

AN ACT TO AMEND SUBSECTION (a) OF § 90.90 AND SUBSECTION(b)(1) OF § 90.91 OF ARTICLE 4. CHAPTER 90, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE DETAINEE PARTICIPATION TO IN PRISON INDUSTRIES AND THE USE OF FUNDS DEPOSITED INTO THE PRISON **INDUSTRIES REVOLVING FUND.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Subsection (a) of § 90.90 of Article 4, Chapter 90, Title 9,

3 Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

1 "(a) Prison Industries, Established. The Department of Corrections is hereby authorized to establish such prison industries as may be feasible to 2 3 provide a means for inmates and detainees to receive job training and skills 4 development; to provide opportunities for the earning of wages to be used to pay restitution to victims of crime, and payment of fines and court costs; and 5 6 to provide additional means for funding certain recurring expenses of the 7 Department. The Department shall separate and designate each prison industry to be established as occurring "within the secured perimeter" or 8 occurring "outside the secured perimeter". This Act is not meant to replace 9 the activities authorized by Chapter 84 of Article 1, Title 9, Guam Code 10 11 Annotated, but *shall* be viewed as authorizing additional activities. This 12 Chapter *shall not* supersede, *nor* affect any programs undertaken pursuant to 13 Chapter 81 of this Title."

Section 2. Subsection (b)(1) of § 90.91 of Article 4, Chapter 90, Title 9,
Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

16 "(1) Funds in the Prison Industries Revolving Fund may be used to 17 purchase clothing for prisoners and detainees, foodstuffs for the dining facility, galley catering services and equipment, medical/dental supplies, 18 prescription and over-the-counter medicines, sanitary/hygiene supplies and 19 20 other pharmaceutical supplies for prisoners and detainees, including, 21 payment for prisoner-detainee maintenance costs in any off island prison or 22 medical institutions, payment for overtime and related personnel costs for 23 personnel specifically assigned to tasks involving Prison Industries, and for 24 training of Department of Corrections personnel."
