## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

WHEREAS, the 2011 Martin Luther King Day of Service is celebrated annually and it encourages a call to action, and promotes the spirit and efforts of volunteer involvement, civic responsibility and the strengthening of programs in building and reinforcing a culture of service, citizenship and responsibility in the United States, throughout our island, and around the world; and

9 WHEREAS, during the 1950s and '60s, civil rights leader, the Reverend 10 Martin Luther King, Jr. recognized the power of service to strengthen 11 communities and achieve common goals; and

WHEREAS, today, we mark the "King Day of Service" with events that answer Dr. King's call to action by addressing a question posed by the Reverend in which he stated: "Life's most persistent and urgent question is: 'What are you doing for others?' ", and the "King Day of Service" builds on this noble effort by transforming the federal and local holiday honoring Dr. King into a national day of community service, grounded in his teachings of nonviolence and social justice; and

WHEREAS, each year, Americans come together on the Martin Luther
King Holiday to serve their neighbors and communities as part of the United
We Serve, the President's national call to service initiative, which calls for

Americans from all walks of life to work together to provide solutions to our
 most pressing national problems; and

3 WHEREAS, the elements that reflect the honorable legacy of Dr. King 4 and his living teachings are seen in current events that are unfolding on 5 Guam, including the exercise of civic responsibility by our citizens in response 6 to the present military buildup; and

WHEREAS, this intelligent exercise of the prerogatives promises to
greatly improve local governance and build citizen satisfaction with their
government; now, therefore, be it

Commission; the Guam Department of Labor; the Corporation for National 13 and Community Service (CNCS); the Guam Volunteer Center in partnership 14 15 with Dr. Robert A. Underwood, President, University of Guam; the Guam 16 AmeriCorps Alumni Chapter; the Guam AmeriCorps VISTA program, along 17 with the five (5) AmeriCorps Programs: Huråo AmeriCorps, Sanctuary Incorporated, AmeriCorps University of Guam Success Center, Pa'a 18 AmeriCorps, and the IHOM Life Corps AmeriCorps, as they collectively host 19 20 the 2011 Martin Luther King Day of Service on Monday, January 17, 2011, and 21 as they endeavor to improve lives, strengthen communities, and foster civic 22 engagement through service and volunteering, in commemoration of both the
