AN ACT TO AMEND §61531 OF PART 4, ARTICLE 5 OF CHAPTER 61, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THE AUTOMOBILE PARKING SPACE PROVISION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

**Section 1. Legislative Intent.** The laws governing automobile parking spaces do *not* recognize the use of motorcycles and mopeds. Residents of our island face the rising cost of gas prices and congestion on our roads. The community is also anticipating the increase in military presence within the next

1	few years. This	will re	esult in more traffic on our roads, prompting residents to
2	seek an alternative	mear	as of transportation, such as motorcycles, mopeds, scooters,
3	and other motori	zed t	wo (2) wheeled vehicles. For those who choose such
4	methods, finding	parkiı	ng involves competing with automobile drivers. As we
5	expect an increas	se in	traffic, we can also expect an increase in the use of
6	motorcycles, mop	eds, a	and scooters. Currently, there are no designated parking
7	spaces specifically to accommodate traffic and rider safety. It is I Liheslatura's		
8	intent to designate appropriate areas as parking strictly for operators of motorized		
9	two (2) wheeled vehicles.		
10	Section 2.	§615	31 of Chapter 61 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, is
11	hereby amended to	read	as follows:
12	"§615	531.	Automobile Parking Space.
13		Off-s	treet automobile parking space shall be provided as
14		follo	ws:
15		(a)	For dwellings, at least one (1) automobile parking space
16		for ea	ach dwelling unit;
17		(b)	For hotels, at least one (1) automobile parking space for
18		each	four (4) guest rooms;
19		(c)	For places of assembly, such as churches, auditoriums or
20		theat	ers with seating facilities, one (1) parking space for each
21		four	(4) seats;
22		(d)	For places of assembly, such as restaurants or night clubs
23		witho	out fixed seating facilities, one (1) parking space for each
24		one h	nundred (100) square feet of customer area in such use;
25		(e)	For retail sales of building materials, and goods requiring
26		exter	sive display areas, industrial buildings and warehouses,

1	one (1) parking space for each eight hundred (800) square feet
2	of area in such use, exclusive of loading requirements;
3	(f) For retail and wholesale sales and services, exclusive of
4	warehouse activity, at least one (1) space for each one hundred
5	(100) square feet or portion thereof of usable commercial floor
6	area;
7	(g) For professional and business offices, and public
8	administration offices, one (1) parking space for each four
9	hundred (400) square feet or portion thereof of floor area;
10	(h) For offices and clinics of healing arts, at least five (5)
11	spaces for each practitioner;
12	(i) For hospitals and nursing homes, at least one (1) space
13	for each two (2) beds;
14	(j) Three (3) spaces for every four (4) employees;
15	(k) To the extent practicable, each of the Subsections (a)
16	through (j) shall provide at least one (1) marked parking space
17	for use by bicycles equipped with a motor and motorcycles;
18	(l) Total parking requirements will be a total of all
19	applicable elements in Subsections (a) through (k);
20	(m) Appropriate parking space for open space activities, such
21	as: swimming beaches, picnic areas, campgrounds, boating
22	areas, shall be determined by the Guam Land Use Commission;
23	(n) A minimum of one (1) bicycle parking space shall be
24	provided for each twenty (20) off-street automobile parking
25	space. At a minimum, all bicycle parking spaces shall be
26	provided in the form of bicycle racks with locking capability.

1	Bicycle parking facilities shall be designed and installed to
2	include:
3	(1) spaces that are a minimum of two (2) feet by six
4	(6) feet per bicycle;
5	(2) the minimum number possible of potential conflict
6	points between bicycle and motor vehicles;
7	(3) provision for the locking of bicycles to the rack or
8	bicycle locker;
9	(4) adequate spacing for access to the bicycle and
10	locking device when the spaces are occupied; and
11	(5) where possible, bicycle parking shall be located
12	within view of building entrances/windows and/or
13	security."
