AN ACT TO AMEND § 3201.1(a) OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 3, DIVISION 1, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE QUALIFICATIONS OF THE TERRITORIAL EPIDEMIOLOGIST OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
- Section 1. Subsection (a) of § 3201.1 of Article 2, Chapter 3, Division 1,
- 3 Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is amended to read:

There is hereby established within the Department of Public 1 Health and Social Services ('DPHSS') a Guam Cancer Registry, which shall 2 3 operate under the supervision of the Division of Public Health, Office of Epidemiology and Research, to collect information on all cases of cancer 4 5 occurring within Guam, to analyze and compare such data in appropriate 6 ways and to annually prepare and distribute a report on their findings. The qualifications of the Territorial Epidemiologist shall be: 7 8 (1) a Guam physician's license; or 9 **(2)** a MD degree from an American Medical Association approved medical school with a minimum of two (2) years of 10 experience in the field of epidemiology; or 11 12 a Guam veterinarian's license with a minimum of two (2) 13 years of experience in the field of epidemiology; or 14 a MPH (epidemiology major) or a graduate degree in 15 epidemiology or biostatistics, both from a U.S. accredited college or university and with one (1) to two (2) years of experience in the field 16 17 of epidemiology; or a MSPH degree with a focus in epidemiology or analysis 18 19 and assessment from a U.S. accredited college or university; or 20 a PhD degree in epidemiology from a U.S. accredited college or university; or 21 a graduate degree in epidemiology from a non-U.S. 22 **(7)** accredited institution, and with at least four (4) years of experience 23 24 designing, overseeing, implementing, and conducting epidemiological 25 studies related to public health; or 26 a non-epidemiology professional graduate degree, such

as a RN, MD/DO, DDS/DMD, DVM, or PhD, from a U.S. accredited

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college or university, with at least four (4) years of experience performing epidemiology work under the guidance of an epidemiologist."

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such

any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
