Relative to recognizing and commending Annalakshmi Wignarajah for her significant contributions to Guam, and its people, and for enriching Guam's demographic, cultural melting pot.

WHEREAS, Annalakshmi Wignarajah, affectionately known as "Anna", was
born on March 4, 1939 in Sri Lanka; and

5 **WHEREAS,** in March of 1973, Annalakshmi Wignarajah moved to Guam with 6 her two (2) young sons, Muresh and Dushyantan, and her loving husband, Thyagarajah, also known as "Wigna", who was sent to Guam to set up an Otis
 Elevator Company office, a business he successfully ran for more than twenty-five
 (25) years; and

WHEREAS, Anna always had a strong love of children, and she volunteered her time with a group of special children at the Speech and Hearing Center at Public Health, where she was able to utilize some Montessori learning materials. This sparked great interest and passion as she had been trained by Dr. Maria Montessori herself, having acquired training and an "Association Montessori Internationale Diploma" in 1971, working with children three (3) to six (6) years old; and

WHEREAS, Anna had always dreamed of some day starting a Montessori Program on Guam; and in 1976, this dream was materialized when the Montessori School of Guam first opened its doors, which at that time started in the living room of the Wignarajah home in *Tamuning*; and

WHEREAS, Anna has successfully operated the Montessori School of Guam for over thirty-five (35) years. Their entire educational program is set up around nurturing the development of the total child, and it encourages children to be problem solvers and critical thinkers; and

WHEREAS, in addition to her committed service to children's education, Anna, upon her arrival to the island, also saw a golden opportunity to meet and interact with people from other ethnic backgrounds, which made her interested in joining the International Women's Club of Guam (IWCG), an organization that she has been a part of for many years; and

WHEREAS, since then, Anna has been an active charter member of the IWCG,
and she assumed the role of President in 1979, and then again in 1980; and

WHEREAS, Anna volunteered to serve as a member of the International
Reading Association, as she had always been closely involved with early childhood

education on the island; and in 1985 and 1986, she also served as the President of the
 Guam Childcare and Development Organization; and

WHEREAS, in 1998, Anna attended her first Federation of Asian/Pacific Women Association (FAWA) Conference, which was held on Guam; and in 2005, she was part of a group of FAWA representatives from Guam that went to Singapore to attend another FAWA Conference; and
