providing such transportation, the Department of Public Works shall accommodate the particular school day and school year of the Charter School; provided, however, that in the event that the Department of Public Works limits transportation for public school students, the Department of Public Works shall not be required to provide transportation to any Academy Charter School beyond said limitations.
- §12118. Academic Credits; Transfer. If a student who was previously enrolled in an Academy Charter School enrolls in a public school, the public school shall accept credits earned by the student in courses or instructional programs at the Academy Charter School in a uniform and consistent manner and according to the same criteria that are used to accept academic credits from other public schools.
- §12119. Guam Academy Charter School Fund. There is hereby created, separate and apart from other funds of the government of Guam, a fund known as the 'Guam Academy Charter School Fund (Fund).' The Fund *shall not* be

- 1 commingled with any other fund, and shall be kept in a separate bank account and
- 2 administered by the Guam Academy Charter School Council for the operations of
- 3 the Guam Academy Charter School. Expenditures from the Fund *shall* be reported
- 4 quarterly to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the Office of Public Auditor for the use of
- 5 the Fund.
- §12120. All provisions of this Act shall expire on July 1, 2018, unless re-
- 7 enacted by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan prior* to expiration.
- 8 §12121. The Guam Academy Charter Schools Council shall recommend
- 9 changes to this Act to *I Liheslatura* within thirty (30) days of its first meeting at
- which a quorum is present."
