



AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW §70.11 TO CHAPTER 70 OF TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DOGFIGHTING; AND TO *AMEND* §34205 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EAR CROPPING AND TAIL DOCKING OF ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. A new §70.11 is hereby added to Chapter 70 of Title 9, Guam
- 3 Code Annotated, to read:

4 "§70.11. Dogfighting: Defined: Penalty.

1	(a)	(1)	Dogright means a fight, arranged by any person, between
2			two (2) or more dogs the purpose or probable result of
3			which fight is the infliction of injury by one (1) dog upon
4			another.
5		(2)	Baiting means to provoke or to harass an animal with
6			one (1) or more animals and/or with drugs or other
7			substances for the purpose of training an animal to
8			engage in a dogfight.
9	(b)	A per	rson commits a third degree felony if he knowingly:
10		(1)	owns, possesses, keeps, trains, promotes, purchases, or
11			sells any dog(s) with the intent that the dog(s) shall be
12			engaged in a dogfight;
13		(2)	gambles or bets on the outcome of a dogfight and/or
14			baiting;
15		(3)	for amusement or gain, causes, allows, or permits any
16			dog(s) to fight with another dog or other animal or
17			causes any dog(s) to injure each other or other animal; or
18		(4)	is a spectator at an event involving the fighting of a
19			dog(s).
20	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the penalty for violations		
21	of Items (1), (2), (3) and (4) of this paragraph shall be confinement in a		
22	correctional facility in accordance with Article 2 of 9GCA Chapter 80 and a		
23	fine of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) and no more than Ten		
24	Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or both per violation.

5	(2)	permits or suffers a place owned or controlled by him to	
6		be used as provided in Item (1) of this paragraph;	
7	(3)	permits or suffers a place leased by him to be used as	
8		provided in Item (1) of this paragraph;	
9	(4)	be present and witness, pay admission to, encourage, aid	
10		or assist in an activity enumerated in Item (1) of this	
11		paragraph; or	
12	(5)	promotes, hosts or sponsors an activity enumerated in	
13		Item (1) of this paragraph.	
14	Notwithsta	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the penalty for violations	
15	of Items (1), (2),	of Items (1), (2), (3), (4) and (5) of this paragraph shall be confinement in a	
16	correctional facili	correctional facility in accordance with Article 2 of 9GCA Chapter 80 and a	
17	fine of not less t	fine of not less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) and no more than	
18	Fifteen Thousand	Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000) or both per violation. Additionally, any	
19	person convicted of any violation of this paragraph may be subject to		
20	seizure of any pe	seizure of any personal property, including vehicles, and real property at	
21	which the dogfigh	which the dogfight was staged.	
22	(d) Seizu	are of Dogs.	
23	(1)	A judge may order the seizure of alleged fighting dogs	
24		owned, possessed or kept by any person.	
25	(2)	The judge issuing an order for the seizure of a dog(s) as	

provided in Item (1) of this paragraph may require the

dog(s) to be impounded at an animal shelter or veterinary clinic or hospital. The government unit which executes the seizure shall be responsible for the cost of impoundment at the animal shelter, but the governmental unit is entitled to receive reimbursement of those costs from the owner, possessor or keeper of the impounded dog(s). If the owner, possessor or keeper of the dog(s) is subsequently convicted of dogfighting under this Section, the Court may order the defendant to pay the costs as restitution in the case.

(e) Nothing in this Section shall constitute a prohibition or ban on the possession, lawful importation/exportation, breeding or selling of any breed of dog.

- (f) Veterinarians and/or physicians and/or health professionals are required to report suspected dogfighting incidents that come to their attention through the provision of medical services to dogs to the Guam Police Department within five (5) days of learning of dogfighting incidents. Failure to do so shall result in potential loss of licensure if deemed appropriate by the appropriate licensure agencies."
- **Section 2.** Subsection (d) of §34205 of Article 2, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:
 - "(d) Only a licensed veterinarian shall perform ear cropping or tail docking on an animal, which shall be performed in accordance with the American Veterinarian Medical Association policy, and the veterinarian shall counsel pet owners about this matter before agreeing to perform these surgeries and shall record said consultation in the pet's record."
