## 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

WHEREAS, on May 6, 2011, Maria R. Gilnifrad, the mother of *Machananao*Elementary School student Luke Pong, led forty-seven (47) students to school when

she realized that the assigned bus for her child's district did not arrive as scheduled;
 and

WHEREAS, with her child's education as a top priority in her mind, Mrs. Gilnifrad was instrumental in ensuring that her child and the rest of the students made it to school on time for testing procedures; and

WHEREAS, Maria R. Gilnifrad and her family live a mile from the school and
she had the wherewithal to safely lead the forty-seven (47) students to school while
walking along a busy roadway; and

9 WHEREAS, Maria R. Gilnifrad realized the importance of year end testing, 10 and without a moment of hesitation, took charge of the situation and made a decision 11 to get the children safely to school so they could be able to finish their testing, and not 12 allowing a flat tire problem, which delayed the scheduled school bus, to affect the 13 academic standings of the children in her neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, the forty-seven (47) students that were led by Maria R. Gilnifrad,
on their own free will, chose to walk the one (1) mile trek to school rather than turning
around and heading home; and

WHEREAS, undoubtedly this love for school was instilled in them by the
outstanding teachers and administrators of *Machananao* Elementary School; and

WHEREAS, the staff of *Machananao* Elementary School provided breakfast
 for all forty-seven (47) children, and gave the children the opportunity to rest and
 refresh themselves before administering the test; and

WHEREAS, the Principal of *Machananao* Elementary School showed tremendous gratitude for this parent, and contacted the media to show that good students come from good parents, and praised Maria R. Gilnifrad as an "Education Hero"; now, therefore, be it 1 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na* 2 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf *of I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people 3 of Guam, recognize and commend Maria R. Gilnifrad as an "Education Hero" for her 4 courageous act of leading forty-seven (47) students to school when they were not 5 picked up by the assigned bus; and does further recognize and commend the 6 administrators and teachers of *Machananao* Elementary School for instilling the love 7 of school in their students; and be it further

8 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules 9 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of 10 the same be thereafter transmitted to Maria R. Gilnifrad; to Principal Robert H. Malay, 11 on behalf of the faculty and staff of *Machananao* Elementary School; to Dr. Nerissa 12 Bretania Underwood, Superintendent, Guam Department of Education; and to the 13 Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
