- 5 nineteen (19) year-old Paul C. Bassler and his wife, Dorothy H. Bassler, to Guam,

where after traveling around the world and arriving on a flight from India, they fell in love with the island they would then call home for close to forty (40) years; and

WHEREAS, Paul was born on June 5, 1952, in Alhambra, California; and he is the son of Mike and Anna Bassler, whose other children are Kirk, Jim, Chris (Paul's identical twin brother, who has lived on Guam as long as Paul) and Anne; and

WHEREAS, Paul graduated from Lakewood High School in 1970, and then attended Long Beach City College. He married Dorothy in 1971, and together they raised a son, Joshua, and a daughter, Myia, who married Joseph Perez, and they blessed the Basslers with a granddaughter, Ramelia; and

WHEREAS, Paul and Dorothy lived in *Merizo* with their family for a quarter of a century, but have also resided in the villages of *Agat, Santa Rita, Inarajan, Tamuning, Mangilao* and *Barrigada*, after spending their first few years on Guam living off the land; growing food, fishing, doing odd jobs, learning from the *man'amko'* of *Inarajan* how to weave palm fronds from the nipa tree, and eventually learning to build homes in the ancient *Chamorro* tradition, where they lived for a number of years before Typhoon Pamela destroyed the structure in 1976; and

WHEREAS, throughout the years, Paul had a colorful array of jobs, to include working at the *Piti* USO Café, and at the Andersen Air Force Base Galley; working as a contracted boat operator at *Cocos* Island for the removal of garbage, animal feed and laundry; spending thirteen (13) years as a free-lance writer for the Pacific Daily News, as well as a writer for Continental Air Micronesia from 1985 to 1998; he worked as a publisher of a free newspaper in 1999, before working for Senator Kaleo Moylan as a speech and bill writer from 2000 to 2001; and he has also worked as a construction supply company general manager; and as the manager of an organic fruit tree nursery and garden shop, from 2001 to 2003; and

WHEREAS, Paul began his career at the Department of Agriculture in January
