Relative to recognizing the late Kathleen (Kate) Thelma Thomas for her many dedicated years of service in the social work field; and to further commending her for her tireless efforts to improve the quality of life of the people of Guam.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

3 WHEREAS, Kathleen Thelma Thomas, affectionately known as Kate, was 4 born on December 30, 1953, to Steven and Sally Thomas, and was raised on the island 5 of Guam; and WHEREAS, Kate Thomas, a true "Islander" in every sense of the word,
 graduated from John F. Kennedy (JFK) High School, CLASS of 1972; and

WHEREAS, the late Kate Thomas is survived by her daughter, Kathleen, and son-in-law, Tommy Benavente; along with her four (4) grandchildren: Donavin, Byron, Kaeleen and Allysa; and her two (2) great-grandchildren: Tiffany Jane and Ayvie'anuh Castro. Her siblings include her brother, Steve (Arizona); and her sisters, Carmelita (South Carolina), Angelina (Texas), and Sarah (Latte Plantation, Guam). Her extended family includes her lifelong friends, godchildren, and other relatives in Guam, the Philippines, and the U.S. mainland; and

WHEREAS, Kate's dear sister, Sarah, eulogized at Kate's funeral that in all of
Kate's relationships, Kate undoubtedly gave the best of her love; and

WHEREAS, shortly before Kate's passing, on a drive to the mountains in the Philippines, Sarah recalled Kate singing the song "Best of My Love" so beautifully and eloquently. Kate was indeed blessed with the gift of voice, as many people fondly remember her as the lead female vocalist for the popular bands *Breezin'* and *Konfrence*; and

WHEREAS, the mother-daughter relationship Kate shares with her daughter,
Kathleen, is particularly special, not only because they share the same name, but also
because she first came to her as a foster child, and the bond was so genuine and real,
that mother Kathleen made the adoption official shortly thereafter; and

WHEREAS, this special relationship also aligns itself with Kate's lifelong commitment to social work, as she was, very appropriately, the President of the Foster Families Association of Guam, advocating for the well-being of foster children, and prospective foster children island-wide. Her activities as the Association's President included providing emotional support, organizing get-togethers, facilitating fundraisers, and trainings for foster parents; and WHEREAS, Kate's commitment to social work includes over thirty (30) years of working in human services, accumulating extensive experience in the field. Her career included a wide array of positions, including house parent, crisis worker and caseworker for Sanctuary, Inc.; Case Manager for *Guma Mami;* Administrative Assistant for the Protection and Advocacy Office; and her most recent position, Para Professional/Homemaker with the Bureau of Social Services Administration of the Department of Public Health and Social Services; and

8 WHEREAS, Kate's many years of experience are complemented by extensive 9 community services, such as her work as a certified mediator for the *Inafa'Maolek* 10 Conciliation Service. Kate was often called upon to help people resolve all types of 11 conflicts, but was known specifically for her specialty in child and family mediations; 12 and

WHEREAS, Kate's volunteerism extended to her advocacy for the National Mother Read/Father Read Family Literacy Program, based out of Sanctuary Incorporated, which was a fifteen (15) week program held on Saturdays that had parents reading to their children, in order to increase their reading levels and build communication skills between parents and their children; and

WHEREAS, Kate also advocated for the well-being of women, as she worked closely with the Oasis Empowerment Center, an organization that works with women recovering from drug and alcohol abuse, domestic violence situations, or women that are having relationship problems with their partners. Initially involved solely as a Board Member, Kate took it upon herself to help facilitate a chemical recovery group once a week, which resulted in her becoming a residential manager, assisting those in the first stage of recovery as part of a three (3) stage program; and WHEREAS, Kate's community services also included her facilitation of the
 *Chansa* program at the Department of Youth Affairs, and a co-facilitator for parenting
 groups at Sanctuary Incorporated; and

4 **WHEREAS,** because of her love for animals, Kate was also a member of the 5 Guam Animals in Need (GAIN), an organization that advocates for the rights of 6 animals to be protected from maltreatment and to be in a safe and loving home; and

WHEREAS, Kate was also an advocate for physical fitness, nutrition, and
health these last five (5) years, as she was a contestant on the "Biggest Loser" show
here on Guam; and

WHEREAS, the late Kathleen Thelma Thomas, like her highly respected
mother, Sally, had also been an educator at San Vicente Catholic School, Santa
Barbara Catholic School, Maria Ulloa Elementary School, and with the Department of
Education as a CRT at F.B. Leon Guerrero Middle School; and

WHEREAS, the late Kathleen Thelma Thomas had also served on many task
forces and professional groups, including as an Officer of the Guam Association of
Social Workers, and a Board Member of *Guma Mami*, Inc., *Payu-ta*, and the
Micronesian Youth Services Network (MYSN); and

WHEREAS, Kate's outstanding contributions to the community are well known and acknowledged. In 2005, she was awarded the Community Service Award of the Department of Public Health and Social Services Employee Recognition Program; and in 2006, Kate was once again acknowledged for her volunteerism when she was awarded the prestigious Public Citizens Award from the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) Guam Chapter, and the Governor's MagHope Award of Excellence later that same year; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina 'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,
on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend the late Kathleen (Kate)

Thelma Thomas for her many dedicated years of service in the social work field, for
 touching the lives of so many people, for being an inspiration to all who knew her,
 and for being a true example of all that is good; and be it further
