AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (d)(2) AND (e)(2) OF § 26603 OF ARTICLE 6, CHAPTER 26, TITLE 11, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO EXPANDING THE AUTHORIZED PROGRAMS OF THE GUAM CANCER TRUST FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that the Guam Cancer Trust Fund can support additional essential program
activities germane to the intent of the Trust Fund, and which are critical
components in combating cancer. Public Law 30-80, codified in Chapter 26 of
Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, restricts the use of the Guam Cancer Trust Fund
to *only* non-profit and charitable organizations providing cancer screenings,

treatment and support services. In accordance with this law, it is unclear whether education and outreach programs and activities that seek to increase prevention and awareness of cancer issues can be funded through the Trust Fund. As a result, vital programs, trainings, and events used to combat cancer may be forced to find alternate sources of funding.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan takes due notice that cancer remains the second leading cause of death on Guam, although cancer incidences are rising. With nearly three hundred sixteen (316) people being diagnosed with cancer, almost half of them succumb to this disease. Many of the diagnoses are detected during the late stages, where the survival rate decreases dramatically due to the aggressiveness or extensive spread of the cancer in those patients. To reverse this trend, many programs that provide free or low cost screenings and coverage for cancer treatment options are increasing through the support of the Guam Cancer Trust Fund. However, these programs are *not* able to provide funding for cancer education and outreach to the Guam community.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that cancer education and outreach is a major component of every public health campaign. Without a cancer education and outreach program, no matter how great a service is to the community, unless there is a proactive effort to publicize that service, it will likely be underutilized. Many cancer patient organizations focus on education and outreach to promote screening and treatment services, as well as cancer prevention strategies that could reduce the cancer burden on Guam. All of these programs provide a vital role in eliminating cancer in our community.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to provide an expanded authorization for cancer education and outreach programs to promote prevention, early detection and advanced treatment options that may not be considered direct services for cancer screening, treatment and support. It is further the intent to

1	amend the cap imposed on the use of grant funds for administrative purposes from
2	five percent (5%) to fifteen percent (15%), in anticipation of the expanded
3	programs organizations will take on in cancer education and outreach efforts.

- **Section 2.** Paragraph (2) of Subsection (d) of § 26603 of Article 6, Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:
 - "(2) Fifteen percent (15%) of the taxes collected and any subsequent gains *shall* be transferred into the Guam Cancer Trust Fund for programs supporting cancer screening, treatment, support services, cancer education, and outreach programs;"
- **Section 3.** Paragraph (2) of Subsection (e) of § 26603 of Article 6, Chapter 26, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:
 - "(2) The University of Guam, for each fiscal year, may allocate up to seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds balance to non-profit and charitable organizations providing cancer screenings, treatment, support services, cancer education, and outreach programs; provided, however, no more than ten percent (10%) of the available funds *shall* be utilized for cancer education and outreach programs. The University of Guam *shall* promulgate rules and regulations pursuant to Title 5 GCA, Chapter 9 regarding the administration of the Guam Cancer Trust Fund, as well as the application, distribution, review and investigation of such funds. Such rules and regulations shall be posted on the University's website.
 - (A) The initial rules and regulations governing the Guam Cancer Trust Fund shall be submitted to *I Liheslatura* within ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Act."
- Section 4. Amendment to the Guam Cancer Trust Fund Rules and Regulations. Section .07 of the Guam Cancer Trust Fund Rules and Regulations, established pursuant to the authority of P.L. 30-80, is hereby *amended* to read:

".07 Allowable Uses of the Grant Funds.

- A. A grantee that is funded by the GCTF may use the grant funds only for cancer programs consistent with the purposes of P.L. 30-80, for the prevention of cancer (includes screenings), diagnosis, treatment, and services that may be required to access treatment, in accordance with the contract between a grantee and the University.
- B. A grantee must use the grant funds solely for authorized expenses. Authorized expenses are determined by the terms of the agreement between the grantee and the University.
- C. While these funds may not be budgeted for indirect costs, a grantee may propose up to fifteen percent (15%) of the amount requested in order to administer the funds and comply with reporting requirements."
- **Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
- Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon enactment.
