Relative to recognizing and honoring Alejandro Teodoro Blas Lizama for his participation in the archeological, historical and cultural preservation of the legacy of the people of Guam, and for his excellent renderings of historic sites and artifacts; and to further extending a sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'àse'* to him for his outstanding commitment to promoting the knowledge of Guam's past history for the present and future generations of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I*MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Alejandro Teodoro Blas Lizama was born in 1946 on Guam. He is the son of Vicente Santos Lizama and Magdalena Blas Lizama, and he grew up on a typical *Chamorro* ranch where he learned the customs and traditions of our people from his parents; and

WHEREAS, Alejandro attended school on Guam and then worked at Hawaiian Rock to help support his family, until he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1965 when he was nineteen (19) years old; and

WHEREAS, Alejandro Teodoro Blas Lizama served his country bravely in the Vietnam War, earning the Combat Infantry Badge, the Bronze Star, and other medals, for his courageous military service; and

WHEREAS, upon his return to Guam after serving in Vietnam, Alejandro attended the University of Guam to study Mechanical and Architectural Drafting, and took classes in Anthropology after being encouraged by Dr. Ted Burkdahl; and

WHEREAS, these classes led Alejandro to his decision to concentrate on doing pen and ink drawings of Guam and its people, resources, environment and historical artifacts, and this became an irreplaceable resource for the people of our Island; and

WHEREAS, in 1974, Alejandro participated in the initial survey of Guam's historical and archaeological sites, which were eventually placed on the Guam and National Registers of Historic Places, and the survey team, led by Dr. Fred M. Reinman, surveyed and inventoried about four-fifths (4/5) of the island's archaeological sites; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Alejandro Lizama worked at the Department of Parks and Recreation, Historic Preservation Office (HPO) as an Archeological Technician and 1 Historic Preservations Specialist for twenty-four (24) years before retiring in 2000;

WHEREAS, Mr. Alejandro Lizama has made significant contributions in the depictions of the ancient imagery of Guam, using pointillism; and with his eye to historical accuracy and his love of detail, his work reminds our people of what life may have been like during the time of our ancestors; and

WHEREAS, to this day, Alejandro continues on the path of preserving the *Chamorro* culture and promoting the knowledge of Guam's past through his art; and

WHEREAS, the Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC) has chosen to officially and publicly recognize Alejandro Lizama for his contributions to our community at the Third (3rd) Annual MARC and Charter Day Event; now, therefore,

be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize and commend Mr. Alejandro Teodoro Blas Lizama for his service and dedication to the people of Guam and Micronesia; and does further extend a sincere *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* to him for his important undertakings, and for his outstanding commitment to promoting the knowledge of Guam's past history for the present and future generations of Guam; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mr. Alejandro Teodoro Blas Lizama; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
