AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 19 TO PART I, CHAPTER II OF PUBLIC LAW 32-068; TO AMEND § 1303 OF ARTICLE 3, CHAPTER 1 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED; AND TO ADD SECTIONS 15 AND 16 TO PART 1, CHAPTER II OF PUBLIC LAW 31-233, RELATIVE TO UPHOLDING THE INTENT OF I LIHESLATURA'S ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS TO THE **GUAM DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (GDOE) FOR** EVERY FISCAL YEAR AND FOR FUNDING TO ADDRESS THE DEFERRED MAINTENANCE NEEDS OF THE GEORGE WASHINGTON HIGH SCHOOL. THE RETROFITTING OF UNUSED BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES AT SOUTHERN HIGH SCHOOL FOR **GDOE** CENTRAL OFFICES, AND FOR **OTHER** 

# FACILITIES AND MAINTENANCE NEEDS OF THE GDOE.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM: 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the sum of Two Hundred Nineteen Million Six Hundred Fifty Five Thousand 3 Four Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$219,655,411) was appropriated to the Guam 4 Department of Education (GDOE) in FY 2014 which represents an increase of Six 5 Million Nine Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Fifty Dollars (\$6,925,050) above the 6 appropriation I Liheslatura provided to the GDOE in FY 2013. I Liheslatura 7 further finds that in accordance with the Bureau of Budget and Management 8 9 Research (BBMR) Circular No. 14-01, a ten percent (10%) reserve has been imposed on all appropriations funded by the General Fund and all Special Funds, 10 inclusive of operations, which is applicable to the amount appropriated to the 11 12 GDOE. I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that as a result of BBMR Circular No. 13 13-01, which placed a fifteen percent (15%) reserve on the GDOE appropriation in 14 FY 2013, over Nine Million Dollars (\$9,000,000) continues to be reserved and 15 withheld from the GDOE's Two Hundred Twelve Million Seven Hundred Thirty 16 Thousand Three Hundred Sixty One Dollars (\$212,730,361) appropriation in FY 17 2013. I Liheslatura believes that such funds reserved and withheld from the GDOE 18 is unjustified as the September 30, 2013 Consolidated Revenue and Expenditure 19 Report filed and certified by the BBMR, the Department of Administration (DOA), 20 and the Department of Revenue and Taxation (DRT) reports that actual General 21 Fund revenues collected exceeds estimated General Fund revenues for FY 2013 by 22 Twenty Three Million Eight Hundred Twenty Seven Thousand One Hundred 23 24 Twenty One Dollars (\$23,827,121).

appropriation for FY 2014 equates to almost Twenty Two Million Dollars (\$22,000,000), and that such reserve not only places a burden on the GDOE's ability to plan and provide adequate facilities and maintenance for the students, teachers, and administrators of the GDOE, but also impedes the GDOE's ability to continue to provide the best education it can to the students of Guam. Such issues have been seen with the facilities and maintenance issues at George Washington High School (GWHS), which continues to experience deferred maintenance issues related to its facilities in the amount of over Eight Million Five Hundred Sixty Six Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty Three Dollars (\$8,566,853), according to the most recent Insular Schools Assessment of Buildings and Classrooms conducted by the United States Department of the Interior Office of Insular Affairs.

§ 1303 of Article 3, Chapter 1 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, provides the authority of budget allotment control to the BBMR, which has been utilized to impose the ten percent (10%) reserve on the GDOE in FY 2014. *I Liheslatura* further finds that although this Section of the Guam Code Annotated is a financial management tool provided by *I Liheslatura* to the Executive Branch, such use of this authority toward the GDOE has *not* been justified as seen with the reserving of the GDOE appropriation in FY 2013, even though actual revenues were collected in excess of estimates. Furthermore, this same Section of the Guam Code Annotated which provides such authority to the BBMR to manage allotments states, "that sufficient cash *shall* always be released to the Department of Education to provide an adequate public education to every public school student."

I Liheslaturan Guåhan does not believe that the use of the management of allotments and the continued reserve placed on the GDOE represents a fair and just use of such authority granted to the Executive Branch by I Liheslatura as seen in FY 2013, and that the authority provided to the Executive Branch over the

1 management of GDOE allotments needs to be adjusted in order for the GDOE to

2 be provided the necessary financial resources it needs to plan and provide an

adequate education to every public school student, inclusive of the students of

4 GWHS.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan understands the importance of providing the Executive Branch with the financial management tools it needs to execute the budget of the government of Guam. Such was evident in FY 2014 when I Liheslatura provided I Maga'lahen Guåhan with a lump-sum budget and transfer authority which provides flexibility in managing the finances of the government. But in the interest of prioritizing education and the needs of the GDOE, I Liheslatura finds that limiting the authority of I Maga'lahen Guåhan's and the BBMR's reserve of appropriation authority of the GDOE appropriations will

provide a more equitable and fair treatment of the GDOE by the Executive Branch, will ensure steady and adequate flow of critical financial resources to GDOE, and will fully prioritize the education of every public school student.

