AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 51202(a) AND 51207 OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 51 OF TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO AMEND §3401.1.(h)(4) OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO DOUBLING THE PENALTIES FOR LITTERING FOR VIOLATORS THAT DISCARD CIGARETTES FROM VEHICLES WHEN THE FIRE DANGER RATING IS HIGH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. §51202(a) of Article 2, Chapter 51 of Title 10, Guam Code

Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"(a) Apprehending Officers shall mean any designated individual with the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Department of Agriculture, the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, the Department of Public Health and Social Services, the Department of Public Works, all village mayors and assistant mayors, any peace officer in the Guam Police Department, including the C.A.P.E. volunteers, the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority Police, the Port Authority of Guam Police, and the Guam Fire Department's uniformed personnel."

**Section 2.** §51207 of Article 2, Chapter 51 of Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

### **"§51207.** Penalties.

(a) Littering *shall* be punishable by a fine of *not less than* Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Any person convicted of a second or subsequent litter offense shall also be required by the Court to pick up and remove litter from a public place under the supervision of the Superior Court of Guam's Probation Office, or its designee, or as the Court shall otherwise provide, for a period of *not less than* eight (8) hours for each offense, but in *no* case shall the amount of litter collected be *less than* five hundred (500) pounds.

Any person convicted of any litter offense may also be required by the Court to pay the cost of removing the litter they caused. The Superior Court of Guam shall transfer all money collected to pay fines imposed under this Section to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency for use in the Litter and Defacement Control Revolving Fund established by § 51204 of Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated. Any peace officer, as that term is defined by 8 GCA §5.55, may issue a citation for a litter offense.

- (b) A person charged with a first violation may avoid a court hearing by posting bail in the amount of the minimum fine or paying such prescribed fine as the Traffic Court Division of the Superior Court shall prescribe.
- (c) When the risk of fire is determined to be high, in accordance with the provisions of 10GCA §63704, any person convicted of a violation of this Chapter for discarding a cigarette, lit or unlit, from a moving or stationary motor vehicle, during the time the risk of fire is determined to be high, *shall* be subject to two (2) times the fine and/or community service penalties prescribed herein this Section.

Any person convicted of violating this Section *shall not* be relieved from any charges that may arise as a consequence of a violation of this Section."

- **Section 3.** §3401.1.(h)(4) of Chapter 3, Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read as follows:
  - "(4) obtain a certificate from the Chief of Police demonstrating the completion of a required course of instruction and training that includes training in measures to avoid dangerous confrontations with violators of this Section. In addition, training *shall* include the enforcement of litter control laws. The course of instruction and training *shall* be at *no* cost to the volunteer. Retired "uniformed personnel" are exempted from this subsection."

**Section 4. Effective Date.** The effective date of Section 2 of this Act *shall* be thirty (30) days following the date of enactment. In the interim, law enforcement officers *shall* advise violators of the increased penalties that will be enforced upon the effective date. Sections 1 and 3 *shall* be effective upon enactment.