Furthermore, as the necessary funds are provided to the GDOE, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* intends on dedicating approximately Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) of the GDOE appropriation for FY 2014 that was reserved by the BBMR to the Facilities and Maintenance Division of the GDOE toward addressing the deferred maintenance needs of the GWHS, and other facilities and maintenance needs of the GDOE.

**Section 2.** A new Section 19 is hereby *added* to Part I, Chapter II of Public Law 32-068 to read:

"Section 19. The sum of up to Four Million Dollars (\$4,000,000) shall be allocated and allotted from the General Fund appropriation in Section 1 of this Part of this Chapter to the Facilities and Maintenance Division of the GDOE for the repair and/or renovation of the

George Washington High School campus and auxiliary facilities. Any remaining balance *shall* be used first for the retrofitting of the unused buildings and facilities at Southern High School (SHS) to be utilized as the GDOE Central Offices, and any remaining balance thereafter *shall* be for other facilities and maintenance needs of the GDOE for FY 2014. In preparation for moving the GDOE Central Offices to the unused buildings and facilities at SHS, the GDOE *shall* maximize the educational use of the existing SHS buildings and facilities. §1303 of Article 3, Chapter 1, Title 5 GCA, *shall not* apply to the appropriation allocated and allotted in this Section. The funds allocated and allotted in this Section. The funds allocated and allotted in this Section are *not* subject to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan's* transfer authority."

**Section 3.** § 1303 of Article 3, Division 1, Chapter 1 of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read:

### "§ 1303. Management of Allotments.

In the release of monthly or quarterly allotments by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research from appropriation acts, the Director thereof *shall* base such allotments on anticipated cash receipts so that the obligations incurred pursuant to such release of periodic allotments *shall* have sufficient cash for their payment; provided, that sufficient cash *shall* always be released to the Department of Education to provide an adequate public education to every public school student, and that *no more than* three percent (3%) from the Department of Education aggregate fiscal year General Fund and Special Fund appropriations may be reserved by the BBMR. If, by the end of the third quarter of each fiscal year, the actual, aggregate revenue collections of the General and Special Funds appropriated to the Department of Education are *not* three percent (3%) or more, less than the estimates for that fiscal year, the BBMR *shall* release all reserves placed

on the appropriations of the Department of Education, and the BBMR *shall not* be authorized to reserve from any of the appropriations to the Department of Education for the remainder of the fiscal year.

No agency shall contract or agree to spend any money for goods or services or in settlement of a lawsuit or claim in excess of the amount appropriated by *I Liheslatura* (the Legislature) to that agency for such goods, services, claim, or settlement, and BBMR *shall not* allot funds to that agency for the payment of any amount towards such goods, services, claims, or settlements if the total amount of the goods, services, claims, or settlements is more than the amount appropriated or amount allotted by BBMR. Any contract or agreement made in violation hereof *shall* be void. Any agency head or certifying officer who knowingly contracts or agrees to spend any money in excess of said allotments *shall* be guilty of a misdemeanor."

**Section 4. Allotment Schedule.** The GDOE *shall* provide an allotment schedule of the allocation in Section 19, Part I, Chapter II of Public Law 32-068 to the BBMR *no later than* twenty (20) days after the enactment of this Act. Such allotment schedule *shall* reflect the priorities of the GDOE, to include addressing the deferred maintenance needs of the GWHS, the retrofitting of the unused buildings and facilities at Southern High School to be utilized as the GDOE Central Offices, and other facilities and maintenance needs of the GDOE. A copy of such allotment schedule *shall* be provided to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

**Section 5.** New Sections 15 and 16 are hereby *added* to Part I, Chapter II of Public Law 31-233 to read:

"Section 15. Continuing Appropriation. The appropriation in Section 2 of this Part of this Chapter *shall not* lapse and *shall* continue until

fully expended, to include payment of prior year obligations of the Guam Department of Education.

Section 16. Release of Reserve and Allotment. The Bureau of Budget and Management Research *shall* release any and all reserves placed on the FY 2013 appropriation in Section 2 of this Part of this Chapter, to the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) and *shall* release allotments for all appropriations that were previously held in reserve to the GDOE."

Section 6. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.

**Section 7. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
